

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

OF SUBSTANCE AND **APPEARANCE**

Appearance, they say, can be very deceptive. For example, to ordinary eyes, the Body of Christ

is just bread and the Blood is just wine. But we, Catholics, look beyond the appearance to the substance (Christ). The substance makes all the difference and matters deeply to us!

We know that very often our society prematurely stops at

appearance, the peripherals. Sadly, often we JESUS HEALS A too make the same mistake. In the first reading (1 Sam 16:1-13), Samuel reminds us to always go beyond appearance. He saw the seven sons of Jesse and their outstanding "kingly" physical attributes, but wasn't quite satisfied. When he saw David, through God's grace, he saw beyond his "unkingly" physical attributes.



May Christ, who opened the eyes of the blind man (John 9:1-41), open ours, help us to learn to see beyond all that beclouds the humanity and substance in our brothers and sisters and

act accordingly. May we learn to focus more on who we are and who we are becoming, and worry less about how we appear to others. May we worry more about not becoming like graves beautiful outside, but full of dead bones inside (Matthew 23:27).
