

Come in, rest, pray apart from the world. Surely God is in His Holy Temple.

THE PRESENTATION & EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATE

Celebrant The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented. Parents & Godparents I present Zoey Onesta Archer to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant Wilt thou on thy part take heed that this child whom thou dost present be brought up in the Christian faith and life? Parents & Godparents I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Wilt thou by thy prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ? *Parents & Godparents* I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Dost thou renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? Parents & Godparents I renounce them all.

Celebrant Dost thou renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? *Parents & Godparents* I renounce them all.

Celebrant Dost thou renounce all sinful desires that draw thee from the love of God? Parents & Godparents I renounce them all.

Celebrant Dost thou turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as thy Savior? Parents & Godparents I do.

Celebrant Dost thou put thy whole trust in His grace and love? Parents & Godparents I do.

Celebrant Dost thou promise to follow and obey Him as thy Lord and Master? Parents & Godparents I do.

Celebrant Will ye who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in *her* life in Christ? *People* We will.

Celebrant Dearly beloved, let us join with *her* who is now committing *herself* to Christ Jesus and here renew our own baptismal covenant.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Celebrant Dost thou believe in God the Father? *People* I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Celebrant Dost thou believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

Celebrant Dost thou believe in God the Holy Ghost?

People I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, \clubsuit and the life everlasting.

Celebrant Wilt thou continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Celebrant Wilt thou persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever thou dost fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Wilt thou proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ Jesus? *People* I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Wilt thou seek and serve Christ in all men, loving thy neighbor as thyself? *People* I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Wilt thou strive for justice and peace among all men, and respect the dignity of every person? *People* I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

Celebrant Let us now pray for this person who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Leader Deliver her, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Open her heart to thy grace and truth. People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Fill her with thy holy and life-giving Spirit. People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Keep *her* in the faith and communion of thy holy Church. *People* Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Teach *her* to love others in the power of the Holy Ghost. *People* Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Send *her* into the world in witness to thine abounding love. *People* Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Bring *her* to the fullness of thy peace and glory. *People* Lord, hear our prayer.

Celebrant Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ thy Son may live in the power of His resurrection and look for Him to come again in glory; who liveth and reigneth now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE SALT OF WISDOM & BLESSING OF THE WATER

Celebrant Receive the salt of wisdom: may it be unto thee a pledge of everlasting life. Amen.

Celebrant The Lord be with you. People And with thy spirit. Celebrant Lift up your hearts. People We lift them up unto the Lord. Celebrant Let us give thanks unto our Lord God. People It is meet and right so to do. We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which the Holy Ghost moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Ghost as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through His death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in His death; by which we partake in His resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Ghost. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into His fellowship them that come to Him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Now ⊯sanctify this water, we beseech thee, by thy Holy Ghost, that those here are cleansed from sin and made regenerate may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior, to whom, with thee and the same Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, now and forever. **Amen.**

We most heartily thank thee, O heavenly Father, that by water and the Holy Ghost thou hast bestowed upon *this* thy servant the forgiveness of sin, and hast raised *her* unto the new life of grace. Sustain *her*, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit. Give unto *her* an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. **Amen.**

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant & People We receive thee into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim His resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.


