MINUTES OF THE POINT BLANK CITY COUNCIL

September 12, 2022

The Point Blank City Council met in regular session on Monday, September 12, 2022, at the Point Blank Civic Center in Point Blank, Texas.

CONVENED

Mayor Wood called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. A quorum was present, and the meeting was called to order.

READING OF SECTION 42.05 OF THE PENAL CODE, DISRUPTION OF A MEETING OR PROCESSION

Mayor Wood did not read Section 42.05 of the Penal Code.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public attended.

MINUTES

Mayor Wood called the Council's attention to the minutes from the August 8, 2022, meeting and asked for a motion to approve them.

Mr. Sims made a motion to approve the minutes as presented.

Mr. Gumpert seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).

CONSIDERATION, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE ON STREET REPAIRS

Mayor Wood said the contractor is behind on his work with Commissioner Nettuno but he is scheduled to do four days of work with the city next.

UPDATE ON SHORT TERM RENTALS

Ms. Hoot said that we received a registration fee from 800 Northwoods Drive and they paid the HOT taxes that were due. The owner said their last rental would be the weekend of August 6th because they are going to be moving into the house permanently. No other registration fees or taxes were received this month.

CONSIDERATION AND DISCUSSION OF THE FY23 BUDGET

Mayor Wood distributed copies of the FY23 Budget and adjusted the Volunteer Fire Department Donation to \$2,500. He informed the Council that this is the third and final reading of the budget and if there were no other changes, he would like the Council to vote on the budget.

Mr. Hickinbotham made a motion to approve the FY23 budget.

Mr. Wulf seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).

Mr. Gumpert asked when the new dollar store was going to open. The Mayor said he did not have an exact date but expects it to open around October 1st.

CONSIDERATION, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE ON APPROVAL OF SIGN FOR THE POINT BLANK COMMUNITY CHURCH

Mayor Wood informed the Council that this would be a fully electronic sign and community announcements can be posted on the sign. He would like to waive the sign application fee because the church is a non-profit and the sign will be beneficial to the city.

Mr. Hickinbotham made a motion to waive the \$250 application fee but if the church starts charging for using the sign, they will have to pay the \$250 application fee.

Mr. Sims seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).

CONSIDERATION, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE ON APPROVAL OF SIGN FOR THE FAMILY DOLLAR STORE

Mayor Wood informed the Council That the Family Dollar will use the existing pylon that is there and will pay the \$250 fee.

Mr. Sims made a motion to approve the sign for the Family Dollar store.

Mr. Gumpert seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).

CONSIDERATION, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE TO APPOINT A SELECTION REVIEW COMMITTEE TO REVIEW AND RECOMMEND ALL PROPOSALS

Mayor Wood explained that a selection review committee needed to be appointed to review the grant proposals and make a recommendation to the Council. There needs to be at least three people. The mayor asked for volunteers. Gary Wulf volunteered.

Mr. Sims made a motion to approve the following people to the selection committee: Mayor Mark Wood, Alderman Gary Wulf and City Manager Kelly Hoot.

Mr. Gumpert seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).

$\frac{\text{CONSIDERATION, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE ON ROAD MAINTENANCE}}{\text{BOND ORDINANCE}}$

Mayor Wood explained the recent situation involving dump trucks and dredging in Governor's Point and that is one of the reasons that he has drafted this road maintenance bond ordinance.

Mayor Wood explained the county has a road maintenance bond and how it is used and what it is used for. How far does the city want to push this issue. He feels the mayor, county commissioner and county engineer need to be involved. Mayor Wood said the county holds a maintenance bond and must be a class A bond company.

Linda Earls introduced herself. She is on the Governor's Point POA Board. She asked several questions and said she was trying to get a better understanding of how the city determines prior damage.

Mr. Sims asked how the bond amount is set. He added that building a home is considerably different from a dredging project. He feels the city needs a matrix that is fair and followed. Mr. Sims asked if there was a way to do this thru an insurance company?

The Mayor responded that he did not know.

Mr. Sims asked about charging the contractor a bond? Mayor Wood said he was unsure.

Mr. Wulf said it seemed to him that there are three bond questions:

- 1. When do you require a bond.
- 2. How to access the amount of a bond.
- 3. How to access road damage caused by the event.

Council agreed that it is clear that there needs to be some sort of oversight. We need to know what is being planned. How many trucks will be used and how many cubic yards will be moved.

The Council discussed the pros and cons of this ordinance at great length.

Ms. Earls said this is a learning curve for everyone and is extremely frustrating for many.

Ms. Basham said the city needs a system in place and what requirements are. There should be a formal documentation process. Ms. Basham suggested revisiting this when we have more information.

Mr. Sims made a motion to table this ordinance.

Mr. Gumpert seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).

Mr. Gumpert made a motion to adjourn the meeting.

Mr. Wulf seconded the motion which carried (5 ayes, 0 nays).
