A MESSAGE FROM WALK #214 LAY DIRECTOR

After my aunt sponsored most of my family on the Walk to Emmaus, her sights set on me and my husband as the next pilgrims. We heard: "Just fill out the application! When you get invited, decide if you want to go or not. It may take 2-3 years getting through the waiting list before you're even invited." So we completed the application and promptly forgot about it, until my husband was invited to attend Walk #95 in February of 2007. That meant the invitation for the wife was not far behind. I was invited to attend the October 2007 walk, which I declined because missing work as a teacher meant more work getting ready to go than staying to teach. My next option was Walk #107 in March of 2008, which was during my Spring Break - a perfect time to go because I wouldn't have to miss work. I went on Walk #107 with the expectation that I would encounter God in some way, but also with a fear that I would not have a great experience like so many of my family and friends who had gone before me. God is good and faithful, though, and He met me in such a powerful way on Walk #107. After my walk, I spent many years sponsoring people and serving in the background. In 2011, I sensed a shift in my spirit fueling a desire to work in the Conference Room, not just in the background. I messaged a friend something to this effect: "I'd love to go back into the Conference Room some day." No sooner had I written what was on my heart, I literally got a phone call to serve as an ATL on Walk #152. I just had to laugh because God knows when we are ready. And so began the journey to becoming Lay Director.

I loved serving in the Conference Room, seeing lives changed right before my eyes, day after day, year after year. In 2021, I was invited to be Lay Director in 2022 and I was given the option to serve in February, August or November. Being Lay Director for a Chrysalis Flight in 2021, I felt I needed a little more time to prepare to be Lay Director again, so I chose November. When putting the walk on my calendar, I looked at the CAEC calendar and determined that my walk would be #214 - exactly double the number of my original walk. All throughout the Bible we see that numbers have a significance. I don't know of 107 and 214, but the circumstances of my being on Walk #107 and then being Lay Director for #214 are only by God's hand.

I feel a weightiness about this walk. Remembering the impact on my family and friends of my own walk, I can't help but think about all of the ways God will use what happens on Walk #214 to impact others for days, weeks, months, years and generations to come. My hope is that I have prayed and prepared for every detail of this Walk, that I have heard clearly from the Lord, been a humble servant and vessel through which He can operate. The symbol for Walk #214 is special to me - a replica of a fish that was on the back door of my childhood home. The Greek letters on the inside of the fish stand for: Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior. My prayer for Walk #214 has been that our eyes and intentions will be focused on Jesus Christ...God's Son...our Savior. Nothing else matters.





CAMP ALAMISCO LODGING INFORMATION

Lodge/Cabins: available on a first come first serve basis. They have bunk beds and community showers/bathrooms. Per bunk, they rent for \$25/night, or \$75 for the weekend. Three meals are included per day. You must provide all of your own linens.

Campsites: 3 spots available, where you can bring your own motor home. The campsite rates are \$30/night or \$90 for the weekend, and includes three meals for two people.

Alamisco Inn: which features three "suites" upstairs, that includes TWO queen beds, ONE set of bunk beds, and ONE pull out sectional "single bed" sleeper. It also has its own kitchenette.

Suite #1 (Accommodates 6 People) is \$100/night or \$300 for the weekend.

Suite #2 (Accommodates 4 People) is \$67/night or \$200 for the weekend.

Suite #3 (Accommodates 6 People) is \$100/night or \$300 for the weekend.

**All Suites - All Linens are provided.

Downstairs Rooms (One double bed) are \$45/night or \$135/weekend.

* Downstairs Rooms - Linens are provided.

*All Alamisco Inn Suites include three meals for 4 people included in the cost of the suite.

For those at camp not staying in lodgings: Meals - Breakfast \$5.00, Lunch \$5.00, Dinner \$8.00.

WHO CAN ATTEND THE EMMAUS THREE-DAY EVENTS?

It is the policy of The Central Alabama Emmaus Community as well as The Upper Room - Emmaus Ministries, that ONLY persons that have completed a 3-Day Weekend (Emmaus, Chrysalis, Cursillo, Tres Dias, etc.) may participate in and attend:
