As sinners we need what Jesus offers. Jesus freely forgives with the power of His own Blood. It is His word that Jesus declares us righteous. He sustains our faith and keeps Christians.

The Iowa District East (IDE) is pleased to announce that after a year-long search, it has filled the Communications/Technology/Events Coordinator position. Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca Director Daniel Sanchez is joining the IDE staff Effective September 1st to manage IDE communications, publications, technology, and events. Daniel will split his time between the IDE and Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca while continuing to oversee the camp as Director, now focusing primarily on Camp's strategic goals, development, publications and promotions, fundraising, and policy.

To cover the on-site responsibilities of Camp programs and retreats, Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca has hired Mr. Andrew Folkmann as full-time Director of Programs and Retreats. He also begins in September.
