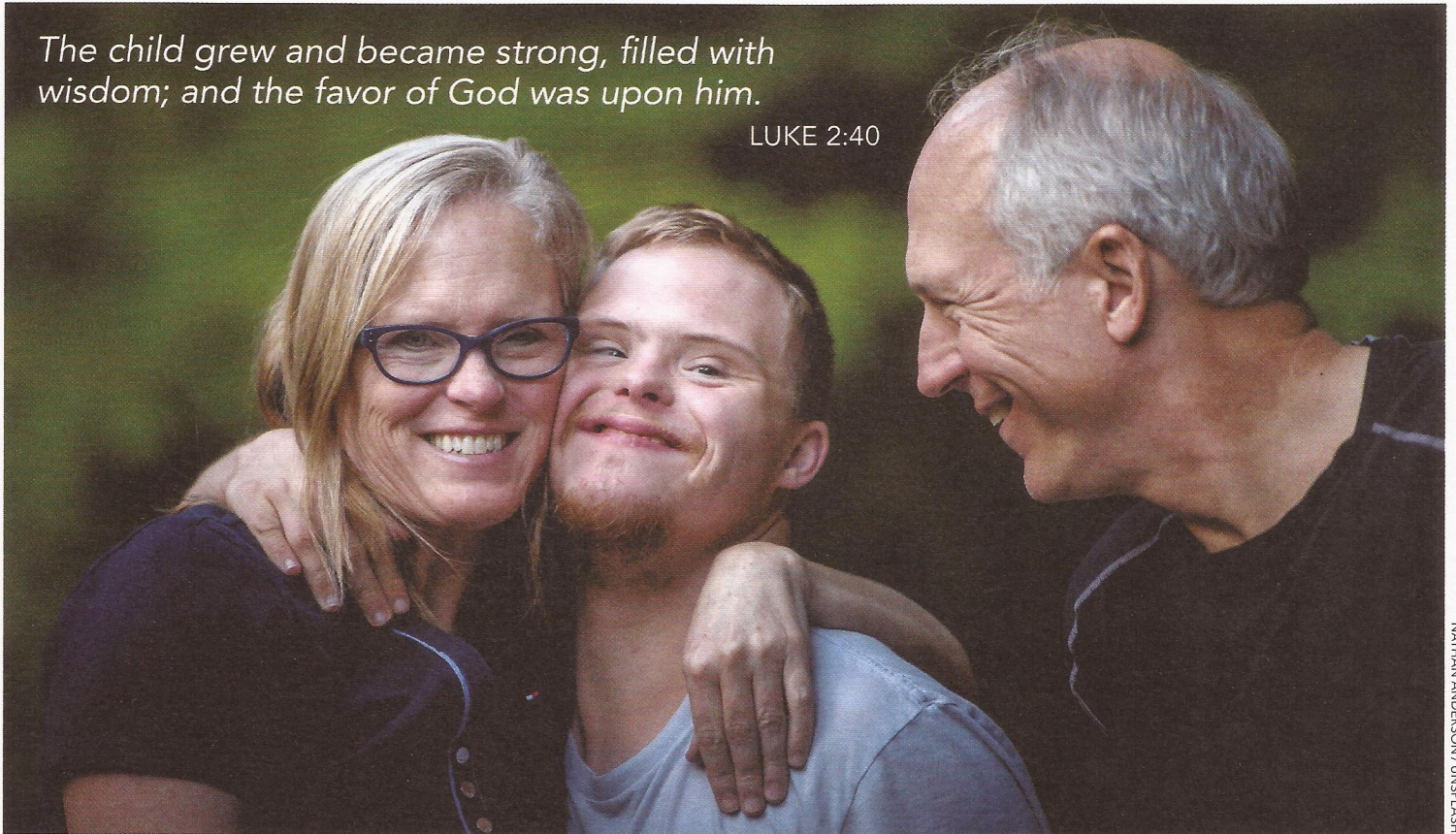

Family Values

Some of the most popular television programs depict family interactions. Unfortunately, many of these families are dysfunctional, and those that are not often appear to be vapid, boring, even unrealistic. Today's readings offer examples of genuine family values and the kind of relationships for which most people yearn.

Sirach describes the tender care that bonds parents and children. First it is the parents who care for the children. Over the years the roles reverse and adult children care for elderly parents. The family is the basic community, where one first learns the hard lessons of unselfishness and forgiveness. The psalm response also describes a model family. The husband will experience success in his work and enjoy the blessings of family life with his wife and their children. Paul provides a list of values to which family members should

commit themselves: "compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another" (Colossians 3:12-13). Finally, the Gospel reading provides a glimpse into the lives of the Holy Family. Here they are: a refugee family with Joseph as the protector.

In a way, these are all "holy families." Prayer is important in the first reading; fear of the Lord is rewarded in the psalm; Paul calls the people "God's chosen ones" (Colossians 3:12). This feast is not meant to be only a look into the past at the Holy Family. It is an opportunity for us to look into the present and do our part to make our own families holy.

Dear Padre,

Why does the Church celebrate the Holy Family? Jesus doesn't seem to be much of a family person. Scripture show him ignoring—even rejecting—Mary and Joseph.

As Jesus grows in age and wisdom, it becomes clear that he hasn't come to build up his own little family but to create a worldwide family of disciples. This family would claim God as the father of everyone in the family, with Jesus and all others as brothers and sisters. All who followed him would be as dear to Jesus as his mother or his foster father. As Jesus said: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you" (John 15:9).

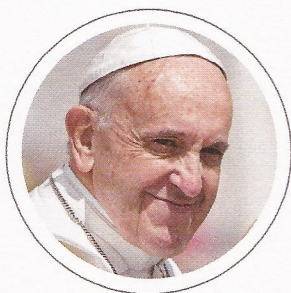
The roles of Mary and Joseph in this new family of Jesus were not to be only earthbound parents but, more importantly, to be examples of how to follow God's purpose. Both Mary and Joseph accepted God's path for them, even though they didn't know where the path would take them.

In the new family of God, we are people who seek out and follow God's purpose in our lives. We are to say yes with Mary; we are to imitate Joseph in following God's direction. Jesus said this quite plainly: "Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother" (Mark 3:35). The will of God becomes the cornerstone of Jesus' new, universal family of humankind. Every Christian family, then, has a double task in raising their children: teaching and inspiring them to love and believe in Jesus and to always seek God's will.

The Capital Campaign Committee would like to share our current totals on expenses and income. We certainly appreciate your generosity in a crazy year like we have had.

Total in pledges and donations: \$200,000

Expenses to date:

Postage - \$155.00

Max Care (evaluation of mold/water damage to basement) - \$90.00

Tuck Pointing - \$26,500.00

Roof - \$39,000

Total expenses: \$65,755.00

We have been paid \$20,038.19 in an insurance claim on the roof and are waiting for the remaining \$4,716.55.

Our actual bank balance is now \$87,524.19. Of that balance, \$20,000.00 was donated specifically for work on the altars. So our working balance is **\$67,524.19**.

We hope to move forward on our other two outside projects as soon as weather allows in the spring. New concrete and a new church entrance are next on the list. Once we have completed the other two outside projects, that balance will be nearing 0. As we move forward with our campaign, we hope more of you will continue to consider contributions towards our Capital Campaign. We are proud of our progress but have a long way to go. Again, we appreciate your prayerful consideration.

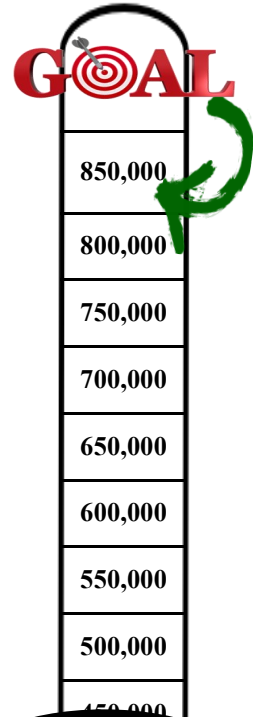
