**Respect for the Elderly
(Continued from last week)**

Last week I began to write about respect for the elderly in Ghana. I would like to continue from where I stopped. It is said that "Charity begins at home, and "Correct your child, and he will give you peace of mind; he will delight your soul," (Prov. 29:17). In the house, the children are taught how to behave well. They have to obey their parents and respect them. When they are told to sit or stand, or sleep, they have to obey. When a child is called by any of the parents, the child stops whatever he or she is doing and responds to the call. Since the children learn more from the parents, the attitude of the parents towards them should be cordial and they should behave and choose the kind of words that will help the children in their moral upbringing. This is because, when the children go out, whatever behavior they put up will send a signal about the kind of home he or she is from. For example, when a child misbehaves in the street, you would hear an elderly person remarking that the child was **fed and not brought up well, or well-trained**. People around would ask who the parents of that child are. If the child behaves well, too the compliments also affect the parents. Among the children themselves, there is the need to respect the old ones among them, and the old ones to take good care of the young ones. It brings peace and order in the house. One may be tempted to think that the young are subject to servitude or intimidation, but it is not the case. It rather brings cordial relationships between the elderly and the young ones who know that they are also in transition to adulthood.

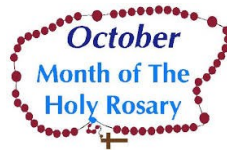

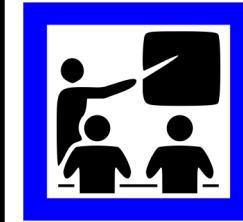
