VILLAGE OF LIBERTY TRASH AND RECYCLING GUIDE



The household trash that's left after you've removed the recyclables must be put out in a watertight, securely-tied clear plastic bag. Clear plastic bags may be purchased at local grocery and hardware stores. The bag may also be placed in a watertight trashcan, which must have handles and a secure cover. The trashcan must be no smaller than 10 gallons and no larger than 35 gallons, and the lid must be closed.

The Village will not pickup construction or demolition debris, furniture, tires, appliances, televisions, computers, auto parts, mattresses, bedsprings or fluorescent bulbs. The Village will not pickup yard waste, including soil, stones, garden rakings, animal waste, used motor oil, or soot from furnaces. For information on how to dispose of or recycle these items, call the Sullivan County Division of Solid Waste (845-794-4466) or a private hauler. Yard debris can be taken to the Village Water Works location located on Revonah Hill Road. Yard debris consist of grass clippings, leaves and limbs. No tree stumps allowed. All leaves in the fall bust be raked loose, not bagged, to the curb before Thanksgiving. Any time after that, leaves will not be picked up. Keep in mind that the Village's equipment is a leafer; it is not a wood chipper. Do not rake leaves or yard debris into the street in the spring. It will not get picked up.

Each spring and fall, both the Town and the Village, in conjunction with Sullivan County, conduct a clean-up week during which many of the above items may be disposed of at the Town Barn or at the Village DPW on Elm Street. The County also conducts tire amnesty weeks at which normal fees are reduced. The County, in conjunction with the Town and the Village, conducts spring "Litter Pluck" campaigns at which volunteers remove litter from the roadsides and the county waives tipping fees for disposal. The County also conducts a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event each summer. Watch local newspapers for announcements of the dates for these special clean-up events. The Village and the Town websites also publish announcements and detailed instructions for their cleanup events. You may view them by visiting them online at the following addresses:

SCRAP METAL



The Village does not pickup scrap metal at curbside. But the Village does maintain a dumpster at the Department of Public Works on Elm Street, where Village residents and businesses may dispose of scrap metal for recycling, free of charge. Hours when scrap metal may be brought to the Village dumpster are Monday through Friday, from 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

RECYCLING BINS



Many residents and businesses already have blue plastic recycling bins that were once made available with funding from a Sullivan County grant, which has been depleted. You may use other bins that are available for purchase at local stores. Please do not use plastic bags.

PICKUP SCHEDULES



All recyclables and trash must be put out at the curb by 6:00 AM on pickup days. They may be placed at the curb the night before. In the Downtown Business District, trash and recyclables must not be put out anytime from Friday night through Sunday afternoon. For Monday morning pickup they may be put out on Sunday night. This is to prevent piles of trash from remaining on the sidewalks throughout the weekend. Garbage cans and recycling bins should not be left out at the curb after they are emptied. If the Village does not collect recyclables because they haven't been properly prepared, they must be removed from curbside by 8:00 PM on the same pickup day.

When a holiday falls on a Monday, all regular trash pickups for the rest of the week are changed to the day after the scheduled day (for example, regular Wednesday pickups will be made on Thursday). But regular recycling pickup days do not change after a Monday holiday.
