ALABAMA WINS THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Tua Tagovailoa started the 2nd half for Alabama and threw three touchdown passes including the game winner from 41 yards out in overtime to Devonta Smith to win another national championship for Nick Saban and the University of Alabama.

After the Crimson Tide looked so sluggish on offense in the first half, Saban made the decision to pull Jalen Hurts from the game with Georgia holding a 13-0 lead. It was a move that HAD to be made. Hurts simply was not able to get the Alabama offense going and Georgia was determined to make Alabama beat them by passing the ball and Tagovailoa is the better pure passer of the football. All season long, when he did come into a game, you could see the talent but he had not been asked to do anything like that all season long.

Say what you want but Alabama simply dominated the second half of the game and deserved to win the game but Georgia will have second thoughts all off season because they seemed like they were in control of the game at multiple times in the contest

but settled for two field goals in the first half and also when they went up 20-7 but Tua Tagovailoa's passing and the stable of running backs in that Alabama backfield started to chip away.

Tua Tagovailoa hit Calvin Ridley on 4th down late in the 4th quarter to tie it up at 20-20 and after Alabama missed a short field goal at the end of regulation, the game went to overtime where the Crimson Tide won it.

To put Alabama's title and dynasty in perspective, consider this. Alabama won their 12th AP/Coaches Poll national title in Poll Era (since 1936). That is 4 more than any other school. Nick Saban: won his 6th national title, tying Bear Bryant for the most by a head coach in Poll Era. Another interesting state is the fact that former Nick Saban assistant coaches are now 0-12 against him in head coaching matchups. Kirby Smart became the latest to lose.

BOWL TIDBITS

South Florida's Quinton Flowers became the third QB in FBS history with back-to-back seasons with 2,500 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards, joining 2016-17 Lamar Jackson and 2012-13 Jordan Lynch.

Army finished the season 10-3, tied for the most wins in school history (finished 10-2 in 1996). It is just the 2nd 10-win season in Army history. Army started playing football in 1890.

Against Army, San Diego State's Rashaad Penny rushed for 200 rushing yards for the 5th consecutive game which ties Marcus Allen, Barry Sanders and Jamario Thomas for the longest streak in FBS history.

Behind Quinton Flowers' 5 TD responsible for, South Florida won the Birmingham Bowl and has now won at least 10 games for two straight seasons. The school had never reached double-digit victories in a season prior to last year.

Fresno State: finished the season 10-4. They became the 2nd team in FBS history to win at least 10 games after losing at least 10 games the previous season. Miami (OH) went from 1-11 in 2009 to 10-4 in 2010. Fresno State finished eight games better than last season, tied for the 2nd-best turnaround from one season to the next in FBS history.

Kansas State recorded their 1st back-to-back bowl wins since 1999-2000. Alex Delton had 158 rushing yards in their bowl win which was the most by a Kansas State player this season.

Best Bowl records in the FBS since 1997. Utah 14-1 .933 Marshall 11-2 .846.

Stanford is now 43-1 when leading by at least 18 points under David Shaw. Stanford led the Alamo Bowl game by 18 points (21-3) but ended up losing the game to TCU 39-37.

TCU completed their 10th 11-win season since Gary Patterson took over as head coach in 2001. Only 3 FBS schools have had more such seasons in that time. Ohio State 12, Oklahoma 12, Boise State 11.

Mark Dantonio won his 100th career game as the Spartans head coach in their 42-17 win over Washington State in the Holiday Bowl.

Oklahoma State recorded its sixth 10-win season under head coach Mike Gundy after posting only 3 such seasons before he became head coach

Most Wins With 1 or Fewer Pass Attempts in a game in the last 10 FBS Seasons: Navy 4 Army 3 Air Force 1.

Urban Meyer's 11th bowl win tied Kyle Whittingham for second most by an active FBS coaches after his Buckeyes beat USC 24-7 in the Cotton Bowl. Whittingham picked up his 11th bowl win vs West Virginia.

Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor passed Adrian Peterson for the most single-season rush yards by a freshman in FBS history in the Orange Bowl vs Miami.

With Washington's loss to Penn State in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl, the Pac-12 finished just 1-8 .111, in bowl games this postseason. It's the worst win percentage by a Power-5 Conference with at least 5 games played in a single postseason.

BOWL TIDBITS

Penn State improved to 7-0 all-time in the Fiesta Bowl after beating Washington 35-28, which is the best unbeaten record by any team in a single bowl game in FBS history.

Three players in FBS history have 50 passing touchdowns and 50 rushing touchdowns in their career: Colin Kaepernick, Tim Tebow, and Lamar Jackson.

UCF is the 10th team in the BCS Era (1998) to finish the season undefeated and NOT win the National Title. It is the first team to do so since Ohio State in 2012.

After beating LSU 21-17 in the Citrus Bowl, Notre Dame won a January bowl game for the first time since 1994, when the Irish beat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. Brian Kelly joins Lou Holtz, Ara Parseghian, and Knute Rockne as the only Notre Dame head coaches with three 10-win seasons.

South Carolina trailed Michigan 19-3 in the 3rd quarter of the Outback Bowl, then scored 23 straight points to win 26-19. Prior to that, FBS teams were 8-358 (.022) during the 2017 season when trailing by 16 points or more in the 3rd quarter.

When Georgia's Sony Michel finished the Rose Bowl with 150 Rushing Yards and 4 TD, he joined 2005 Vince Young-Texas, 1999 Ron Dayne-Wisconsin, and 1986 Eric Ball-UCLA as the only players to accomplish that in the history of the Rose Bowl.

Georgia's 17-point comeback win is the largest in Rose Bowl history. Entering the Rose Bowl, Oklahoma had won 87 straight games when leading by 17 points at any point. During the 2017 season, teams had been 536-16 this year when leading by at least 17 points (.971 win pct).

Of the 83 winners of the 84 Heisman Trophies (Archie Griffin won twice), 58 played in bowl games after they received their prize (Griffin played in bowl games both years). Of those 58 players, 27 were on the winning team in the bowl. Marcus Mariota and Derrick Henry played in two bowl games after winning the Heisman with College Football National Championship occurring after the other bowl games. Houston's Andre Ware is the only Heisman recipient to miss a bowl date since 1969. The Cougars were on probation during the 1989 season and were ineligible for selection to a bowl. Before that lapse, Oklahoma's Steve Owens in 1969 was the last Heisman awardee not to participate in a bowl game. Only 3 of the first 22 Heisman Trophy winners played in bowl games after receiving the award—TCU's Davey O'Brien in 1938, Georgia's Frank Sinkwich in 1942 and SMU's Doak Walker in 1948.

BOWL TIDBITS

Prior to Alabama and Clemson meeting for three consecutive seasons in the post season, the only other schools in FBS history to meet in a bowl game in 3 straight seasons were USC and Ohio State (1972, 1973, 1974 Rose Bowl).

Alabama won its 5th national title in the last 9 seasons. The shortest span needed to win 5 titles in the poll era prior to that was 16 seasons by Alabama from 1964-1979 under Bear Bryant.

The Sugar Bowl win over Clemson was Nick Saban's 7th win against the AP No. 1 team. No other coach has more than 4 such wins

The 2017 Alabama Crimson Tide football team became the 3rd team to win a national title a year after losing in championship game since the BCS began (joins 1999 Florida State and 2016 Clemson)
