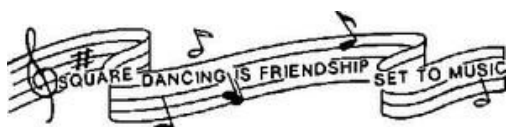

centerpieces, seating, name tags,

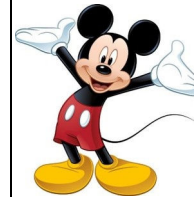


etc., completed for our weekend.

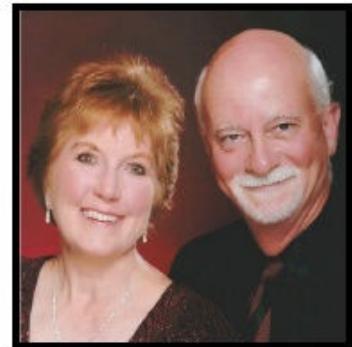

It's a cool place to browse around, especially for people interested in antiques or historic home restoration.
