The Importance of Saying Thank You

Luke 17:11-19 details the story of ten desperate afflicted men. All ten of these men had leprosy. All ten were unable to come in contact with anyone and outcasts. All ten were unable to help themselves. All ten cry out for the merciful healing power of Jesus.

They know He can do for them what no one else is able to do. When Jesus hears their cry, He responds "Go show your selves to the priest."

As they go to show themselves to the priests, who had certified them as lepers, they are healed by the power of Jesus. Nine out of the ten keep going their way. The outcast among all of the outcast turns to Jesus and falls down and gives him thanks.

He is an outcast not only because of his condition, but also because of his ethnic background. He is a Samaritan. His ancestors Jewish blood was mingled that with that of the conquering Babylonians. Those Jews who were deported were intermarried with the Babylonians and then resettled in the area between Judea and Galilee. They are hated because they are a constant reminder to their Jewish brethren that they were conquered. Because they are half-breeds they are also considered unclean. The Jews will not even eat with them. In fact, they hated the Samaritans so much that they would cross the street if one were walking their way.

But misery loves company. As long as they were all sick, dying and desperate they didn't care that he was a Samaritan. Yet it is this one outcast among outcasts who turns in grateful appreciation for his healing and falls at the feet of Jesus and says "Thank You."

Jesus asks a poignant question. "Were there not ten cleansed? But where *are* the nine? ¹⁸ Were there not any found who returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ And He said to him, "Arise, go your way. Your faith has made you well."

This outcast does not take the Lord's mercy for granted. He says "Thank You".

We should emulate him. Often we ask for the mercy and help of God. When He delivers say "Thank You." Never should God answer our prayers and we are nonchalant about His favor. He deserves our "Thank You!"

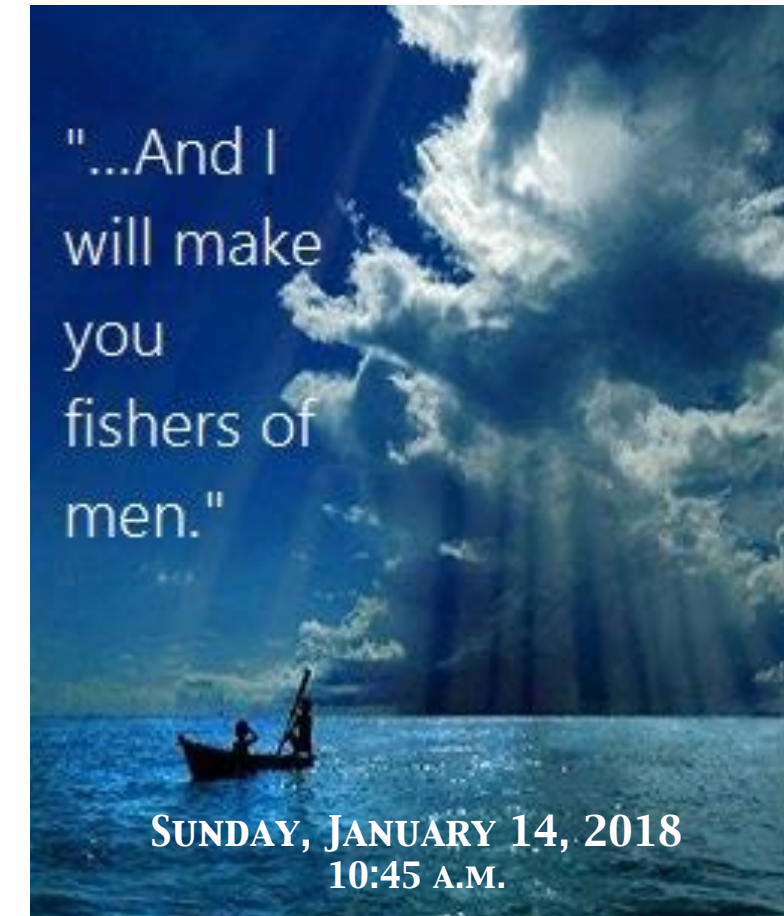


