"Jesus told his disciples this parable: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one-- to each according to his ability. Then he went away. Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money. "After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them. The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five. He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received two talents also came forward and said, 'Master, you gave me two talents. See, I have made two more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received the one talent came forward and said, 'Master, I knew you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter; so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back.' His master said to him in reply, 'You wicked, lazy servant! So you knew that I harvest where I did not plant and gather where I did not scatter? Should you not then have put my money in the bank so that I could have got it back with interest on my return? Now then! Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.'"

A lesson taught on faithfulness and not financial gain.


A master with three servants, tests them at their core;

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

33rd Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 25:14-30

How are you using your talents? This parable challenges all of us to ask ourselves how we are using the gifts that God gave us to serve and do good with them for Him. God gave each of us a gift or more, for the purpose of glorifying Him and building up His People. St Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 12:7 "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given **for some benefit.**" And in Ephesians 4:12, he says our God-given gifts are "to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, **for building up the body of Christ.**" So how are we using what God has given us for His glory and the for the help of our brothers and sisters? Just like in the parable, we will all give an accounting on our last day (our Exit Interview)! This important self-examination is one clear message from the gospel today. How are we working to increase the yield of what God has given us – like the invested talent that multiplies in returns to the Master? Are we growing God's investment in us? Or are we only sitting on our talents, and letting them rot or rust? Or worse, are we hiding them out of greed, fear or laziness? Each of us will give an accounting of our resources on judgement day. So, that is one message from the gospel today?

Yet also, I find **another** level of meaning in this Parable of the Talents, that challenges us to not only identify what the **gift** is, that we have been given to use, but also, to examine the relationship that we have to the gift-**giver**: God! Very personally, each one of us needs to examine that relationship, and ask ourselves how eagerly or not, we work for Him. This parable evokes a feeling of pity and sadness from me for the servant with only one talent. What I mean by this, is that I am troubled by the one servant's inability to approach the master or his fellow servants about how best to work with his meager one talent. Did that servant not have a good enough relationship to the master to just go to him and ask for a little guidance (the master gave such financial advice afterward, when he suggested at least putting it in a bank- Matt 25:27)/ Or the servant with one talent. might he have approached the master, flattering him and asking him a little 'inside business' and how he might work with only one talent? Yet, apparently there is not such a trusting, personal relationship between them to allow such conversations. Did the Owner already prejudicially judge down this man's abilities? Or how about that same man's lack of relationship to the other servants – why didn't he go to them, asking their advice or asking to combine his meager one talent with theirs (a 'mutual fund', to share in their yield or at least spread the risk?)

The whole parable just shouts 'poor relationships' to me. They have resources but they don't; have relationships. Nobody seems to trust anyone (sound familiar?) If I was that master, I would have cried over the fact that the servant feared him so much he wouldn't confide in him ahead of time, and that he viewed the owner as such a greedy tycoon ('harvesting where he did not plant' Mt 25:24 isn't that stealing?) While the little servant (with only one talent) doesn't have a lot to work with, he does have his honesty. He could have exhibited a little restraint in his talk with the owner, and just said, *"I did my best. I am sorry the market is tight and tilted now toward big investments right. I tried but at least I didn't lose anything. Most hedge funds wouldn't even return my calls. But I broke even."* He might have even added, *"Keep in mind, I didn't ask for that loan from you – you pushed it on me - But I didn't lose anything!"* Again, I just sense a major lack of cooperation and trust among the whole bunch (master and servants and servants among themselves- a good comparison to these unhealthy relationships is found in the Prodigal Son story too-Lk 15:11-32). So, to us who hear this parable, we might lament together, the absence of good and honest relationships in the parable. **But we get Jesus' message that the Kingdom is all about investing in relationship to other people and not in acquiring more earthly possessions.** The real treasure in the kingdom of heaven is the accumulation of strong, loving relationships (other people). Our balance sheet should show many solid Christian 'contacts' instead of only multiplying 'dollars' (**Networks and not networths**) The people we know, trust, live and work with in Christ, are the only 'assets' that matter in the Kingdom of Jesus. Again, our true wealth is measured by our relationship to Christ and by the number and depth of our relationship to other people in Christ. Relationship (to Christ and each other) is what we must invest ourselves completely in to have 'eternal holdings'. That is priceless! Peace, Fr Brian
