Students will ordinarily write the assigned memory work three times and hand it in at the beginning of class unless other arrangements are made. Students may not write their memory work assignments during class.

God expects students and parents to be in worship and Sunday School each week (see the Third Commandment and Meaning; Hebrews 10:24-27). God desires you to be in worship because it is the place which he has promised to be in order to give you his gifts of Word and sacrament, forgiveness, life, and fellowship. Being in worship is good for Christians. If a student will be absent, he or she should tell pastor beforehand. Parents are welcome to attend class anytime.
