Human Trafficking Training December 3, 2016

The Carlisle Area Family Life Center, Compassionate Humans Against Trafficking and the Respect Life Ministry of Our Lady of the Visitation Church will present awareness training on human trafficking **from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, December 3 at Our Lady of the Visitation Church, 305 N. Prince St. Shippensburg. Check-in begins at 8:30 a.m.**

Slavery is a worldwide tragedy, affecting nearly 30 million people including hundreds of thousands in the United States. Many of the victims are children. The Interstate 76 and 81 corridors are high traffic areas for this criminal activity, so this training will examine how much our area is affected, how to identify possible victims and how to help them.

The training is free but is only available to the first 50 people, so register early. Lunch and training materials will be provided. No continuing education credits will be available.

Such actions are so deeply flawed that they are always opposed to the authentic good of persons. They are deemed intrinsic evils and must never be supported or condoned. A prime example is the intentional taking of innocent human life, as in abortion and euthanasia. Similarly, direct threats to the sanctity and dignity of human life, such as human cloning and destructive research on human embryos, must always be opposed. Other direct assaults on innocent human life and violations of human dignity, such as genocide, torture, racism, and the targeting of noncombatants in acts of terror or war, can never be justified.
