

CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

2nd Year Scholarships - \$500 each

Students from the Class of 2014 who achieved sophomore status after their first year of college, with a minimum college grade point average of 2.75, were eligible to apply for scholarship assistance from the TEF. Those receiving a \$500 scholarship for the 2015-2016 school year are Morgan Cardwell, Jolise Elsinghorst, Shelby Gould, Megan Kromm and Mckenzie Loney.







From Jolise—I just wanted to thank the TEF for all their support, last year and this year. Your scholarships have given me the extra push to do well in school and to keep on going. I am so grateful. He has just finished his 2nd year at the University of California Davis, working towards a degree in Viticulture and Enology.



Making a Difference Scholarship in memory of Katie Nolan—\$1000

This scholarship is sponsored by the Nolan family to encourage others to follow Katie's example of service to others, offering hope and inspiration. Katie Nolan was born and raised in Touchet, graduating in 1998. She graduated from Philadelphia Biblical University in 2002 and was working on a Master's Degree in Social Work at Portland State University when she died in a climbing accident on Mt. Hood in December 2009. Applicants are asked to describe their philosophy regarding service to others, activities and/or projects they participated in that reflect their commitment to making a difference in the lives of others, and any plans they have made for service after college. This year, the Making a Difference Scholarship is awarded to Jolise Elsinghorst. Jolise graduated from Touchet in 2014, as class Salutatorian, while also earning her AA degree from Walla Walla Community College through the Running Start Program. She has just finished her first year at Whitworth University in Spokane, working towards a degree in Education.


