

Objective: Record the ALA's history through the eyes of its members HOW TO RECORD AND POST TO "MEMBERS REMEMBER"

Background Information The history of the American Legion Auxiliary begins back In November 1919 and continues with you. The organization's history, like any other history, is more than names and dates. It is about its membership and how it developed the ALA's programs and projects to fulfill our mission of serving the veterans, servicemembers, and their families who sacrifice much for this country of ours. A written history can only tell so much. However, when an organization's history is told through the eyes of its membership, everyone learns a great deal more about who we are, what we do, and why we matter

Step-by-Step Instructions Here are some tips: • This is a two-person project so find someone to assist. This is a good time to enlist the help of your Junior members and/or college students due to their experience with technology. • Find long time members of the Auxiliary and ask them to share their stories in a video. These stories can be about: • a special project, • a particular highlight during her membership • how many generations of her family have been members and why • if a chartered member, her experience in starting the unit • Find a location where it is quiet and where there will be no interruptions • Record with iPhones/Smartphones. Please keep in mind that your video file must be either a .mov; .avi; .mpeg; or a .wmv file extension • Each recording should be no longer than five (5) minutes in length. You may make more than one. Cover one topic in each video. • Post the video on YouTube. An instructional video on how to upload is located at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_O7iUiftbKU. • Go to YouTube at https://www.youtube.com • Give the video the following title: ALA Dept. of (two letter abbreviation for your state) Unit ____ Members Remember. • Provide a description and tags that will help people locate the files easily. These will make it easier for others to locate the videos. • Under Category, click on Nonprofits & Activism • Under Privacy, click on Share your video with the world •

American Legion Auxiliary Department of Arizona Membership 2016-2017

October 2016

Rock at Fall Conference Arizona! Do you have questions about Membership? Please attend Fall Conference, November 4-6 at the Doubletree Inn in Tucson. Lots of valuable information will be presented at the Membership Workshop.

Success stories, especially if you are trying something new are requested. Document them on paper via US Mail or send via email. Mid-Year Reports are due to this Chair by December 31, 2016 and yes, that includes new and old ideas. That can be a paragraph or two, just include your Unit number on that email or letter.

Are you receiving weekly standings from your District President or District Vice President? Are you transmitting membership weekly? Did you signed up for ALAMIS (American Legion Auxiliary Member Information System), a useful tool for your Unit? The form was included in last month's packet.

NEWS FLASH - National Convention held in August voted to amend the National Stand Rules, Section X – Unit Number 3 which clarifies and simplifies the process for transfer membership to another Unit.

<u>It formerly read</u>: "Any member in good standing wishing to transfer to another unit must present to the new unit her current membership card. Upon acceptance of the transfer by the new unit, no dues shall be transferred."

<u>It now reads:</u> A member who is not subject to suspension or membership revocation under due process is eligible to transfer her membership to another unit if she has paid her membership dues to her current unit or immediate past membership year. A member transferring to a new unit must pay current dues to either her current unit or the unit into which she wishes to transfer.

Evidence of paid membership includes:

- 1. American Legion Auxiliary Membership Card.
- 2. Verification of membership by ALA Department or National Headquarters membership records.
- 3. Other documentation verifying payment of current or immediate past year membership dues such as a cancelled check or receipt; or
- 4. When verifying documentation is not available, a sworn statement that the member's membership dues payment was tendered.

And a kind reminder that Membership is the responsibility of the entire organization. Your next <u>Target Date</u> is 60% by October 11!

Let's Make Membership Meaningful!

UAV MEETING UNOFFICIAL MINUTES

3 SEPTEMBER 2016

Meeting called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman Reggie Yates. The opening ceremony was conducted and guests introduced.

Bob Dalpe gave a report on the upcoming "Glendale Standup" being held at Glendale Community College on September 24.

Dr. Juan Gurule and Mr. Carlos Avila gave a presentation on an effort being made to create a "Father Albert Braun Veterans Memorial Historic District" just west of Sky Harbor Airport in an undeveloped area surrounding the Sacred Heart Church, which has been designated as a Historical Building.

A report was given on the upcoming Veteran's Day Parade, chaired by Paula Pedene. The Veteran's Day parade is the fourth largest in the country. This year will be the 20th year of the parade in Phoenix and Channel 3 has stated they will air the parade. The theme will be "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans". For more information go to phoenixveteransdayparade.org. There are usually about 2000 participants and well over 2000 spectators. It will be held on Friday, November 11th starting at 11:00 a.m. The committee welcomes anyone willing to help.

A representative from the VA Medical center gave a report on the events going on at the facility and what is being done to replace Deborah Amdur, who retired. They are in the process of increasing the VA medical facilities by opening three new clinics totaling 50,000 square feet of space off campus from the main hospital this year. They are also working to fully implementing a Mobile Health Unit to service those veterans in rural areas. They are looking into hiring temporary health providers to help during the winter season when the snowbirds are here. They are also focusing on improving the phone response system. On improvement is when someone is suicidal they no longer are switched to a 800 number, but when they call the main line they are given the option "7" to get assistance. Suicides have dropped from 22 a day in 2014 to 20 a day in 2015. This is still unacceptable. The parking situation is also being worked to help especially during peak times.

Roll call was taken, a quorum was established. A motion was made to accept the minutes as written, second and approved.

Wanda Wright, Director of the AZDVS reported of some more veteran's issues. She stated that 49% or all veterans in the state are over the age of 55. They are a high suicide risk.

They are working on making improvements to the State Veterans Home is Phoenix. The home is 20 years old. They are also working on a design for the new veteran's home in Yuma so that when the funding comes through they can start building. It is scheduled to have between 60 & 70 beds. For more information regarding the events and programs sponsored by the Department of Veterans Services, go to AZDVS.gov.

Reggie Yates gave a report of the Board of Directors meeting. He advised those in attendance that the UAV website had been hacked, but there was no personal information on the site to be compromised. The site has been cleaned, additional securities set in place and is now back up and running. Reggie congratulated Rick Romley for his appointment to Judge in the Mesa Veteran's Court.

Terry Araman gave a legislative update. He advised the membership that they will continue working on updating the antiquated legislation dealing with veteran's retirement. The current \$2500 has been in effect for over 20 years. They are trying to get the military retirement totally tax free, but if unable to at least raise the non-taxable to \$5,000.

Efforts are being made to streamline the processing of veteran's claims. There is a house bill HR562 that deals specifically with the streamlining process.

Nominations are being accepted for the Copper Shield and Copper Star awards. Deadline for submission is September 30th, 2016.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Judy Hatch gave a report on the upcoming Pearl Harbor Day. Registration forms have gone out. Any organization not receiving their paperwork were instructed to contact Judy and she will send it out. This is the 75th Anniversary of this date in our history. The Governor will be attending the event at Pearl Harbor. Judy reported that she has been advised that this is the last year that Hawaii will be sponsoring the program there, unless some other organization picks it up. If that happens, Arizona will be the only state continuing the tradition of recognizing this day.

Members were advised of the upcoming Phoenix Navy Ball, 241st US Navy Birthday, honoring the U.S. Navy's Submarine Force "Silent Service", being held as the Arizona Grand Resort and Spa, 8000 Arizona Grand Pkwy, Phoenix, AZ 85044 on October 8, 2016. Cost is \$65 per person, attire is Dinner Dress Blues or formal attire. To register go to www.phoenixnavyball.com or contact Capt. Carol Culbertson, USN Ret. At 602-799-9480 or Capt. There will be a "Honor Walk" some time in November. Proceed goes to one or two veterans groups in the valley.
