Lakewood Forest is a Deed Restricted community. The Fund's Architectural Control Committee (ACC) must approve all exterior remodeling and building projects before the project begins. The Fund has the necessary legal authority to enforce this rule.

The Lakewood Forest Fund has a contract with Harris County Precinct 4's Contract Deputy Program. We have one Lieutenant, one Corporal and three Deputies working approximately 70 percent of their time for Lakewood Forest, and 30 percent for Harris County.

# GUIDELINES FOR JUDGING YARD OF THE MONTH

Judging for May was to be done the last week of April.

Members of the Lakewood Forest Garden Club judge yards at the end of the month for the following month's award based on these established guidelines. Areas to be judged are rotated using the subdivision sections as listed in the Lakewood Forest Directory.

Once a yard has received recognition, it is not eligible for further awards for two years. One first place winner each month will receive a \$60 gift certificate, and two honorable mention winners will each receive a \$35 gift certificate. Recognition of winners is published in the Lakewood Forest Civic Association's official newsletter, *Civic News*, and online by the Lakewood Forest Fund. Plants for All Seasons gift certificates are provided through contributions from the Lakewood Forest Fund and Plants for All Seasons.

Overall landscape design should be compatible with the architecture of the house; e.g., no windows hidden by shrubs, color, balanced design, etc. 20 points

Grass: green, except in winter;

mowed and edged; weed-free 15 points

Beds: cleaned, edged & mulched

Color contrast; e.g., well placed variegated or colored shrubs, use of flowers and bulbs such as

caladiums to add interest 15 points

General neatness; e.g., air conditioner hidden by shrubs; garden hose rolled up, garbage cans, toys, etc.,

kept out of sight

Shrubs: neatly pruned 10 points Walks & curbs swept & cleaned 10 points

Carolyn Calvert gave an inspiring reading called "God is Our Gardener."



# SUMMER TIME WATER SAFETY

Now that the heat is here and swimming pool usage will soon be in full swing, CESD would like to remind everyone to be careful in and around bodies of water. Don't take water safety for granted!

Drowning is the leading cause of injury or death for young children ages 1 to 4. Nationwide, three children die every day as a result of drowning. But you can help to prevent accidental drowning. Here are some tips:


**Make life jackets a must.** If you plan on visiting natural bodies of water, make sure life jackets are worn. Even if your child is a good swimmer in a swimming pool, it doesn't mean that he/she won't encounter something in a natural body of water that could drown them.

**Bathtubs can be dangerous too!** Remember that a child, especially babies, can drown in only one inch of water. Bathing in bathtubs is a regular household routine but can turn deadly very quickly. Never leave a baby in a bathtub unsupervised, even for what you think is "just a minute."

**Learn CPR.** Learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and get recertified every two years. CPR can help a child stay alive with little or no brain damage. For more information on Cypress Creek EMS CPR classes, visit www.ccems.com/education/cpr-first-aid-schedule.

**Be on the lookout.** Adults watching kids near water should avoid distracting activities like playing cards, reading books, using electronic devices, or talking on the phone.




