

WHAT DOES SACC VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION DO?

AAC Vocational Rehabilitation's efforts are focused upon assisting the individual optimize vocational potential; strive for individualized goals; and achieve economic self-sufficiency. This process involves the identification of employment barriers and their subsequent mitigation to facilitate community transition. Case management services are required throughout the process to provide support for successful reintegration. The ultimate goal is to achieve a lifestyle of independence and integration within the workplace community. Veterans after an injury, mental disorder, or other medical condition disrupting previous employment, and/or resulting in prolonged periods of unemployment or under-employment, may request a consult to Vocational Rehabilitation from a VA provider.
