When children hear and see that you want to follow Jesus, they'll follow suit enthusiastically. Help children discover the reasons we follow Jesus, such as his great love for us and his willingness to go to the cross on our behalf.



Lesson 1



Jesus Teaches About Commitment

Mark 8:31-38



Jesus Rebuked Peter

The disciples were likely counting on a great earthly kingdom in which Jesus would lead the Jews in overthrowing the Romans and would place his disciples in important positions. Jesus' statements didn't go along with those expectations! Peter wanted Jesus to change his mind and forget all this talk about dying.

Peter's thinking was based on wrong assumptions because he saw things from a purely human point of view. Here we see a clear statement about what it means to follow Jesus. Too often we think of God as a powerful being who can help us advance our own agendas. Instead, truly following Jesus means listening to what he says, discovering his will for our lives, and then obediently following, no matter how attractive or repulsive that may seem to us at the time.

Jesus Challenged the Crowd

A crowd had apparently gathered to hear Jesus, and he wanted to clarify his meaning. This is not a description of what some call "easy believism." Instead, Jesus points out how denying oneself means turning away from selfish, self-protective attitudes and seeking the true humility and faith God wants to see in us.

What does it mean to take up your cross? For Jesus' disciples to each take up his own cross didn't mean just to endure suffering. It meant to accept fully the suffering they would face because of their faith in Christ. Jesus wanted his disciples to know that their faith came with a cost.

Stand Firm in Faith

As he spoke of what it means to follow him, Jesus knew that many in the crowd around him wouldn't

be followers he would recognize as his own when he returns. Our generation is much like that of Jesus' day. People who claim to be religious—or even Christian—often shy away from bold witnessing for Jesus. It's easy to say you believe in God, but it's much more difficult to confess you're a Jesus-following Christian.

The Jesus Connection

Humans are willing to sacrifice a lot for the sake of those they love. Your relationship with Jesus *will* require sacrifice, risk, and loyal commitment—but it's all worth it!

How can you take up your cross? Try living out the "Joy" acronym: Pray about one specific way you'll put *Jesus* first (such as spending time with him first thing each day), put *others* second (such as washing a friend's car), and put *yourself* last (such as giving up time watching TV in order to help someone else). Welcoming Song

Tip Consistently use the same signal to announce a transition to the next activity. You could flip the lights off and on, use a train whistle, have a puppet rustling inside a bag, or sing cleanup songs. Keep it simple, consistent, and fun.

What You'll Do

When it's time to begin, use your signal to bring the children together in a circle on the floor. Lead kids in singing "Hi, My Friend!" (track 2 on the CD) to the tune of "Deep and Wide."

Hi, my friend! Hi, my friend! (shake a different friend's hand each time you sing "friend")

I'm so glad you came to class today. (hug a friend)

Hi, my friend! Hi, my friend! (shake a different friend's hand each time you sing "friend") God is here with you and me today! (hold hands in a circle, and raise them high) (Repeat.)

Say: I'm so glad you came today! Let's sing this next song loudly and clearly so anyone who hears us will know how much we love to ▶ FOLLOW JESUS!

Lead kids in singing "Jesus Loves Me Rock" (track 6 on the CD). Encourage kids to join you in singing. The first time through, have girls sing the phrase and boys sing the echo. On the repeat, reverse the parts. Have kids move "freestyle" to the beat.

Jesus loves me; (echo) This I know, (echo) For the Bible (echo)

Tells me so. (echo) Little children (echo)

To him belong. (echo)

They are weak, but (echo)

He's so strong! (echo)

Jaaayyy! (J)

Eeeeee! (E)

Sssss! (S)

Uuuuuu! (U)

Sssss! (S)



And what's that spell? (Jesus!)
And who do you love? (Jesus!)
And who loves you? (Jesus!)
Who died for you? (Jesus!)
And who's your guy? (Jesus!)
The apple of your eye! (Jesus!)
And who's your friend? (Jesus!)
He'll love ya to the end!

Say: Jesus really does love you. He loves you more than you can possibly imagine! And when we ▶ FOLLOW JESUS, we show that we love him, too. Let's show Jesus how much we love him right now.



Stand Proud

What You'll Do

Have children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to Romans 1:16, and show children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, Romans 1:16, says, "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile." The gospel is the truth that Jesus died for our sins and rose from the dead so we can live forever with him. Our Key Verse means that we're not embarrassed to tell others this good news! Let's say that together. Lead children in repeating the shortened Key Verse after you: "I am not ashamed of the gospel" (Romans 1:16).

Say: Once I was embarrassed when I [insert your story here]. But I'm not embarrassed or ashamed to tell people that Jesus died for me and came back to life! The gospel is great news! Let's sing a song that shows we're proud to follow Jesus.

Play "Proud to Follow" (track 7 on the CD), and lead kids in singing to the tune of "Camptown Races." Say: Let's march in place, standing proudly, and sing a song to tell the world we love Jesus!



Stand Proud Supplies

Stand Proud Easy Prep

Be prepared to share an embarrassing story with your kids.



I am proud to follow you, Jesus, Jesus! I am proud to follow you Everywhere you lead. I am not ashamed, I am not ashamed, Of the gospel, no I'm not! I love Jesus Christ! I am proud to follow you Everywhere you lead. (Repeat.)

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are ways to tell others about Jesus?
- Tell about a time you told others about Jesus.

Say: I want to ► FOLLOW JESUS. Jesus wants everyone to know how much he loves us, because he wants everyone to live with him forever!

EXPLORATION

Theo's News

What You'll Do

Say: Friends, it's time for Theo's News!

Have the children sit in a circle, and begin "Here, Theo" (track 4 on the CD). When the CD segment ends, bring out the Surprise Box and put Theophilus the FaithRetriever puppet on your hand. Then follow along with the script.

Theo: Hi, everybody!

Teacher: Hello, Theo! Tell us what interesting news you've dug up about the Bible today.

Theo: I hid it in the Surprise Box.

Teacher: Let's look inside to see what Theo dug up for us today.

(Invite a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the cross around the circle so the rest of the group can see it up close. Give the children time to guess what they might learn from the Bible today.)

Teacher: Friends, what do you think the cross stands for?

(Pause for kids to answer your question.)

Teacher: Theo, why did you hide this cross in the Surprise Box?

Theo's News Supplies

Surprise Box (any box will do) CD player Theo puppet **Teacher Pack** CD: "Here, Theo" (track

4)

"Jesus Loves Me" cross

Theo's News Easy Prep

Place the "Jesus Loves Me" cross inside your Surprise Box, and hide the box where it's easily accessible.



Theo: When we see a cross, it reminds us that Jesus died for our sins and came to life again.

Teacher: We'll learn from the Bible today that the disciples heard Jesus talking about dying and they didn't like it.

Theo: I wouldn't like it either. That would make me sad.

Teacher: Me too! But Jesus died on the cross because he loves us. Jesus wants us to

follow him. Friends, let's find out how we can ▶ FOLLOW JESUS!

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls! **Teacher:** Say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Bible Time: Next to Jesus

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Mark 8, and show children the words. Tell them that the Bible is God's special book. Then point out Jesus on the poster.

Say: Jesus loves you and me so much that he died for us so we could live in heaven with him forever. Today in the Bible we're going to learn about the disciples—who were a group of men who chose to ▶ FOLLOW JESUS, too. They loved listening to Jesus teach them. Let's pretend we're with the disciples as we gather around Jesus. Have children sit on the floor and crowd around "Jesus" on the poster.

Say: One of the things Jesus told the disciples was that he was going to suffer and die, and then come back to life. Show me how the disciples may have looked when they heard that news. Pause while kids show you. One of the disciples, named Peter, didn't like what he heard! Peter took Jesus aside and scolded him. What does it look like when someone scolds you? Pause while kids show you. Peter didn't want Jesus to talk about dying. But Jesus said to him, "You aren't thinking about what God wants; you're thinking only about what you want."

It was important for Jesus to die on the cross so we could be in heaven with him someday. So he told all the people that he wanted them to follow him. Jesus said it wouldn't be easy to follow him. He said not to be ashamed or embarrassed of him and his words.

Jesus' true friends stood up for Jesus. Let's stand up for Jesus right now. Have kids stand up. Show children the "People Follow Jesus" poster. Let's tell Jesus we're happy to follow him by drawing ourselves next to his picture.

Have kids draw smiley faces on the "People Follow Jesus" poster to represent themselves.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why are you happy to follow Jesus?
- What can we do to show other people how to follow Jesus?

Say: The most important thing we can ever do is FOLLOW JESUS. We can do what he tells us. We can read the Bible. We can tell our friends about him. And we can help people who need help. All of these things show that we follow Jesus.

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WEAVING FAITH

INTO LIFE

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.

Center 1: Following Jesus Supplies

My Bible Playground tape pencils 1 chenille wire per child

Center 1: Following Jesus Easy Prep

Remove the Lesson 1 pages from each My Bible Playground student book.

CENTER 1:

Following Jesus

What You'll Do

Distribute the Lesson 1 pages from My Bible Playground, and have kids write their names on their papers.

Give each child a chenille wire, and show him or her how to form a circle with it, twisting the ends together to make a large ring. Form pairs, and have kids lay their student pages on the floor. Have them take three steps back, and then take turns tossing their chenille rings onto their student pages. Have children answer the following for the picture they circle. If a child's ring misses a picture, have the child toss the ring again.

Ask:

What are the kids in the picture doing to follow Jesus?

After kids have played the game, give them tape so they can each tape their circle around an action they'd like to do next week.



Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was easy or hard about the action you chose?
- What are some other ways to show you follow Jesus?

Say: It's so great to FOLLOW JESUS, isn't it? We can tell people about Jesus; bring people to church; and be kind, loving, and caring. God gives us strength to follow Jesus. Other Christians give us encouragement to follow Jesus, too.

CENTER 2:

Happy Pops

What You'll Do

Have children clean their hands, and then sit in a circle. Give each child a small cup. Have them each say something good about Jesus, and then take some popcorn from the large bowl and put it into their cups.

Say: These cups are like our hearts, and popcorn is like Jesus' love. It fills our hearts. Jesus wants to fill your heart with his love! He can do that when we ► FOLLOW JESUS.

Invite a child to pray. Then let kids enjoy the snacks.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was fun about our snack time today?
- Tell about a time you told someone else about Jesus.

Say: Jesus wants us to FOLLOW JESUS, but he also wants other people to follow him, too! Jesus told others about God's love, and he wants us to tell others. You can make this snack with your family and friends and tell them good things about Jesus, too!

CENTER 3:

Follow Jesus Game

What You'll Do

Lay the "Follow Jesus Game" cards faceup on the ground.



Center 2: Happy Pops Supplies

large bowl popcorn small cups antibacterial gel (optional)



Center 3: Follow Jesus Game Supplies

scissors **Teacher Pack** "Follow Jesus Game" cards, cut apart

Lesson 1



The cards show the same "following Jesus" scenes that are on the student pages. Each scene is divided in two, so kids can play a matching game.

Show kids which cards go together. Then mix the cards and lay them facedown on the floor. Let kids take turns choosing two cards from the game. If the cards match, the child may keep them. If the cards don't match, the child will turn them over and the next person goes. After kids get all the matches, have them mix the cards and play again.

As kids play, have them show that they **FOLLOW JESUS** by being kind and patient. Remind them that Jesus wants us to treat one another with love and respect.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

What did this game show you about following Jesus?

Say: We show we FOLLOW JESUS when we are kind, patient, loving, and respectful. Jesus wants us to show love to others, because he loves everyone so much.

Center 4: Picture Clips Supplies

poster board scissors 1 clothespin and 1 magnet per child markers glitter craft glue

MAGNET WARNING Harmful if swallowed.

Center 4: Picture Clips Easy Prep

Cut a 4-inch cross shape from the poster board for each child. Write "Follow Jesus" across the center of each cross.

CENTER 4:

Picture Clips

What You'll Do

Give each child a cross that you prepared beforehand. Read the words on the cross to the children. Follow these steps.

- 1. Encourage children to use the markers and glitter to decorate the crosses.
- 2. Help kids each glue a clothespin to the back of their cross. Be sure that the bottom of the clothespin lines up with the bottom of the cross.
- 3. Glue a magnet to the back of each clothespin.
- 4. Encourage kids to put a picture of themselves in the clip when they get home and then hang the cross on their refrigerator as a reminder to be happy to follow Jesus every day.

Say: It isn't always easy to follow Jesus, especially around people who don't follow him. But Jesus wants us to stand up for him and say, "I ▶ FOLLOW JESUS."

These crosses can help us remember to ▶ FOLLOW JESUS. When we follow Jesus we get to live in heaven with Jesus forever!





Daily Challenges

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up the centers, bring everyone back to the circle area on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they remember about what they learned from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives this week. Use this challenge for encouraging your children's growing relationships with Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned to ► FOLLOW JESUS. Choose one of these Daily Challenges to help you remember to ► FOLLOW JESUS this week.

Give kids these three challenges to choose from:

- 1. Lead your family in a prayer, asking God to help you follow Jesus.
- 2. Tell a friend that you follow Jesus.
- 3. When you wake up in the morning, tell Jesus that you're going to follow him that day.

Say: If you want to lead your family in a prayer, circle choice number 1. If you want to tell a friend you follow Jesus, circle choice number 2. If you want to tell Jesus you'll follow him, circle choice number 3. Check that each child circled a choice. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!

Happy-to-Follow Prayer

What You'll Do

Have kids sit in a circle.

Say: The best thing we can ever do is to ► FOLLOW JESUS. He wants us to be happy to follow him. As I go around the circle, say your favorite thing about Jesus.

After each child has said a favorite thing about Jesus, close in prayer: **Jesus, we love** so many different things about you. Thank you for everything you've done for us. We love you. In your name, amen.



Jesus Clears Merchants From the Temple

John 2:13-22

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Temple Laws Gone Wrong

Strict regulations guided the activity that was to take place in the Temple. This was to remain a holy place, the dwelling place of God. According to Isaiah 56:7, it was to be a house of prayer.

Unfortunately, the Jewish leaders, who strictly upheld laws that were convenient for them, saw an opportunity for profit in the animals to be sacrificed at the Temple. Any animal to be offered as a sacrifice was to be perfect, free from blemish. And people bringing animals for sacrifice surely chose the best from the flocks and herds. But when Jewish pilgrims brought their animals for sacrifice, the Temple inspectors regularly found something wrong with them. Then they would conveniently offer animals they had approved—for many times the going price outside the Temple.

Merchants also were exchanging money—giving people the Temple currency in exchange for their Roman or other foreign coins. The Temple currency was required for paying the Temple tax. From Jesus' disdain of this practice, it's easy to assume that people were also being cheated in this process.

Jesus Clears the Temple

It's likely that Jesus' response, while passionate, was not a purely emotional outburst. He saw what was going on in the Temple, he took time to make a whip from some ropes, and then he took appropriate action. Jesus was angry, and rightly so, but not out of control. He told the merchants, "Stop turning my Father's house into a marketplace!"

The Merchants' Response

The Jews' response is interesting. They didn't deny that they had been doing wrong. No one asked Jesus

why he did what he did. No one angrily struck back at Jesus out of righteous indignation. Their only response was to ask, "How can you prove you have the authority to do this?" When people know they're in the wrong, they often resort to legalistic maneuvering to try to blur the plain evidence of their guilt.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus' passion in this account reveals that he desires a real relationship with his people. Nothing—no money-changers or legalism—can get in the way of his love for you!

Does Jesus need to "drive out" wrong worship from your life? How have distracting thoughts, focus on self, or efforts to appear spiritual hindered your own sincere worship? Take a moment to physically bow down before God. Spend time silently clearing out the "Temple courts" in your life and praising God with a sincere heart. You can write your prayer here.

Tip Consistently use the same signal to announce a transition to the next activity. You could flip the lights off and on, use a train whistle, have a puppet rustling inside a bag, or sing cleanup songs. Keep it simple, consistent, and fun.

What You'll Do

As children arrive, greet each one with a smile. When it's time to begin, use your signal to bring the children together in a circle on the floor. Sing "Hi, My Friend!" (track 2 on the CD) to the tune of "Deep and Wide." Encourage kids to join you in singing and doing the motions.

Say: Singing is a great way to worship God, but it's not the only way we WORSHIP GOD. Let's find out some other ways we can worship him!



Worship God

What You'll Do

Have the children sit in a circle. Open your Bible to Romans 1:16, and show the children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, Romans 1:16, says, "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile." Let's say our Key Verse together.

Lead children in repeating the shortened Key Verse with you several times: "I am not ashamed of the gospel" (Romans 1:16).

Say: The gospel is the good news about Jesus. To be ashamed means being embarrassed. We don't want to be ashamed of the gospel, because the gospel tells us about Jesus and his love for us. In the Bible today, we'll hear how Jesus went out to tell everyone about God because he wasn't ashamed of this good news either. We're going to play a game to help us remember this.

Place the bowl and bag of wrapped candy in the center of the room. Tell the children when you call "worship God," you want everyone to run to one of two corners while you close your eyes. When you open your eyes, call out the following questions and give children in each corner about 10 seconds to call out as many answers as they can to your question.

Ask:

- Corner 1: Name three people you can share the good news about Jesus
- Corner 2: Name something you can do to share the good news about Jesus with others.

For every answer given, put a piece of candy in the bowl. Then divide the candy evenly among all the children, adding from the bag if necessary.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What's the best news you ever got?
- When you have good news, who are the people you want to tell first? Why do you want to tell those people first?

Say: Worship is important to God. When we WORSHIP GOD, we show we aren't ashamed of his message to us. Let's say our Key Verse one more time. Lead children in saying the Key Verse with you: "I am not ashamed of the gospel" (Romans 1:16).

Say: We're going to take home some sweet treats to remember that when we leave here we will not be ashamed of the gospel!

Say: Friends, it's time for Theo's News!

Bible Time: Jesus at the Temple

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to John 2 and show children the words. Tell children that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Today's Bible verse tells us that worship is important to God. In Jesus' day, people worshipped God in a Temple. It was a very special, holy place like our church. To get ready for Bible time, let's use these blocks to make a temple.

Have kids work together to build a temple using the blocks.

As they build, say: Worship is important to God because he deserves our thanks and praise. He made us and he made everything in our world! Jesus and his friends worshipped in a Temple. They may have sung and prayed like we do today. We worship God in church, but we can also worship God anywhere. Good job building this temple! You did fine work. Now close your eyes as I tell you about Jesus. Let's pretend we're back in the days when Jesus was here. Have kids close their eyes.

Play "Market Noises" (track 9 on the CD) in the background. Fill the temple with the toy animals and play money as you begin.

Say: One day, Jesus and his friends decided to go to the Temple. When Jesus got there, people weren't worshipping God. Jesus found people selling cows, sheep, and doves! Go ahead and open your eyes. Pause for kids to see their temple filled with animals and money. Jesus loves animals, but he was angry because the people were selling them in the Temple! So he made all the people who were selling things leave the Temple. Jesus told them, "Get out of here! How dare you do this in my father's house!" Show kids the "Jesus Clears the Temple" poster.

Let's clear our temple, too. Have kids take the items out of the temple and place them aside. As they take out each item, have them say, "Get these out of here!" Encourage kids to mend the original temple if some blocks have tumbled over in the process.

Say: When we WORSHIP GOD, he wants us to worship him with our whole heart. Let's do an activity that will remind us of our Bible Point. Encourage each child to place a heart sticker on the "Jesus Clears the Temple" poster as they say "Worship God."

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did you think when you opened your eyes and saw your temple?
- Why was it good for Jesus to remove the animals and money from the Temple?

Say: You looked surprised when you saw the things that filled your temple. Jesus could have been surprised, but he also was angry. He wanted the Temple to be a special place to worship God. God's church shouldn't be crowded with a bunch of people selling animals. Jesus wants us to know that worship is important to God, so we WORSHIP GOD. God loves us. We tell God we love him when we worship him!

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. What You'll Do

Have kids make a temple by spreading icing on a cookie or graham cracker. Then have each child fill the temple with some animal cookies. Have kids clear out the temples as they eat their animal crackers one by one and say, "We worship God. Get this out of here!"

Say: I'm so glad we WORSHIP GOD! He loves us. He knows everything about us. He cares for us. He helps us. He deserves our worship! Let's say a cheer for God! Lead kids in a hip-hip-hooray cheer for Jesus.

CENTER 3:

Worship Center

What You'll Do

Stand in a circle with kids.

Say: We don't have to just sing songs to worship God. You can pray or tell each other why you love God. You could play a song from our CD, move around using these streamers, or even draw a picture for God using these art supplies.

Encourage kids to explore a variety of ways to worship God spontaneously.

God's House Is Different

What You'll Do

Demonstrate the following for children. Take an envelope and hold the top flap up, with the open slot facing you. Use scissors to cut a vertical line in the center of the front layer from the top to the bottom fold. Cut horizontally from the bottom center to the bottom right and left of the envelope.

Show children that when the envelope is opened, it looks like the inside of a church building.

Give children each an envelope, and help them cut the envelopes in the same way. Have kids draw a cross at the top and center of the open envelope flap. Tell kids to use the crayons or markers to create pictures of what people do inside church, such as praying, singing, reading the Bible, and talking to others.

Say: We learned from the Bible that worship is important to God. The people in Jesus' time had let animals and salesmen into their place of worship. They weren't worshipping God with all their hearts.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What kinds of things keep us from worshipping God?
- Why is it important to worship God?

Say: We can take this church home to remind us that worshipping God means focusing on God. This week, remember to not let anything take your attention away from God! When we focus on God only, we ▶ WORSHIP GOD!





Daily Challenges

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up their centers, bring everyone back to a circle area on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they remember about what they learned from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives this week. Use this challenge for encouraging your children's growing relationships with Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned that we ► WORSHIP GOD. Choose one of these Daily Challenges to remember that we worship God.

Give kids these three challenges to choose from:

- 1. Lead your family in singing a worship song, and then explain to them that worship is important to God.
- 2. Draw a picture of yourself worshipping God, and then hang it up in your bedroom to remind you that worship is important to God.
- 3. When you wake up in the morning, worship God by thanking him for another day.

Say: If you want to sing a worship song, circle choice number 1. If you want to draw a picture, circle choice number 2. If you want to thank God for another day, circle choice number 3. Check that each child circled a choice. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!



Jesus Explains Why God Sent Him

John 3:12-21



Nicodemus Sought Jesus

In this passage, Jesus is talking with Nicodemus, a Pharisee and a member of the Sanhedrin, the Jewish religious ruling council. Jesus launched into the conversation by making it clear that new birth is the only way to God's kingdom. For Nicodemus, a strict follower of the Law who thought obedience to a set of rules was his ticket to heaven, the concept of a "new birth" was tough to grasp. He had trouble accepting that all his good works and intentions wouldn't get him into God's kingdom.

Jesus Summarized God's Plan of Salvation

Jesus' reference to Moses' lifting up the snake in the desert refers to a time God sent poisonous snakes among the Israelites to punish them for rebelling against him. Those who had been bitten were dying. But God in his mercy instructed Moses to make a snake of bronze and lift it up on a pole where all could see it, promising safety to all who looked upon it. All who believed God and looked at the snake were spared from death. In the same way, Jesus would be lifted up on the cross, and as people looked to him in faith, they would be spared from eternal death for their sins.

Why did God send his own Son to die an agonizing death on the cross? The answer is clear in verse 16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." In this sentence, Jesus summarizes God's entire plan of salvation. What amazing love!

We Must Respond in Faith

Jesus' message for Nicodemus and for us today is that following religious rules won't win us God's favor.

God has a different plan, because all the good we can ever do won't wipe out a single sin. Only Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, which paid the death penalty for us, makes it possible for us to enter heaven. And only our response in faith to that gift and to the Holy Spirit working in our lives will seal the deal.

The Jesus Connection

There are many awesome "benefits" of a relationship with Jesus, but this is the ultimate one: We can be born again! A new life, a fresh start, a clean slate!

John 3:16 is so familiar that it's tempting to skim it without taking its full meaning to heart. So stop for a moment and reread it. How do Jesus' words impact you? What questions do you have? Pray about your thoughts and questions. You can write your prayer here


What You'll Do

Open your Bible to John 3, and show children the words. Tell them that the Bible is God's special book.



Ask:

- Have you ever been lost? What happened?
- Tell about when you were found.



In our Bible passage today, Jesus explains why God sent him. Let's hear all about it!

Invite a child to help you tape the "Jesus" poster to a wall. Turn off the lights, begin "Why God Sent Jesus" (track 10 on the CD), and follow the actions in the script below.

Jesus: Welcome, children. I'm so glad you're here to listen to why I came to earth. First of all, do you know that I love you? Recording will have a three-second pause. Good! Because I do love you so much! Hold up the picture of the earth and shine the flashlight on it.

Well, God loved the world so much that he gave his Son...that's me. Whoever believes in me won't die, but will live forever. Tell someone sitting next to you how that makes you feel. How do you feel knowing you and everyone who loves me will live in heaven forever? Your teacher will pause the CD. Put the picture and flashlight down and pause the CD.

I came to save you because I love you so much. It's kind of like this...Light (that's me!) has come into the world. Hold up the picture of the earth and shine the flashlight on it. I came into the world to save you!

Some people like darkness more than they like light. Turn off the flashlight.

That's because they do bad things. In fact, the people who do bad things don't want to come near the light because they're afraid the light will show all the bad things they do. Turn the flashlight back on and shine it around the picture.

Other people love me and want to be near the light. These people aren't afraid to come near the light because the good things they do, they do through God. The light...that's me!...has come into the world to save each one of you. Shine the flashlight so it moves across each of the kids.

Always remember I love you, and oh yeah—tell everyone about me! Because I love the who-o-o-o-le world! Hold up the picture of the earth. Stop the CD and turn the lights back on.





Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why did Jesus come to earth?
- Tell what you think about this: ▶ JESUS CAME TO SHOW GOD'S LOVE.

Say: Jesus came to save us! God loves the world, so he sent Jesus to die on the cross for us. When we believe in Jesus and ask him to forgive our sins, he does. That's the way we get to live in heaven forever. Let's tell this good news to our friends, families, and everyone we meet!

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Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. 

Jesus Notices a Widow's Giving

Mark 12:41-44



Watching in the Temple

While Jesus—and presumably some of his disciples—sat watching in the Temple courts, numerous rich people gave large offerings of money. The disciples, who were from the lower economic classes, were probably amazed at some of the fortunes offered by these wealthy Jews.

They may not have even noticed the poor widow who dropped her two coins into the treasury box. These were the smallest coins in the Roman Empire. It took over 100 of these to make up a day's wages. In terms of today's wages, they would have been worth no more than a couple of dollars each. Yet Jesus knew how big the widow's gift was.

An Extravagant Offering

Some Christians today might consider the widow's giving foolish—she didn't have to give both coins; she didn't have to give even one coin. After all, she needed that money just to stay alive. But that kind of thinking is precisely what Jesus was teaching against. If we give only part of what we have—of what we are—to Jesus, we're holding back. Jesus wants all of us. He wants us to give him all we have and all we are and to trust him for the results.

Our Gifts

Which of the givers in this passage are you more like? As you explore this passage, challenge yourself to examine what you're giving to God. Are you giving just a small portion of your time, money, talents, and commitment to God? Is God getting the leftovers after you've taken care of all your wants? Or are you giving as the poor widow gave, risking all you have on God? The widow's choice is not an easy one, but it's one that honors God.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus isn't impressed by outward displays of wealth—he looks straight into the heart at the inward wealth of faith, commitment, generosity, and trust. He knows the *real* you.

What does Jesus see in your heart? Are you fully entrusting your needs, wants, and future to God? What are you holding back? Grab a penny, and hold it as you pray about areas of your life that you need to give over to God. You can write your prayer below. Then give that penny in your church offering as a symbol to God of your commitment.

What's Most Important?

What You'll Do

Have the children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to Philippians 2:11, and show children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from Philippians 2:11 says, "And every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." Let's say our Key Verse together. Lead children in saying the shortened Key Verse aloud with you: "Jesus Christ is Lord" (Philippians 2:11).

Say: When we say someone is Lord, we mean that person is the most important person of all! To say that Jesus is Lord means that Jesus is more important than anything else. Let's do an activity to help us learn more about what it means that Jesus is Lord.



What's Most Important? Supplies

Gather kids in a circle around a collection of objects that symbolize the activities and interests important in kids' lives. This collection might include sports equipment, movies, video games, books, and pictures from catalogs and magazines of popular cultural or cartoon figures.

One at a time, have kids choose an item from the collection. Have children each explain what's important about the item they chose. Affirm kids' interests in these items and the fun they associate with them. After each child finishes, have the group say, "[Name of item] is important, but Jesus Christ is Lord."

Talk With Kids

Afterward, lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What is the most important thing in your life besides Jesus?
- Why is Jesus more important than anything else?
- What can you do to show others that Jesus Christ is Lord of your life?

Say: All the things we talked about are fun or important parts of our lives. But Jesus is the most important! One way we can show Jesus that he is Lord is by giving him our best—like a person we'll hear about in the Bible today. When we

GIVE TO GOD, we show him how important he is to us.

Help children each place a coin under their student pages in the appropriate areas. Then have children rub the flat side of a crayon over their pages so the image of the coin shows up. You may need to remove the paper on the crayons for kids to do the rubbing.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are the kids doing in each of these pictures?
- What can you do to give to God at school? at home? at church? in your neighborhood?

Say: We can ► GIVE TO GOD wherever we are—at home, school, church, or in our neighborhood. We can be kind and loving. We can be helpful and happy. And we can tell others about Jesus. Give children the banana "coins" from the bowl and the rest of their banana halves. Encourage kids to cut and count their pieces. Invite a child to say a prayer of thanks before kids eat their snack.

CENTER 3:

Coin Twirl

What You'll Do

Say: In today's Bible passage we've learned about a woman who gave everything she had to Jesus—just two small coins! We're going to play a game with our coins and learn more about giving to God.

Form pairs, and have children sit at opposite sides of a table, facing their partner. Give each pair a coin. Show kids how to twirl a coin by holding the coin perpendicular on the tabletop with the index finger of one hand, and flicking it with the fingers of the other hand.

Say: Be patient with yourself and do your best to keep the coins spinning on the table.

Have partners take turns twirling the coin. Each time a child twirls the coin, have him or her say: ▶ "GIVE TO GOD!" Collect the coins when kids have finished.

Cover a table with newspaper, and set out small jars, tissue paper in various colors, paintbrushes, and glue.

Say: We're going to make banks to put money in by tearing tissue paper into small pieces and gluing the pieces to the outside of the jars.

Have kids help tear the tissue paper and then each brush glue all over the outside of their jars. Show kids how to press the small pieces of tissue paper to the sides of the jar. Then set the jars aside to dry.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

■ The coins the poor woman gave to God were everything to her. What can you give to God that means a lot to you?

Say: Take your banks home to help you remember the poor woman who did her best and gave all she had to live on to God. Save money in your banks, and then give to the church or to some people you know who need it. Remember, ▶ GIVE TO GOD because he gives to us.



People Rejoice as Jesus Enters Jerusalem

Mark 11:1-11



Prophecies Fulfilled

This moment in Jewish history had long been anticipated. Zechariah 9:9 predicts that the Messiah would come "gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." Without question, the Jews along Jesus' path made this connection and knew what it meant. Their celebration made this clear as they covered Jesus' path with their outer robes and palm branches—a demonstration of honor and submission.

The King Comes

The cries of the people were significant. As they shouted "hosanna," they were saying, "Lord, save us!" As they referred to Jesus as "he who comes in the name of the Lord" and spoke plainly of "the coming kingdom of our father David," they were making clear references to the Messiah predicted many times in the Old Testament.

Confusing Events

After the excitement of his triumphal entry, Jesus and his disciples left Jerusalem to spend the night in Bethany, where Mary, Martha, and Lazarus lived. No mention is made of the crowd following them. After all the cheering had died down, everyone must have gone home. Jesus had spoken earlier of his imminent death, but the day's events probably encouraged the disciples to think about Jesus being made king. How could things possibly turn against him as Jesus said they would?

As events unfolded, the disciples' heads must have been spinning. Throngs honored Jesus that day, but only a few days later the disciples hid in fear of the authorities, trying to find a way to live for the crucified Jesus.

Changed Lives

Fortunately, we know what happened next. After the Resurrection, everything changed. And that's how it can be in our lives. When we choose to live for Jesus, everything changes. We don't honor him just by cheering and praying and singing great worship songs. We honor him—as the disciples did—in every facet of our lives. We honor him through our worship but also through our obedience, service, witness, and gratitude.

The Jesus Connection

"Hosanna! Lord save us!" Jesus answers that plea: Through a relationship with him, we can experience this great gift of salvation.

It's easy to unintentionally develop a ho-hum attitude about faith. Yet in this passage, the crowds honored Jesus with extravagant, public displays of worship. What can you do to break free of complacency? How will you extravagantly worship Jesus this week? Pray about actions you can take or words you can say this week to honor Jesus as the Messiah. You can write your prayer here.

Have kids form two lines and face each other, about 5 feet apart. Let the kids walk one at a time between the two lines. Encourage kids to clap, celebrate, and shout affirmations to the child walking between the lines.







ome 5- and 6-year-olds may have experienced the death of a grandparent, relative, or pet. However, most children this age have an unrealistic view of death, influenced in part by what they see on television or in movies. The children's limited understanding of death can hamper their understanding of how miraculous it was for Jesus to come back to life. Use this lesson to emphasize that Jesus truly died and was buried—then celebrate with children that Jesus is alive today.



Jesus Is Alive!

Mark 16:1-8



Four Views

The first question skeptics ask about Jesus' resurrection is, Why do the Gospel writers all give different accounts? To answer that question, think about an exciting event in your life at which several people were present. If you asked them to tell about the events of that day, would all their versions of the day be exactly the same? Of course not. We all see things from different perspectives and remember different details of what we see.

That's exactly what happened with the Gospel writers' telling of Jesus' resurrection. All seeming contradictions arise out of their slightly different views of events and can easily be resolved when one accepts that truth. In fact, if all the accounts were exactly the same, a critic would say that the authors had collaborated to make up a convincing story. And thanks to these different viewpoints, the accounts we have—as orchestrated by God—give us a more nearly complete picture of what happened than if only one Gospel had been written.

Especially Good News

The angel's proclamation "He has risen!" was the most wonderful news anyone could have given to Jesus' followers. He was alive, and they were to meet him! Why did the angel mention Peter specifically? Peter—the bold one—had fearfully denied Jesus three times the night of Jesus' trial and then had broken down and wept (Mark 14:66-72). Now that Jesus was alive, Peter would likely wonder if Jesus would accept him. The angel left no doubt of Jesus' forgiveness by telling the women at the tomb, "Go tell his disciples and Peter."

Death Defeated

Why do we celebrate Easter? The Apostle Paul eloquently tells us, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins...The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:17, 56-57). What more could we ask? "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

The Jesus Connection

We don't serve a dead leader the way most other religions do. Jesus is alive! Because he lives, we can each have a dynamic and growing relationship with him.

How can you thank God for the indescribable gift of Jesus and the world-rocking, sin-shattering, life-revolutionizing power of his resurrection? Make this Easter Sunday special. Turn from distractions, and focus instead on the real gift of Easter: new life through Jesus' death and resurrection. Start now by talking to God about what Easter means to you. Teacher: Let's look inside to see what Theo dug up for us today.

(Invite a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the cocoon around the circle so everyone can see it up close. Give children time to guess what they might learn about the Bible today.)

Teacher: Theo, why did you hide a cocoon in the Surprise Box?

Theo: To surprise you, of course.

Teacher: Friends, what do you know about a cocoon?

(Pause for kids to answer your question.)

Theo: A cocoon reminds me of a sleeping bag!

Teacher: It does look like a sleeping bag.

Theo: But there's a lot more going on inside a cocoon than just sleeping.

Teacher: That's right! There's a surprise in the cocoon.

Theo: It's a butterfly!

Teacher: That's right! We'll hear from the Bible today how some women got a surprise at Jesus' tomb. Jesus wasn't dead; ▶ **JESUS IS ALIVE!** Let's listen to the Bible to learn

more.

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls! **Teacher:** Say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Bible Time: Sensing Jesus

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Mark 16, and show the children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Jesus had died on a cross. He did this to take away all of the bad things that we do. Lay the rolled-up cocoon poster in front of you. Place a rolled-up student page in front of each child. The people wrapped Jesus' body in cloth and put it in a tomb kind of like a cave. Let's pretend the cocoon in front of you is Jesus' body.

Ask:

■ What happens to a person's body when he or she dies?

Say: We're sad when someone dies, because we miss that person. All of Jesus' friends were very sad that he died. They missed him so much.

Three of Jesus' friends—Mary, Mary Magdalene, and Salome—decided to bring some good-smelling spices to where Jesus was buried because they loved Jesus. Open the bag of potpourri (or bar of soap). Have children pass the bag or soap around and take turns smelling it.

The women walked from their houses to the cave where Jesus lay. Let's pretend to walk to the cave. Show me how sad the women may've looked as they walked. Lead children in looking sad and walking toward the door to the empty room. Stop the procession just before you get there.

When the women were almost there, they knew they had a problem. A giant stone would be in front of the cave so no one could get in. The women decided they'd need to find someone to help them move the stone when they got there. Lead kids the rest of the way to the closet or door.

When they got to the cave, they saw that someone had already moved the stone. Motion to the door that's partly open.

The women must've been surprised that the stone had already been rolled away.

Remove the Lesson 6 pages from each My Bible Playground student book. Roll and tape each page with the butterfly on the inside. Be prepared to lead kids to an empty room, closet, or hallway with a partially open door.



When they went into the cave, they had another surprise! It was empty! Jesus was gone! Have kids take a peek into the empty room, and say: Nope! Nothing here!

The women were upset. They thought Jesus was dead. They thought someone took his body away. Then they saw an angel. The angel told them that Jesus had risen. The angel told them to tell their friends that ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE!

Return with the children to where you began. Remind kids of their cocoons, and have them tell the children sitting on either side of them that **> JESUS IS ALIVE**. Then have kids unroll their cocoons. Unroll the teaching poster as well.

Say: Your cocoons aren't dead! Bright, wonderful, alive butterflies come out of cocoons. And Jesus isn't dead and buried in the tomb anymore. ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE!

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What surprised you about what we heard from the Bible today?
- What do you think is the most amazing thing about what we heard?

Say: Jesus was dead and buried, but he's not dead anymore — ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE!

INTO LIFE

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.

Say: When the women arrived at the cave, they were surprised to see that the stone had been moved. Let's make a snack that helps us remember that ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE!

Have kids each roll up their tortillas to look like cocoons. Then have kids unroll their tortillas and spread cream cheese on their tortillas.

Say: **Butterflies can remind us that Jesus came back to life.** Show kids how to make an outline of a butterfly with chocolate chips.

Say: What beautiful butterflies! ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE!

Ask a child to say a prayer of thanks that Jesus is alive. Then let kids eat the snacks as they celebrate that ▶ JESUS IS ALIVE!




CENTER 4:

What You'll Do

Give each child a piece of brown construction paper.

Say: In the spring, the whole earth is waking up. But before that happens, in a lot of places it looks like everything is dead. The ground is brown just like this paper.

But what looks dead really has life in it! Let's create some flowers from this dead ground!

Have kids use markers to draw stems on their papers. Then have them each press a finger onto an ink pad and create a flower at the top of the stem with their thumbprints. Have kids use wet wipes to clean their fingers.

Talk With Kids ■■■■

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What's similar between the flower popping out of the ground and Jesus coming back to life?
- What are ways we can know that Jesus is alive?

Say: In the fall people bury—or plant—plain, brown flower bulbs in the ground. In the spring beautiful new flowers appear in each bulb's place. The people in the Bible were sad because they thought Jesus was dead. But Jesus did not stay buried in the tomb—▶ JESUS IS ALIVE! And Jesus gives beautiful new life to us, too!

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up the centers, bring everyone back to the circle area on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they remember about what they learned from the Bible today.

Check that each child circled a choice. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!

Alive Prayer

What You'll Do

Have kids stand in a circle, and ask them to be really still and not move a muscle and try not to breathe. Then say the following prayer.

Pray: Dear Jesus, thank you for dying for our sins. Thank you for coming back to life, so we can live with you forever! Have kids start jumping up and down and clapping. Then have kids join hands and give them a few seconds to silently thank Jesus that he's alive for us.

Close by praying: In your name, amen.

Jesus Appears to His Disciples

John 20:19-31



Scared Disciples

Hiding in a room with the doors locked "for fear of the Jews"—that's where Jesus found his disciples the evening of his resurrection day! They knew Jesus had been crucified. Some, no doubt, had seen him die. They had heard from the women that Jesus had risen, but they hadn't seen him. Confusion must have ruled their thoughts and conversation that evening.

Seeing Jesus

Jesus must have looked somewhat different in his new spiritual body. Mary didn't recognize him at first outside the tomb (John 20:14). And apparently Jesus' appearance to the disciples didn't immediately allay theirs fears because his first words were "Peace be with you!" Then he showed the disciples the wounds in his hands and side to verify his identity. It may have taken a moment, but finally the disciples' fears and confusion fell away, and they were overjoyed!

Our Advantage

Having faith was not easy for these first-century disciples. Thomas was really no different from the others. The other disciples demonstrated by their actions that they doubted Jesus' resurrection until they actually saw him. It's easy to think that those living in Jesus' day had an advantage over us in developing faith. But we may have the advantage. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection didn't fit the disciples' expectations of the Messiah. They had to reconsider all their preconceived notions of the Messiah. They had to match Jesus' actions with what the Old Testament Scriptures predicted about the Messiah. Only then could they fully have faith.

What Is Faith Anyway?

Faith means trusting Christ for everything. It means believing in his sacrifice on the cross and living a life of gratitude for what he's done. It means giving up any hope of winning God's favor by our human efforts. It means seeking Jesus above all else.

The Jesus Connection

Reread John 20:29. Jesus is talking about you! It takes great faith to believe when you can't see or touch Jesus; that's why he calls your relationship with him "blessed"!

Do you ever feel like Thomas? Jesus revealed himself to Thomas and allayed his doubts. What doubts or faith questions do you have? Speak openly to God about them in prayer, and then look for ways God will reveal himself to you through Scripture, your pastor's words, Christian friends, prayer, nature, or the promptings of the Holy Spirit. You can write your prayer here.

Say: Love is all of those things—and so is Jesus! He loves all of us very much and wants us to love him, too. If we ▶ BELIEVE IN JESUS, he can show us how to love others, too.

it together. Lead children in repeating the simplified Key Verse with you: **People who** believe in Jesus will live forever (John 11:25).

Say: Because Jesus died and came back to life again, we have his wonderful promise that we, too, can live forever. When a Christian dies, he or she goes to heaven to be with Jesus. Heaven will be our new home...forever! In heaven there is no sadness or sin or trouble. There is no sickness or dying—only love, joy, and peace with God. What a wonderful place to live forever!

One at a time, I want each of you to go over to the pictures, pick one, and then come back and sit in a group with other kids who picked the same picture. Help kids get into the correct group when they come back with their picture.

Once each child has a picture and is in a group, have each group stand up and let kids share a way their item can help them believe in Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why did you choose the item you did?
- Why do you think these things can help us believe in Jesus?

Say: Just having a Bible or singing songs won't get us into heaven. Only believing in Jesus can do that. But Bibles, church, praise songs, and other things like these can help us know Jesus and ▶ BELIEVE IN JESUS. Living in heaven with Jesus will be wonderful! Let's say our Key Verse together one more time. Lead children in saying the simplified Key Verse with you: People who believe in Jesus will live forever (John 11:25).

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to John 20, and show children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Some people were angry with Jesus' friends. They didn't like Jesus, and they didn't like his friends. Jesus had died on the cross, and Jesus' friends were afraid and sad. They hid in a room and locked the door. Have everyone huddle in a tight circle, and dim the lights. If you have a door in your room, close it now.

Say: All of a sudden, Jesus appeared in that room! How did he get in there? The door was locked! Shine a flashlight on the "Jesus" poster on the wall. Jesus told his friends, "Peace be with you."

That must've been a big shock! Now Jesus was alive, just like he said he would be! Jesus showed his friends his hands and side where he'd been hurt. Point to Jesus' hands and side on the poster.

His friends were so happy to see that Jesus was alive! Jesus told them that God had sent him; now Jesus was sending his friends to share this awesome news with others: Jesus is alive! Have kids tell a partner, Figure 18 "BELIEVE IN JESUS! Jesus is alive!"

Jesus breathed on his friends and gave them the Holy Spirit. Have everyone take a deep breath and then let it out.

The Holy Spirit gave his friends help and courage to do what Jesus wanted them to! Have kids stand up and act brave.

One of Jesus' friends named Thomas wasn't in the room when Jesus came, so the others told him, "We have seen the Lord!" Have kids repeat the phrase joyfully.

Thomas said that before he'd believe Jesus was alive, he'd have to see Jesus' hands where the nails had been and feel Jesus' side where he had been hurt.

A week later, Jesus' friends again were in a locked room and Thomas was with them. All of a sudden, Jesus appeared! Show children the "Jesus Surprises His Friends" poster.

Jesus told Thomas to touch his hands and side. Encourage each of the kids to come to the poster and touch Jesus' hands and side.

Thomas said, "My Lord and my God!" Have kids repeat the phrase. Jesus loved Thomas and all his friends. He was glad they believed in him, because he knew they had a big job to do-to tell the world that Jesus was alive! Jesus told them that people are blessed who believe in him and haven't seen him yet. Jesus wants everyone to believe in him and live forever!

Have kids form a line and march around the room, pretending to tell everyone about Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was surprising about the way Jesus told Thomas to touch his hands
- What can we do to help others ▶ BELIEVE IN JESUS?

Say: Jesus helped Thomas believe that he was alive by showing him! Jesus calls us blessed because we believe without seeing him yet! The Holy Spirit, the Bible, other Christians, and our church help us believe in Jesus. Let's tell everyone to BELIEVE IN JESUS and live forever!

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.



CENTER 1:

Air Art

What You'll Do

Have children form pairs.

Distribute the Lesson 7 My Bible Playground student pages, and have kids write their names on their papers.

Set out plastic spoons, straws, and shallow bowls of thin tempera paint.

Show children how to spoon a small amount of paint onto their pages, and then make designs by blowing the paint with their straws. Tell children not to actually dip the straws in the paint, but to let the air do the job.

Say: See how the air moves the paint? Just like that, Jesus can move inside of us and do wonderful things when we believe in him.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What can Jesus do to "move" or do good things in a person's life?
- What are some ways you can show others you believe in Jesus?

Say: Even though we can't see air, we know it's real. Look at how air made the paint move! Thomas had a hard time believing that Jesus was alive because he couldn't see him. But many things are real, even if we can't see them—like your breath or air! Faith is believing in what we don't see. We can't see Jesus, but we believe in him. The Bible tells us to BELIEVE IN JESUS!

CENTER 2:

Sippy Surprise

What You'll Do

Have kids clean their hands, and then give each child two paper cups.

Say: Wait to enjoy your drinks until everyone has been served. Pour the clear liquid into one cup and the red liquid into the other.

As you pour, ask: What do you like to drink when you're really thirsty? If kids ask what the drinks are, encourage them to guess, but don't tell them yet.

When everyone has been served, say: **Taste your drinks**.

Center 2: Sippy Surprise Easy Prep

Fill 1 pitcher with cold water, and add red food coloring until the water resembles a fruit drink. Pour the sports drink into the other pitcher.



Allow time for all the kids to discover that the drinks don't taste as they might have expected. Then explain what the two pitchers contain. Distribute graham crackers for children to enjoy with their drinks.

Talk With Kids

As children snack, lead them in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did you expect when you first took a drink?
- What surprised you when you found out that the drink wasn't what you expected?

Say: This is similar to what Jesus' friends felt when they thought Jesus was dead but then they saw that he was alive again.

Imagine what it must've been like for the disciples who thought their friend Jesus was dead but instead, he was alive! When they saw Jesus alive, they knew he was no ordinary man. They knew Jesus was God's Son, the Savior! Jesus died on the cross but now he's alive! That's why we BELIEVE IN JESUS.

Center 3: Have Faith! Supplies

What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Let kids play with the bubbles. If you don't have enough bubble containers, have kids take turns playing with the bubbles.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What does it take to make a bubble?
- Air is real, even though you can't see it with your eyes. What is real about Jesus, even if we can't see him with our eyes?

Say: Air is inside the bubbles. We can't see air, but we know it's there.

Have kids each hold a hand a few inches in front of their mouths. Have children take a deep breath and then let it out.

Say: Air has the strength to make bubbles and move them across the room, even though we can't see the air. Even though we can't see him today, we can have faith and **BELIEVE IN JESUS**.

Have kids take another deep breath, and let it out again.

Lead children in singing "Jesus Came" (all verses) (track 18 on the CD) to the tune of "Yankee Doodle." Have kids wave their fans to the beat.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What do you believe is true about Jesus?
- What can you do to show others you believe in Jesus?

Say: Take your fans home with you to remind you that we **BELIEVE IN JESUS** because he is alive. After he came back to life, he visited his friends to make sure they knew he was alive.

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up the centers, bring everyone back to the circle area on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they remember about what they learned from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives this week. Use this challenge for encouraging your children's growing relationships with Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned that it's good for us to BELIEVE IN JESUS. Choose one of these Daily Challenges to show this week that you believe in Jesus.

Give kids these three challenges to choose from:

- 1. Draw a picture of someone you can tell about Jesus—and then make sure you tell that person.
- 2. Each night before you go to bed, tell Jesus you believe in him.
- 3. Ask your mom or dad to help you take your neighbors a plate of cookies, and then tell your neighbors that you believe in Jesus.

Say: If you want to draw a picture, circle choice number 1. If you want to tell Jesus you believe in him, circle choice number 2. If you want to bring cookies to a neighbor, circle choice number 3. Check that each child circled a choice. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!

What You'll Do

If kids made fans in the "Center 4: Belief Review" activity, have them bring the fans to the prayer time. If not, give each child a piece of construction paper. Show kids how to accordion-fold the paper to make a fan like the one Theo had in the box. Have kids fan themselves while you say the prayer.

Pray: Dear God, thank you for giving us faith to believe in you, even though we don't see you. Go around the circle and have kids each say one thing about Jesus they're thankful for. Thank you, Jesus! We love you so much! In your name, amen.



Paul Teaches About Spiritual Gifts 1 Corinthians 12:4-27

The majority of 5- and 6-year-olds will not be able to tell you what spiritual gifts they've received from God. Some might not even know yet that such gifts come from God. However, children at this age will understand that they do some things well—and those are God-given gifts. Use this lesson to show children that God gives them each special gifts because he loves them and wants them to use their gifts to serve him.

Paul Teaches About Spiritual Gifts

1 Corinthians 12:4-27



Key Points on a Key Passage

Paul begins today's passage with a key point about spiritual gifts (verses 4-7): They are diverse, but they are unified because they come from the same God. There are many different gifts, but the same God is working through all of them. And they all are for a common purpose: the good of the church.

Gifts From God

The question may arise, What is the difference between spiritual gifts and natural talents? The difference between spiritual gifts and natural ability may not have been of concern to Paul. Every good thing, every gift comes from God. What concerned Paul was that people exercise the gifts the Holy Spirit gave them and use them to build up God's church.

Many Gifts, One Body

In verses 12-27, Paul introduces to the Corinthians the concept that the church is like a body, more specifically the body of Christ. Paul's message is a great equalizer: People with gifts that seem insignificant are actually much more important than they may think, and people with gifts that seem more spectacular aren't any more important than anyone else. A significant fact to note is found in verse 18: "God has arranged the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be."

Building God's Kingdom

In a body, if one part is hurting, the other parts feel the hurt. And if one part feels great, it makes all of the body feel better. That's how God wants the church to be! God gives different gifts for the building up of the body of Christ. We're all part of that body, and God wants us to use the gifts he's given us to fill the place

intended for us in his church! That's how we'll be most fulfilled and how we'll work together with other Christians to further God's kingdom on earth.

The Jesus Connection

Your spiritual gifts are God-given opportunities to be like Jesus and build up Jesus' body.

Have you taken time to discover your spiritual gifts? Have you taken time to develop and refine your gifts? Complete a spiritual gifts inventory or ask some Christians who know you well to tell you what spiritual gifts they see in you. Ask God what your gifts might be. You can write your prayer here.

Tip Consistently use the same signal to announce a transition to the next activity. You could flip the lights off and on, use a train whistle, have a puppet rustling inside a bag, or sing cleanup songs. Keep it simple, consistent, and fun.

What You'll Do

As the children arrive, greet each child and welcome him or her with a smile. When it's time to begin, use your signal to bring the children together in a circle. Lead kids in singing "Hurrah!" (track 19 on the CD) to the tune of "When Johnny Comes Marching Home." Encourage kids to join you in singing and doing the motions.

Let's come and sing at church today. Hurrah! Hurrah! (pump fists into the air on "hurrah!")

Let's come and pray at church today. Hurrah! Hurrah! (pump fists into the air on "hurrah!")

The girls will cheer, the boys will shout; (have girls cheer and boys shout) We'll learn what love is all about.

And we'll sing and pray (fold hands in prayer)

With our friends at church.

(Repeat 2x.)

Say: Today we'll learn that God gives special gifts to everyone. Let's use the voices God has given us to tell our friends about how much Jesus loves us!

Lead kids in singing "Jesus Loves Me Rock" (track 6 on the CD). Encourage kids to join you in singing. The first time through, have the girls sing the first phrase and have the boys sing the echo. On the repeat, reverse the parts. Have kids move "freestyle" to the beat.

A Rolling Message

What You'll Do

Have the children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to John 14:26, and show children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from John 14:26 says, "But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." That means that the Holy Spirit will teach you. Let's say our Key Verse together. Lead children in saying the simplified Key Verse aloud with you: The Holy Spirit will teach you (John 14:26).

Say: We can ▶ SERVE GOD by using our gifts. But one gift that God gave to all of us is the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit teaches us all about God. We can learn how God wants us to use our gifts...how to show our love to Jesus...and how to treat each other.

Provide a ball for children to roll as they personalize this verse for one another.

Say: Each of us will roll the ball to someone across from us in the circle and say, "The Holy Spirit will teach you, [child's name]." Take turns around the circle until each child has had a turn to say and hear the verse. Demonstrate rolling the ball to a child.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why is important to listen to what the Holy Spirit teaches us?
- Why is it important to follow what the Holy Spirit teaches us?

Say: When we listen to and follow the Holy Spirit, he helps us SERVE GOD. Let's shout our Key Verse one more time so everyone can hear how we can learn what God wants us to do. Lead children in repeating the simplified Key Verse: The Holy Spirit will teach you (John 14:26).

What You'll Do

Say: Friends, it's time for Theo's News!

Have the children sit in a circle, and begin "Here, Theo" (track 4 on the CD). When the CD segment ends, bring out the Surprise Box, and put Theophilus the FaithRetriever on your hand. Then follow along with the script.

Theo: Hi, everybody!

Teacher: Hello, Theo! Tell us what interesting news you've dug up about the Bible today.

Theo: I hid it in the Surprise Box.

(Invite a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the bag of jelly beans around the circle so the rest of the group can see it up close. Give the children time to guess what they might learn about the Bible.)

Teacher: Theo, why did you hide these jelly beans in the Surprise Box?

Theo: Because they're special. (Give each of the children two to three candies of different flavors.)

Teacher: Thanks for these candies! We're going to learn about how God gives special gifts to each of us. Friends, what do you think it would be like if there was only one flavor of jelly bean?

(Pause for kids to answer your question.)

Teacher: God gives everyone different gifts so we can ▶ **SERVE GOD**, help each other, and encourage each other with our gifts. When God gives us a gift, it's because he loves us.

Theo: I'm so glad that God gives gifts!

Teacher: And using God's gifts, one thing we can do is help others.

Theo: Really?

Teacher: Yes, let's learn about the gifts God gives us.

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls!

Bible Time: Church of Many Colors

What You'll Do

Invite the children to sit with you in four groups of two to four children each. Open your Bible to 1 Corinthians 12, and show the children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Today in the Bible we'll learn that God created us and that he gives special gifts to each person who believes in Jesus. Our Bible Point today is that we can ▶ SERVE GOD. Say it with me: ▶ SERVE GOD.

I have a different package for each of your groups. Hold the bags up for the children to see.

Tell me what you think is the same about all these bags. Pause for the children to respond.

All of these bags look the same on the outside. Now let's open the bags. Have each group of children sit in a circle and pour the pieces in the center.

Ask:

What's the same about the items inside the bags? What's different?

Say: Just like each of your groups has connecting blocks but they are different colors, God gives us all gifts but they are different gifts.

In the Bible, Paul told a group of people called the Corinthians that they all had different gifts. Some people have the gifts of wisdom and knowledge. That means God makes them extra smart. God gives some people the gift of faith. Those people believe God even when everyone else throws their hands up and says, "That's impossible!" But nothing is impossible for God. Have kids point up.

God gives some people the gift of teaching; they like to help others learn new things. God gives these gifts and many more to people who believe in Jesus. We can use our gifts to share God's love with others. And when we do that, we will SERVE GOD.

Take two or three blocks and hold them in your hand. Give kids a moment to hold up their blocks.

Now pretend that each of those blocks is a person who goes to our church, and one of those blocks is you. Each person has a different gift to help others. Have

kids click two blocks together to represent the joyful noise that different people and their gifts make in church.

God gives us different gifts. We can ask God to help us use the gifts he gives us even when we're just young boys and girls. Paul told the Corinthians that we're all part of the family of God when we believe in Jesus. We have special work to do that helps others. That's why God gives us different gifts.

Let's build a church together to help us see how God makes this work. First, pretend one block is you, and set it next to you. Pause for children to do this.

Help your group make a wall with the rest of your blocks, and then bring your wall to me. When the kids bring you their walls, put the walls together to form a square or rectangular building. Then encourage each child to put his or her block on the wall.

This is like our church; look how colorful it is! That's because God gives each of us different gifts. Our church is more colorful and more beautiful because we can all use our own special and unique gifts to ▶ SERVE GOD.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What's good about helping someone?
- What are some things you can do to help others in our church?

Say: You might be able to tell people about a part of the Bible, or smile and help people feel happy that they came to church. God wants us to use the gifts he gives us to serve him. Let's say our Bible Point together. > SERVE GOD.

What You'll Do

Say: God gives us different gifts so we can ▶ SERVE GOD. Our gifts are important to help our church body grow and to help tell others about Jesus' love. You're a gift to our church.

Ask:

- What's something you do well?
- What can you do to use that gift to help someone?

Say: Just as all the presents on your paper are different, God gives us different gifts. These gifts help us ▶ SERVE GOD. If you're good at talking to others, God can use you to tell others about his love. If you're good at smiling and helping others feel happy, God can use you to welcome people to church. And if you like to pray, God can use you to pray for people who are sick. God gives us all different gifts.

Have kids draw pictures of themselves and others in the white spaces on the presents. Then have them decorate the bows with glitter glue.

CENTER 2:

Center 2: What's My Gift?

What You'll Do

Have kids clean their hands.

Say: God gives us different gifts so we can ▶ SERVE GOD.

Give children each a napkin and equal amounts of jelly beans.

Say: We learned today that God gives us different gifts. Let's pretend that the jelly beans are the special gifts God has given you.

Encourage kids to hide their jelly beans in the napkin by folding the napkin over the jelly beans or wrapping the napkin around the jelly beans.

Say: Each person who believes in Jesus has a different gift from God hidden inside his or her heart. God can help you use your gift to serve others.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are some gifts God has given to people in your family?
- How does your family serve God with those gifts?

Choose a child to pray, and then let children enjoy their snack.

CENTER 3:

What's Your Part?

What You'll Do

Say: The Bible says that our church is like a body. We're going to pretend that we're important parts of the body. The Bible tells us that each of our gifts is very important, just as each part of the body is important to the whole body. A face can't see if it doesn't have eyes. Put your hands on your face, and have kids each put their hands on their faces.

Say: Legs can't stand up if they don't have feet at the end to walk on, knees in the middle to bend with, or hips at the top to move with. Stretch out one leg and bend it, and have kids safely kick their legs and bend their knees.

Say: The Bible tells us that each of us has special gifts and talents that can be used to help others in the body of Christ. I'm going to call out the name of body parts to understand how a body connects together. When you hear a body part, such as ear, nose, hand, or whatever, quickly put your hand on that body part.

Begin calling out names of two to four body parts at a time. When all the children are frantically trying to touch two different body parts at a time, have them say the Bible Point. Then have children return to their starting positions to begin the game again.

Talk With Kids

Afterward, lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was this game like for you?
- Why are all our body parts important?
- Why are all God's gifts important?

Say: We can use our gifts to ▶ SERVE GOD.



CENTER 4:

Colorful People

What You'll Do

Set out the assorted pieces of construction paper and glue. Have the paper people in your hand and ready to give to the children.

Say: Today we learned that we each have special gifts and that all of us together make up the body of Christ. Distribute the paper people to the children.

Ask:

What gifts does our pastor have? your teachers? your friends?

Say: All the people in churches around the world make up the body of Christ. Let's pretend that each of these little colored pieces of paper is a person who knows God and has a gift from God to help others. Show the children the back of their cutout people with their names and the Bible Point written on them. Read the Bible Point to the children: **SERVE GOD.** Have them repeat the Bible Point after you.

Let kids glue the colored pieces of paper onto the paper people. Set the Colorful People aside to dry until the children are ready to go home.

Talk With Kids

Afterward, lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What do you think is one of the special gifts God has given you?
- What can you do to help serve God right now?

Say: Just as each of these "people" has different colors of different shapes and sizes, each person in our church has a different gift. But all of our gifts fit together to form the body of Christ, and this body can ▶ SERVE GOD.



Peter Tells the Sanhedrin About Jesus Acts 4:5-14

ome 5- and 6-year-olds tend to feel little and intimidated when outside their world of family and friends. They feel intimidated by new and uncertain situations—a new Sunday school, a new baby sitter, playing big-kid sports such as soccer or T-ball. Children need to know that God is a source for constant courage. Use this lesson to help children realize that just as God helped Peter be brave and tell others about Jesus, God helps us be brave in all we do, too.



Peter Tells the Sanhedrin About Jesus

Acts 4:5-14



Earthly Power

The Sanhedrin was the ruling body of the Jews. It had authority in all religious matters. One of the Sanhedrin's duties was to deal with cases of blasphemy. Members of the Sanhedrin probably viewed Peter's and John's actions as blasphemy. Peter and John claimed that they were able to heal a man—something only God could do—through the power of Jesus. So they called Peter and John before them.

Heavenly Power

When asked the source of his power to heal, Peter replied that the power came from Jesus, whom God had raised from the dead. The Sanhedrin had tried to cover up the Resurrection (Matthew 28:11-15), but Peter contended that the healed man standing before them proved that Jesus is alive.

The disabled man was healed through Jesus' power, and Peter's forceful speech before this powerful group of religious leaders was made possible by the power of the Holy Spirit (Acts 4:8). God was with Peter in a special way, as Jesus had promised he would be when people were going about his work (Matthew 28:20).

Powerful Truth

Why didn't the Sanhedrin immediately denounce Peter and John? Perhaps the truth, told with such power, dumbfounded them—or even convinced them of what they really had done.

In verse 12, Peter indirectly heaps on more accusation. By saying that salvation is only through Jesus, Peter was saying the leaders' beliefs and actions were insufficient for that purpose. He was saying that if they continued to deny Jesus, no other power was available to save them. If they continued

along this course, they were also leading their nation toward destruction.

What was the Sanhedrin's response? Astonishment! How could these simple men, with no training in the Jewish rabbinical schools, mount such a clear and convincing biblical and theological argument? They may have remembered the similar things they had thought about Jesus (John 7:15). Jesus had supported his claims through the miracles he had performed, and now the disciples had done the same. Everyone had seen the disabled man begging at the Temple, and now he stood before them, healed. What could they say? The Sanhedrin had no answer.

The Jesus Connection

Two things gave Peter courage in this intimidating situation. First, he was relying on the Holy Spirit, and second, he knew that Jesus is alive. This knowledge gave Peter full and ultimate trust in Jesus.

We have the same Holy Spirit that empowered Peter. What more do we need to be courageous in the situations we face today? Ask God to help you with a particular situation you're facing. You can write your prayer here.



Learn to Be a Learner

What You'll Do

Have children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to John 14:26, and show children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, John 14:26, says, "But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you" (John 14:26). That means that the Holy Spirit will teach you. Let's say our Key Verse together. Theo: They do?

Teacher: Yes, people may get trophies if they win a race or play a musical instrument in

Teacher: Today we're going to read about how Peter and John had courage. They deserved a trophy for being brave! Let's find out how ▶ **GOD HELPS US BE BRAVE!**

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls! **Teacher:** Say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Bible Time: Brave Belief

What You'll Do

Have children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to Acts 4, and show children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Two of Jesus' followers, Peter and John, bravely told people that Jesus had died and then came back to life! Peter and John even healed people. One poor man couldn't walk since he was born. Peter told the man, "In the name of Jesus, walk!" And the man did!

Have kids form pairs. Have one partner stand and be Peter, and have the other partner sit and be the crippled man.

Say: Peter told the crippled man, "In the name of Jesus, walk!" Have Peters say that and then help the partner up to walk a few steps together.

Say: The healed man was so happy, he jumped up and down with joy! Have everyone jump up and down. He also followed Peter and John as they bravely continued to tell people about Jesus.

Some rulers and important people weren't happy about Peter and John telling people about Jesus, so they threw them in jail. Have kids act as if they're holding jail cell bars and looking between them.

The next day, Peter and John were brought before the rulers and important people. Have the kids stand quietly with their arms at their sides.

The rulers wanted to know why Peter and John performed miracles and spread the name of Jesus to everyone. They asked, "By what name did you do this?" Have kids raise a fist in the air and repeat the question.

Then the Holy Spirit helped Peter to be brave. Peter told the leaders that it was by the name of Jesus that the crippled man (have kids sit down) was healed! Have kids jump up. Peter told the leaders that they had crucified Jesus on a cross, but God

raised him from the dead. No other name - except Jesus - will save us. Have kids say, "Only Jesus saves us."

When the people saw Peter and John's courage, they were amazed. Have kids look amazed and surprised and then sit back down. Peter and John were ordinary people - just like you and me. But the people realized Peter and John had been with Jesus.

Say: Let's pretend we're with Peter and John, and let's take turns saying what we believe about Jesus. Remember, ► GOD HELPS US BE BRAVE!

Invite kids, one at a time, to stand in front of the group and tell what they believe, such as "We'll live forever because of Jesus."

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What do you think about how God helped Peter and John be brave?
- Tell about a time God helped you be brave.

Say: God helped Peter and John be brave, and ▶ GOD HELPS US BE BRAVE, too. God wants everyone to know about Jesus, because he wants everyone to live with him forever.



4 WEAVING FAITH

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Teach kids the poem that follows. Then encourage them to hold their pages to their faces as masks, and have each child repeat the poem through the open mouth on the page. Each time children say "scared" or "shiver and shake," have them rattle their pages in fear. On "brave," have them hold their pages still.

Even though Peter might have been scared, Still he dared To be brave for Jesus! Even though I may shiver and shake, Lord, please make Me brave for Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What does it mean to be brave?
- What can we do to be brave like Peter was?

Say: God helped Peter be brave, and ▶ GOD HELPS US BE BRAVE, too. We need to be like Peter and tell everyone about Jesus!

Have kids tell one another the Bible Point as they speak through their masks.

CENTER 2:

Shakin' Snack

What You'll Do

Say: We're going to shake our fears away! Are you ready? Let's go!

Have children clean their hands; then let them each combine cereal, raisins, and M&M's in a bowl. Help kids cover their bowls tightly with aluminum foil.

Say: Tell us something you're afraid of, something that makes you "shake" with fear. Have kids shake their bowls while they tell you.

When the snack has been mixed, pray, and let kids eat it while you ask these questions.

Speak Out

Tip Most smartphones have a "Voice Memos" app that lets you record right into the phone and then play it back.

What You'll Do

Say: Peter was brave when he told people about Jesus!

Let each child have a turn recording something he or she believes about Jesus, such as "Jesus is God's Son" or "Jesus loves everyone." After everyone has recorded a belief, have kids sing this song and record it as well. When they've finished, play back the messages.

Sing "God Helps Us" (track 21 on the CD) to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell."

God helps us to be brave. God helps us to be brave. Hey, ho, we all should know, God helps us to be brave. (Repeat 2x.)

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was recording this song like for you?
- What are things you do at church that may scare you?

CENTER 4:

Fold Away Fear

What You'll Do

Say: We're going to fold away our fears by making two "doors."

Give each child one of the papers. Have them follow your instructions to make two "doors" that meet in the center of the paper.

Say: Fold the paper on the two dotted lines, so that the two sides meet in the center of the paper. Allow time.

Say: While everyone is afraid of something, God can help all of us be brave no matter what we face.

Have kids close the "doors" on their papers and draw something they're afraid of on the outside. As kids finish this drawing, say: **Open the "doors" and draw a picture on the inside of yourself being brave!**

Read the words on the page to children, and have kids each add their name in the space provided. Assist any children who need help with writing.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why is it important to be brave?
- Tell about a time God helped you be brave.

Say: Everyone has fears. Some people are afraid of the dark, some are afraid of bees, and some are afraid to meet new people. Whenever we feel afraid, we can ask for God's help. No matter what happens, we can remember that ▶ GOD HELPS US BE BRAVE.






Philip Tells the Ethiopian About Jesus Acts 8:26-40

ost 5- and 6-year-olds are learning to respond quickly when asked to do something. However, kids often respond faster to "Come in for ice cream" than "It's time to clean up!" It's difficult for children this age to listen because they're still learning how to prioritize what's being asked of them with what they want to do. Use this lesson to help children listen to God and follow the direction of the Holy Spirit—as Philip did in the Bible.



Philip Tells the Ethiopian About Jesus

Acts 8:26-40



Philip Obeyed God's Leading

According to Acts 8:4-8, Philip was preaching Christ, healing people, and bringing great joy to a Samaritan city. But God had another plan for Philip, which included guiding the first non-Jewish convert to faith in Jesus and God's plan resulted in Christianity being taken to Ethiopia. Philip responded in obedience.

Since the Ethiopian eunuch had gone to Jerusalem to worship, we can assume he knew something of the Jewish faith. He may have been fully committed to the faith because he had traveled quite a distance to worship, perhaps as far as 200 miles! He had likely been inspired by his time of worship, because he was reading from Isaiah as he rode along. We might find it strange that Philip could hear what he was reading, but it was common in ancient times to read aloud. In fact, the language was such that sounding out the words was almost necessary.

Philip Was Prepared for Questions

At the Holy Spirit's prompting, Philip overcame not only any fears or questions about non-Jews becoming Christians, but also any racial prejudice he may have had. The Ethiopian was a native of what is now northern Sudan and was black-skinned. God is not concerned with the color of our skin, and neither was Philip.

Philip had no difficulty answering the Ethiopian's questions. He had probably been answering the same types of questions from the Samaritans. God had prepared the right person to present the gospel to the Ethiopian on the road.

When Philip told the man about Jesus, the Ethiopian apparently expressed belief immediately. Baptism was taken very seriously in the early church. Philip must have been fully convinced of the certainty

and sincerity of the Ethiopian's belief, because he consented to baptize this traveler.

The Jesus Connection

Having completed his task, Philip was again sent on his way by God. The text seems to indicate that God miraculously swept him away, on to his next mission. The Ethiopian continued on his way, and tradition tells us that he spread the message of Christ in Ethiopia, soon baptizing the queen and others there.

We often don't know why God guides us to do certain things. But when we know what God wants us to do, we must respond in faith and action. Who knows what God will do through us if we respond faithfully to the guidance of his Holy Spirit?

What You'll Do

Have the children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to John 14:26, and show children the words.

Theo: Have fun, boys and girls! **Teacher:** Say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Bible Time: Philip Listens

What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Open your Bible to Acts 8, and show children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us to be brave and that we can ► LISTEN TO GOD. Let's listen to the Bible to hear how Philip listened to God and obeyed him. While we listen, we'll hear a beat and then be asked to repeat it back by hitting spoons together. Let's try it once.

Hand out two spoons to each child. Beat a simple rhythm, such as clap, clap, clap-clap-clap. Have kids repeat back the rhythm by hitting their spoons together.

Play "Philip Listens to God" (track 22 on the CD) and pause the CD when directed. Afterward, collect the spoons.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

What You'll Do

Say: God has very important things to tell us, and he wants to make sure we hear each and every word. We can be eager to listen to God. That means we can be excited and ready to listen and learn all that we can about our wonderful God.

Have kids clean their hands. Give each child a paper plate. Place 3 apples slices and a handful of raisins on each of their plates.

Say: Why do you think God gave us eyes? noses? mouths? ears?

Encourage kids to put the two apple slices on each side of their plates to look like ears and one at the bottom center of their plates to look like a mouth. Then have kids use the raisins to give their faces eyes and noses.



Ask:

When are times you can use your ears to listen to God?

Say: When we listen to songs about God, we use our ears to hear of the wonderful things he has done. Listening to the Bible helps us hear of God's love and the good plans he has for us.

Let's thank God for our snack and for giving us eager ears to listen to him.

Before the children eat their Eager Ears, lead kids in a prayer of thanks to God for their snack.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What makes you happy and want to smile?
- What can you do to listen to and obey God this week?

Say: God uses our parents, teachers, and others to show how much he loves and cares for us. Listening to what they tell us about God is always a good way to use our ears. Cup one of your hands over your ear and gesture like you're listening to kids. Have kids cup their ears like they're listening, too.

CENTER 3:

I Hear Something!

What You'll Do

Have kids close their eyes and not open them until you say so. Go around to different parts of the room and clap your hands. Encourage kids to listen and go to where they think the sound is coming from. You also could give kids the opportunity to be the person making the noise. Encourage children to move slowly for safety.

Talk With Kids

Afterward, lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did you have to do to listen in this game?
- What did Philip have to do to listen in the Bible?
- What gets in the way of us listening to God today?

Say: That was fun listening in this game! We can be like Philip and listen to God. Let's remember to always ► LISTEN TO GOD and obey him!

CENTER 4:

Ear Exercises

What You'll Do

Say: Philip was a good listener. He was ready to do what God told him to do. Philip didn't just talk to God; he listened to God, too. We're going to exercise our ears so we can learn to listen, too. And we'll make some wonderful sounds at the same time.

Give kids each a plastic egg or plastic container. Let kids fill the container with paper clips. Have kids form a circle and hold their shakers.

Say: **Everyone give your shaker a good shake.** Let kids make some noise with their shakers.

Say: Now we're going to go around the circle and listen to each other shake the shaker and say the Bible Point: LISTEN TO GOD. Allow time.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did you like about this game?
- What do you like about listening to God?

Say: It's fun to listen to God. We may not be used to listening to God, but we can learn to listen carefully like Philip did. You can take your shaker home and use it to tell your parents about what we learned from the Bible today, and how we can LISTEN TO GOD.

Ask:

Say: God wants us to listen to him when we pray—not just talk. And God will talk to us like he talked to Philip. Let's listen to God now.



Peter Visits Cornelius

Acts 10:1-44



Meet Cornelius

This passage begins at the home of Cornelius, a Roman centurion in Caesarea, the headquarters for the Roman occupation of that area. As a centurion, Cornelius would have been in charge of a unit of about 100 men, and he was considered a man of noble character.

For a non-Jew to have been considered God-fearing meant that Cornelius followed the Jewish religion to some degree, possibly to the greatest extent he could as a non-Jew. His vision of the angel at about three in the afternoon likely means that he was following Jewish religious practices since that was a regular time of prayer for the Jews. And it is to Cornelius' credit that when an angel of God spoke to him, he didn't hesitate to do what he was told.

God Speaks: A Tale of Two Visions

Peter was following normal Jewish religious practices, among which was the strict adherence to the dietary restrictions spelled out in Leviticus 11. Many of the forbidden animals described there were included in the sheet suspended before Peter in his vision. Being told to kill and eat "unclean" animals shocked Peter.

The challenge to Peter's beliefs didn't end when the sheet disappeared. It was obviously no coincidence that Cornelius' servants appeared just as Peter's vision ended. Peter was thinking through the meaning of his vision when he was summoned to go to the house of a non-Jew. The servants said that an angel had told Cornelius to send for Peter to hear what he had to say.

And God made it clear to Peter that the servants' arrival was connected to what God was trying to teach him. God told him that the men were there, that he had sent them, and that Peter was to go with them.

Peter knew that the vision concerned much more than food.

The Jesus Connection

Peter took a huge risk in following God's leading to reach out to Cornelius and his family. Peter followed God's leading without hesitation because Jesus was the cornerstone of his life.

Peter set an example for us by taking advantage of an opportunity to tell someone unexpected about his faith. We dare not ignore that example; rather, we must be willing to tell anyone who is interested about what God has done for us through Jesus. Pray and ask God to show you how you can share your faith and God's love. You can write your prayer here.

- What do you picture when I say the words *Holy Spirit*?
- What would you like the Holy Spirit to teach you?

Say: One thing the Holy Spirit teaches us is that we can ► TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS. Let's learn a way to tell others that Jesus is for everyone. Today I'm going to show you how to use sign language to say, "Jesus loves you and me." Sign "Jesus loves you and me" (see below).

Say: Sign language is a way to say words with our hands instead of our voices. Watch carefully, and follow along with your hands.

To sign the word *Jesus*, indicate the marks of the nails on Jesus' hands by using the left middle finger to touch the right palm and then using the right middle finger to touch the left palm. Show kids the sign for *love* by crossing closed or flat hands over your heart

with palms facing in. For the words *you* and *me*, simply point to someone else and then to yourself. If some of the children already know sign language, invite them to help teach the others.

Say: **Jesus loves you and me.** Have kids each sign "Jesus loves you and me" with their hands.

What's important about telling other people that Jesus loves you and me?

Say: It's always fun to learn something new, especially when you have a teacher to help you learn. Say: So Cornelius sent some men to Peter. Peter was praying on the roof of a house. Maybe he went there because it was quiet there and he felt closer to God. Have kids close their eyes as if praying. Tell them to keep their eyes closed until you tell them to open them.

Say: While he prayed, Peter saw something amazing. For coming down, down, down out of heaven was a sheet full of wiggly animals. Place the towel full of animals on the floor; then have kids open their eyes.

God told Peter that it was okay to like animals that he wasn't used to and to love people he wasn't used to. Peter heard God's voice three times; then the sheet was taken back to heaven. Have kids hold the edge of the towel and bounce it up and down three times. Then have kids on each side slowly walk their edges into the center. Gather the edges of the towel so all the animals are inside, and then place it out of sight.

Say: Peter finally got it! Peter hurried with the servants to Cornelius' home and told him what he saw. He said that it doesn't matter what we eat, where we live, or what we look like. We can TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS! Show kids the "Peter Visits Cornelius" poster. Encourage kids to each draw a smiley face on the poster and say the Bible Point aloud: TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS.

Say: ► TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS. It doesn't matter where we live or what we eat. Spread the news!

Have each child unroll the leather so it looks like the sheet in the Bible passage. Then let kids fill each of their "sheets" with all kinds of animals. Ask someone to pray, and then let the kids enjoy their snacks.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are some things God has created in the world that you like to eat?
- What's important about thanking God for the things we eat?

Say: God wants us to TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS. The more people who know about him, the more people who can live with him forever in heaven!

CENTER 3:

Shape Up!

What You'll Do

Set out a handful of modeling dough for each child.

Say: Peter sure saw all kinds of animals. He probably saw animals like goats and pigs and donkeys. He also saw reptiles and birds.

Encourage children to use the dough to make figures from the Bible passage, making as many figures as they want. They can make Cornelius, Peter, and the animals. Let them use the dough shapes to retell what they've heard. Children can use the bandanna as the sheet from the vision.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did Peter learn in his dream?
- What can we do to tell others that Jesus loves you and me?

- In what other ways are you the same as other people? What's different about you?

Say: The one thing that's the same for each of us is God's love. Not one person is left out of God's love. His arms reach out and hug everyone. So we can ► TELL EVERYONE ABOUT JESUS, because God sent Jesus to earth for everyone.

Barnabas Encourages Christians in Antioch Acts 11:19-26

Your 5- and 6-year-olds are often asked to help out with easy concrete tasks like cleaning up toys or passing out snacks. Though these opportunities to help may seem small to adults, they're very meaningful to young children. Helping someone complete a task validates a child's abilities and boosts self-esteem as the child recognizes that he or she has made a significant contribution. Use this lesson to point kids in a new direction: helping others spiritually. Though spiritual help isn't always concrete, it's something kids this age can do—and the impact is eternal. Help kids see throughout this lesson that they can help others love Jesus.



Barnabas Encourages Christians in Antioch

Acts 11:19-26

BIBLE BACKGROUND

Reason to Praise

In the chapters leading up to today's passage, God revealed to Peter that the message of Christ is not only for Jews but for non-Jews as well. Peter then took that message to the household of Cornelius, a Roman centurion, and God poured out the Holy Spirit on these non-Jews who then came to faith in Christ. The Jerusalem church had a hard time accepting that non-Jews could become believers in Christ, but after Peter explained everything that had happened, they praised God that he had granted even the Gentiles eternal life through Jesus (Acts 10:1–11:18).

Reason to Scatter

In today's passage, we see that the early followers of Christ had been scattered from Jerusalem because of the persecution that began after Stephen was killed. The Jews had stoned him after he accused them of killing the Messiah, Jesus. But everywhere the scattered followers went, they told people about Jesus (Acts 7:1–8:4).

Spreading the News

The believers who were scattered to Antioch, at that time the third largest city in the Roman Empire, began sharing the message of Christ not only with the many Jews who lived there, but also with the non-Jews. When Jerusalem's church heard that a great number of people had turned to the Lord, they were ready to accept these non-Jewish believers, and they sent Barnabas (whose name means "Son of Encouragement") to see what was happening and to contribute to the spreading of the gospel message.

Barnabas invited Saul (whom we know as the Apostle Paul) to Antioch for a year to help teach because the church was expanding so quickly. Barnabas had befriended Saul and defended him before the apostles

in Jerusalem after Saul had met Christ on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-30).

What happened in Antioch was significant because it was, apparently, the first time Jewish and non-Jewish Christians joined together in fellowship. People there were accustomed to rubbing shoulders with people of different backgrounds and of different ethnic groups. The church in Antioch set a wonderful example for churches to follow in centuries to come.

The Jesus Connection

As the text tells us, Jesus' followers were first called Christians in Antioch. It's significant that in Antioch this diverse group of followers took on a name that means "like Christ." As they lived out Jesus' example and encouraged others in the faith, people noticed. What a compliment it would be for others to consider us to be like Jesus!

Say: Today we'll learn about a man named Barnabas and how he helped other Christians feel happy and believe in Jesus. Let's sing a song about how we can HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS.

Lead kids in singing "Jesus Loves Me Rock" (track 6 on the CD) Encourage kids to join you in singing. The first time through, have girls sing the phrase and boys sing the echo. On the repeat, reverse the parts. Have kids move "freestyle" to the beat.

Super-Special Messages

What You'll Do

Have everyone sit in a circle. Open your Bible to John 14:26, and show children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, John 14:26, says, "But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you" (John 14:26). That means that the Holy Spirit will teach you. Let's say our Key Verse together. Lead children in repeating the simplified Key Verse after you: The Holy Spirit will teach you (John 14:26).

Ask:

What's easy or difficult about learning something new?

Say: The Holy Spirit can teach us by giving us special messages to share with others. In the Bible, we'll hear about how the Holy Spirit gave a man named Barnabas special messages to share. Let's play a game where we share special messages.

Enlist the aid of an adult helper for this activity.



Have half of the kids line up on one side of the room and the other half line up on the other side. Stand on one side with one group of kids, and have your adult helper stand on the other side with the other group.

Say: We're going to run a "Super-Special Message Delivery Race"! I'll begin by whispering a special message in the ear of the first person in line on my side.

The special messages should be simple, encouraging statements such as "Jesus loves you," "You are special to God," "The Holy Spirit is always with you," or "Believe in Jesus."

Have the child who was whispered to race across the room to the first person in line on the other side and say the message to that child.

Have the adult helper on that side of the room whisper a special message into the ear of the first person in line, who will then run to your side to deliver the message to the second person.

Have kids continue running back and forth, racing to deliver their super-special secret messages. Give this message to the last runner: **The Holy Spirit will teach you (John 14:26).**

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Why is it important to tell our friends about Jesus?
- What are some ways we can tell our friends about Jesus?

Say: Good job delivering messages! The Holy Spirit has messages for you that will HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS. The Holy Spirit will give you special messages to share with people. The Holy Spirit will give you ideas of nice things to say, kind things to do, or special things to pray for other people. This is a way that the Holy Spirit will teach you. Let's say that special message again one more time. Lead children in saying the simplified Key Verse with you: The Holy Spirit will teach you (John 14:26).

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe

Open your Bible to Acts 11, and show the children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells us about some people in a town called Antioch. Some of them believed in Jesus, but they wanted to learn more about him.

Invite a child from the group to be Barnabas, and have him or her stand by the door.

Have the child playing Barnabas knock loudly on the door, and then run over to the rest of the kids.

Say: Hi, Barnabas! Have kids wave to "Barnabas."

Help kids form two equal groups, and have the two groups stand a few feet apart from each other.

Say: Barnabas encouraged the Christians in Antioch—he helped them feel happy and learn about Jesus.

Give the child playing Barnabas the envelope full of paper hearts. Have Barnabas pass out the hearts to one of the groups of children.

Say: Barnabas helped the Christians in Antioch love Jesus with their whole hearts.

Ask:

■ What are some ways we can help others love Jesus with their whole hearts the way Barnabas did?

Show children the "Saul and Barnabas Encourage Christians" poster. Encourage the group of kids with the hearts to come to the poster and each glue a heart to the poster to remind them that Jesus wants us to love him with our whole heart.

Say: Jesus wants us to love him with our whole heart and ► HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS!

Point to the other group of kids.

Say: There were also people in Antioch who didn't know about Jesus and didn't have a friendship with him.

Give Barnabas the envelope filled with paper crosses. Have Barnabas give one of the crosses to each child in the second group. Have these kids come to the poster and each glue a cross to the poster to remind them that we can **HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS**, just like Barnabas did!

Say: Barnabas told everyone about Jesus. He told them that Jesus loved them and wanted to be their friend. He helped them believe in Jesus. Barnabas made the people in Antioch feel very happy.

Have groups smile, cheer, and clap to celebrate as they say: Let's ► HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS!



Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What can you do to help others feel happy the way Barnabas did?
- What can you do to help others love Jesus the way Barnabas did?

Say: Today we're going to learn about many ways that we can be like Barnabas and HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS.



CENTER 2:

Let-Me-Help Snack

What You'll Do

Have children clean their hands and form pairs. Set out the supplies.

Say: Barnabas helped other people believe in Jesus. Right now you're going to be like Barnabas and help each other. You're going to help your partner make a snack that tells about Jesus.

Demonstrate how to make a snack by spreading cream cheese on a large graham cracker and then making a cross on the graham cracker using raisins.

Say: It's important to learn how to help each other, so your job is to take turns helping each other make your snack.

Have kids help their partners spread cream cheese on their graham crackers or help them make raisin crosses.

Ask:

What did you do to help your partner?

Say: Congratulations on doing such a great job helping each other! Lead kids in a prayer of thanks to God, and let them eat their snacks.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was special about the way your partner helped you make your snack?
- Barnabas helped the people in Antioch believe in Jesus. What can you do to help other people believe in Jesus?

Say: There are lots of ways we can HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS. We can be



friendly and nice. We can give hugs and share toys. We can tell each other about Jesus' love. We can pray for each other. Let's try to be like Barnabas this week and help each other believe in Jesus!

CENTER 3:

Help Me Remember!

What You'll Do

Say: We're going to play a game, but you'll need to be patient and wait your turn.

Mix up the "Matching Cards," and spread them out facedown on the floor.

Say: There are pictures on these cards that match! Your job is to try to find the pairs by helping each other match the different pictures.

Have children go to the "game board" one at a time and select two cards to turn over. If they do not select a matching pair, they will simply show everyone the two cards they turned over, and then put them back in the same place on the floor, facedown. The next child will then take a turn as the rest of the group helps each player remember where the different pictures are.

If a match is found, take the paired cards off the game board and set them to the side face up. Let another child take the next turn. Continue in this manner until all four pairs are selected.

If you're able, shuffle the cards and repeat the game again; kids will enjoy the sense of accomplishment they feel as they get better and better at working together to remember where the cards are placed.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did you do to help each other?
- What are some other ways to help love others?

Say: God used Barnabas to help the people in Antioch believe in Jesus. And God can use you to help your friends and family members believe in Jesus and become better friends with him! We can ► HELP OTHERS LOVE JESUS!

Hold up a heart drawing.

Ask:

What ideas does this heart give us for how to help others love Jesus?

Hold up a drawing of a Bible.

Ask:

What can the Bible tell us about how to help people love Jesus?

Hold up a drawing of a church.

Ask:

■ What does a church tell us about how to help others love Jesus?

Say: There are so many ways we can help people believe in and love Jesus! The four drawings you made are on special paper—you just created stickers! You can



help people love Jesus by sharing your stickers! You can give them to a friend or family member, you can wear one on your shirt, or you can stick them in places where others will see them and learn about Jesus.

Help kids use child-safe scissors to cut the stickers apart.

Say: If you want to pray for a friend, circle choice number 1. If you want to hug a family member, circle choice number 2. If you want to draw a picture, circle choice number 3. Check that each child circled a choice. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!

Help-Me-to-Help Prayer

What You'll Do

Have the group stand in a circle. Encourage kids to ask God to show them a way to help another person learn about Jesus. Then lead the group in this eyes-open prayer by having them repeat each line and action after you.

ive- and six-year-olds learn in concrete ways and need hands-on opportunities to grasp the basic truth about the Holy Spirit. At this age, kids need to be shown that ice, water, and steam are all forms of water, but appear differently. Similarly, kids need to be shown how God is the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Use this lesson to help kids understand that God gave us the Holy Spirit to teach us, guide us, and give us the power to tell all people about God's love.



Jesus Sends Power From God

Acts 2:1-21



Passover

Fifty days after the Passover celebration, the Jews celebrated the Feast of Weeks, otherwise known as Pentecost. Jerusalem was crowded with Jews from many surrounding areas who had gathered in the holy city for the feast. Many spoke languages other than the Aramaic and Greek that were most common in Palestine at that time. God set the stage for a miraculous display of his power through the Holy Spirit.

We could take a long time discussing the sound, the tongues of fire, and who was present for all this as described in Acts 2:1-3, but what's important to glean from this passage is that the Holy Spirit came upon Christians in a new and powerful way, enabling them to better spread the good news about Jesus. They were filled with God's Holy Spirit.

Speaking in Other Tongues?

We could also take a long time explaining the term "speak in other tongues" (Acts 2:4), but instead we'll simply examine the event described in this passage. The disciples were able to speak so that people from many different nations could hear them in their respective languages. Speaking in a language that the speaker had never learned does not necessarily mean that what is spoken is a message from God. In this passage, however, we're given the evidence to verify God as the source of the message: The disciples were "declaring the wonders of God."

Peter: A Changed Man

Notice who takes the lead in verse 14 and the powerful message he gives. Could this be the same Peter who, only seven weeks earlier, had three times denied even knowing Jesus? The same Peter who had hidden with the other disciples behind locked

doors for fear? Indeed it is. Peter's experience with the risen Christ and his being filled with the Holy Spirit made Peter a new person.

The Jesus Connection

Peter had no delusions about the source of the power. God sent the Holy Spirit to empower his people to further his kingdom. Jesus had told his followers before he ascended to heaven that they were to wait in Jerusalem for the Holy Spirit to come upon them. They needed the power of the Holy Spirit to spread the good news.

When God has something big for us to do, he'll empower us to do it. And God may use us in remarkable ways if we're willing to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit. Pray and ask God how he wants to use your life for his glory. Trust him to empower you to accomplish his plans. You can write your prayer here.

With our friends at church.



Say: Today we'll learn that ► GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT. Let's sing "Jesus Loves Me Rock" in our most powerful, loud, and happy voices to show how powerful Jesus can help us be!

Lead kids in singing "Jesus Loves Me Rock" (track 6 on the CD). Encourage kids to join you in singing. The first time through, have the girls sing the first phrase and have the boys sing the echo. On the repeat, reverse the parts. Have kids move "freestyle" to the beat.

Teach Me!

What You'll Do

Have children sit in a circle. Open your Bible to John 14:26, and show children the words.

Say: Our Key Verse from the Bible, John 14:26, says, "But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you" (John 14:26). That means that the Holy Spirit will teach us. Let's say our Key Verse together. Lead children in repeating the simplified version of the Key Verse after you: The Holy Spirit will teach you (John 14:26).

Go around the circle and say the Key Verse followed by each child's name.

Ask:

Who are people at church who teach you? at home? at school?

Say: Parents or grandparents may teach you to wash your hands, tie your shoes, and love your brothers and sisters. Pastors and teachers help you learn about Jesus and how much God loves you. Today we're learning about how God sent a

powerful teacher—the Holy Spirit! Our Key Verse from the Bible says "The Holy Spirit will teach you" (John 14:26).

Give each child a Trinity Triangle. Hold up a triangle.

Say: God has three sides. Show kids the blue side of the triangle.

God is the Father who created everything. Have kids name some things that God created. Then have kids each point their finger at the blue side. Then point to the yellow side.

Say: **God is the Son—Jesus, who saves us.** Have kids name other ways Jesus shows he loves us. Then have kids each point their finger at the yellow side. Then point to the red side.

Say: **God is the Holy Spirit who teaches us.** Have kids name ways the Holy Spirit teaches us. Then have kids each point their finger at the red side. Show kids the three sides of the triangle.

Say: All three—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—are God. Just like one triangle is made from three sides.

God loves us so much that he sent Jesus. And Jesus came to earth to save us. Then when Jesus went to heaven, he sent the Holy Spirit to teach us.

What You'll Do

Say: Friends, it's time for Theo's News!

Have the children sit in a circle. Then begin "Here, Theo" (track 4 on the CD). When the CD segment ends, bring out the Surprise Box, and put the Theophilus the FaithRetriever puppet on your hand. Then follow along with the script.

Theo: Hi, everybody!

Teacher: Hello, Theo! Tell us what interesting news you've dug up about the Bible today.

Theo: I hid it in the Surprise Box.

Teacher: Let's look inside to see what Theo dug up for us today.

(Invite a child to open the Surprise Box, and have the kids pass the fan around the circle so the rest of the group can see it up close. Give the children time to guess what they might learn about the Bible.)

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe

place for next week's use.

Bible Time: The Holy Spirit

What You'll Do

Distribute the student pages, and have kids write their names on their papers. Open your Bible to Acts 2, and show children the words. Tell kids that the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Today in the Bible we're going to learn that ► GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT.

First we're going to make puppets, and then we'll pretend we're in the room with Jesus' friends.

Have kids follow these instructions to make puppets:

- Design your page to look like you—same color of eyes, hair, and clothes.
- Fold the page and staple the side and top together to form a puppet.
- Leave the bottom open to slide your hand into your puppet.

Have kids sit in a circle and hold up their completed puppets so everyone can see them, but tell them not to put them on their hands yet.

Say: Look at all of us in one place! In the Bible, Jesus' friends heard a sound like the blowing of a strong wind. It came from heaven and filled the whole house!

Walk around to the kids and wave the paper fan gently so they can feel the air on their faces. Play "Windy Day" (track 20 on the CD), and dim the lights.

Say: Then the people saw what looked like a flame of fire that rested on each one of them! Shine the flashlight on each child's head.

Bible Time: The Holy Spirit Easy Prep

Say: The fire didn't hurt them or burn them. All the people were filled with the Holy Spirit! Have kids slide their hands into their puppets.

Say: Just like your hand is filling your puppet, the Holy Spirit filled Jesus' friends and taught them to do something amazing—they began to speak in other languages! Tell one child to say "hola" while moving his or her puppet. Then have another child say "bonjour" and move the puppet and another child say "hello."

Say: *Hola* is **Spanish** and *bonjour* is **French** for the **English** word *hello*. Go around the circle and have each child say one of the words.

On the count of three, have kids shout their words again and again while they move their puppets. Tell them to keep going until you motion for them to stop.

After about 30 seconds, stop the kids and say: When people heard this sound, they crowded around those people who believed in Jesus! The crowd heard many languages! The crowd asked, "How do these people know how to speak all these languages?" Have kids repeat the question.

They were so surprised. Some people, however, thought the new Christians were just being silly. Peter stood up with the new Christians so he could talk to the crowd. Have all the kids stand up.

Peter wanted to tell the crowd that God promised he'd "pour out" his Holy Spirit. That means GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT. Just like your hand helps your puppet move, the Holy Spirit fills us and helps us live. Have kids move their puppets as they repeat each of the following lines after you.

God said he would give us the Holy Spirit!

The Holy Spirit fills us.

The Holy Spirit teaches us.

The Holy Spirit helps us remember all Jesus did.

God wants everyone to follow him and live with him forever!

Encourage children to move their puppets as they each tell the Bible Point to two kids standing close to them. Then have children sit again, and turn off the CD.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- You filled your puppet with your hand and made it move. What do people do when they're filled with the Holy Spirit?
- Why is it important to listen to the Holy Spirit?

Say: I think the new Christians were so surprised and happy when God gave them the Holy Spirit. Just like when you put your hand in your puppet and helped it move (put your hand in a puppet and make it move).



Say: God puts his Holy Spirit in believers and helps them tell others about Jesus! God will always live inside of them and help them tell others about him. Fig. GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT.





WEAVING FAITH

INTO LIFE

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.

CENTER 1:

Holy Spirit Helps

What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Replay "Windy Day" (track 20 on the CD), and let kids use the props and puppets from Bible Time to tell the Bible passage themselves.

Ask:

- Tell about a time someone helped you like the Holy Spirit helped the people in the Bible.
- What do you need the Holy Spirit's help with today?

Say: When God gave the Holy Spirit to the believers, God filled them and lived inside of them. Just like you help your puppet move when your hand fills it, the Holy Spirit fills us and helps us live like Jesus.

CENTER 2:

Three-in-One

What You'll Do

Have kids clean their hands.

Say: God is the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! Let's talk about this during our snack.

First we have God the Father. Give kids each a cookie.

Then we have the Son. Give kids the milk.

Finally, there's the Holy Spirit. Walk around and pour a little syrup into each cup, stirring as you go. Then pray.

Say: Dip your cookie into your chocolate milk to experience all three things at once as you eat your snack.

Talk With Kids

As kids enjoy their treats, lead them in this discussion.

Ask:

What was it like to dip your cookie and experience the milk, the chocolate, and cookie all together?

Say: GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT, but we can't forget there are two other parts: God the Father and Jesus the Son.

CENTER 3:

A-Maze-ing Spirit

What You'll Do

Say: ► GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT to teach us and lead us. Find a partner, and pick one person to be the Leader and the other person the Follower.

Have kids take turns leading each other from one side of the room to the other. The Follower should close his or her eyes while the Leader leads. Afterward, have kids swap roles.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What was easy or difficult about leading?
- What was easy or difficult about following?
- What's easy or difficult about following the Holy Spirit?

Say: When we're not sure what to do, the Holy Spirit can help us. That's why God sent the Holy Spirit—to help us when we need help!



CENTER 4:

Pouring Out the Spirit

What You'll Do

Say: Peter told the crowd that God had promised he'd "pour out" his Holy Spirit. That means the Holy Spirit fills us, lives in us, and helps us tell everyone about Jesus' love!

Have kids color the cups to look like a crowd of people—old and young, men and women, with different colors of hair, skin, and eyes. Then let the kids have fun using the measuring cups to fill the cups with water.

As they fill each cup, have children say, ▶ "GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT."

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What are some ways that we can let God fill us?
- What can we do to show others we are filled by God?

Say: ► GOD GIVES US THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Holy Spirit fills us and helps us live like Jesus would want us to. The Holy Spirit helps us tell everyone about Jesus and his love.
