### **TRANSITIONS**



By now you're aware that St. John's has a candidate to become your next settled pastor. While I'm delighted for you at the prospect of you moving into this next chapter as a faith family and experiencing the exciting things that God has in store for you, pending your affirmative vote, I'm also sensitive to other feelings and emotions that may accompany this news. When an interim pastor and a congregation come to a point in their relationship when they prepare to say goodbye, it can be difficult. Congregational life at St. John's with which we've grown accustomed these past nearly 18 months will change. I formed relationships with so many of you that guickly became comfortable and meaningful, and those will change. Some of us shared joys and sorrows together, or we talked about issues of faith and life on a personal level, and real fondness and care developed. These are significant! All of this means that we face the future knowing that things will be different. But as hard as it may be for some of us, our time for saying farewell will likely happen soon.

Your pastoral candidate will lead worship and preach his trial sermon on June 25, after which you, as a congregation, will vote on the recommendation to call Rev. Jeff McCarn as your new settled pastor. Now that these wheels are set in motion, what this means for me is that I am in the process of seeking a new Intentional Interim position. I've already had discussions with a few churches and Association/Conference Ministers – all out of state. So this is a time of significant transition for all of us.

My goal in interim ministry at St. John's has been to provide this church family with positive and enthusiastic leadership following the retirement of your previous pastor, to be a non-anxious presence by fostering a healthy transition to a new settled pastor, maintain vital programs and the "good health" of this faith family, and assist in assessing its ministries. With regard to the latter, it's common for an interim pastor and congregation to address some important topics: Who are we? Who is our neighbor? What is God calling us to do or to be? How does our history inform the answers to these questions?

Are there any new directions in ministry to be explored? Are we using our time well with regard to the needed time for a change in pastoral leadership? We dealt specifically with these and other questions last Spring during a town hall-type gathering, during which we especially talked about the recent history of St. John's and its pastors, about its identity today, and about a vision for its future; we had conversations in various committee settings about the state of things at St. John's and the possibilities for the future; and I touched a few times on them, in writing and from the pulpit.

I'll say more when there is a clearer and definitive transition timeline, pending a vote of approval on your new pastor, but for now I simply yet sincerely give gratitude to God for bringing us together and blessing our mutual ministry; and offer special thanks to you for being so warm and caring toward Janise and me, as well as being accepting and supportive of my efforts as your interim pastor.

As I close, consider these words from Paul from Philippians 4:4-7 (NIV):

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

May God richly bless you always!

And for at least the near future, I'll see you in church!

#### About the author

Desmond Mpilo Tutu was a South African cleric and activist, who rose to worldwide fame during the 1980s as an opponent of apartheid. In 1984, Tutu became the second South African to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. He was the first black South African Anglican Archbishop of Cape Town, South Africa, and primate of the Church of the Province of Southern Africa (now the Anglican Church of Southern Africa). Tutu chaired the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. He was vocal in his defense of human rights and used his high profile to campaign for the oppressed. Tutu also campaigned to fight AIDS, homophobia, poverty and racism.

#### Some of the Quotes:

"Forgiveness does not relieve someone of responsibility for what they have done. Forgiveness does not erase accountability. It is not about turning a blind eye or even turning the other cheek. It is not about letting someone off the hook or saying it is okay to do something monstrous. Forgiveness is simply about understanding that every one of us is both inherently good and inherently flawed. Within every hopeless situation and every seemingly hopeless person lies the possibility of transformation."

"We are not responsible for what breaks us, but we can be responsible for what puts us back together again. Naming the hurt is how we begin to repair our broken parts."

"Forgiveness is truly the grace by which we enable another person to get up, and get up with dignity, to begin anew. To not forgive leads to bitterness and hatred. Like self-hatred and self-contempt, hatred of others gnaws away at our vitals. Whether hatred is projected out or stuffed in, it is always corrosive to the human spirit.

"We do not need to succumb to the temptation to meet such a violation with retaliation. The only way to heal this hurt is to give voice to what ails us. It is only in this way that we can keep our pain and loss from taking root inside us. It is only in this way that we have a chance for freedom."


"Ultimately, forgiveness is a choice we make, and the ability to forgive others comes from the recognition that we are all flawed and all human. We all have made mistakes and harmed others. We will again. We find it easier to practice forgiveness when we can recognize that the roles could have been reversed."

"When we accept our own pain we can begin to see past it to the other person's woundedness. We can begin to consider that if we were in their shoes, if we stood inside their story, we might have done to others what they did to us."

"Prayer Before the Prayer, I want to be willing to forgive; but I dare not ask for the will to forgive in case you give it to me and I am not yet ready. I am not yet ready for my heart to soften. I am not yet ready to be vulnerable again; not yet ready to see that there is humanity in my tormentor's eyes, or that the one who hurt me may also have cried "I am not yet ready for the journey," I am not yet interested in the path. I am at the prayer before the prayer of forgiveness. Grant me the will to want to forgive. Grant it to me, not yet, but soon. Can I even form the words "Forgive me?" Dare I even look? Do I dare to see the hurt I have caused? I can glimpse all the shattered pieces of that fragile thing, that soul trying to rise on the broken wings of hope, but only out of the corner of my eye. I am afraid of it, and if I am afraid to see. How can I not be afraid to say "Forgive me?" Is there a place where we can meet? You and me, the place in the middle. The no man's land, where we straddle the lines. Where you are right, and I am right, too. And both of us are wrong and wronged Can we meet there? And look for the place where the path begins. The path that ends when we forgive Supplies."

I hope these quotes can give you peace.

# Dedication of Paraments and Flags

Unless you have served as a Deacon or Custodian and have had the task of changing them, you probably don't think much about the paraments, the cloths on the altar, pulpit and lectern. These change according to the liturgical calendar. Most recently, the cloths were white during the Easter season, changed to red for Pentecost, back to white for Trinity Sunday, and then we will settle into the long season of green paraments. The previous white cloths were purchased in September 1979 and had become stained. The company, Kanel Brothers, that made the original paraments is still in business and they were pleased to make our new ones. New green paraments were also purchased to replace the current ones which were purchased in 1980. Both sets were paid for with money given as memorials.

The white paraments are given in memory of Doug Armbruster, Janet Bichan, and Pamela Hahn. The green cloths are in memory of Jim Armbruster as are the new American and Christian flags that replace those that were showing wear.

Both sets of paraments and the flags will be dedicated on June 4.



# MISSION\_TO\_GO MISSION FOR JUNE

In 2010, the Missions Committee created "Mission-to-Go." This fund assists members of our congregation that wish to take part in a mission trip. In the past your support has helped for portions of over 30+ mission trips to Mexico, Honduras, Haiti, Houston, Kentucky, and Mississippi. Your support has also provided funds to the missions directly to help purchase building supplies for the work that needed to be done as well as other essentials for families in need.

The biggest obstacle in taking a mission trip is the cost of it. There are transportation costs that can be from a couple hundred dollars up to thousands of dollars. Most organizations, also, require a donation to offset their costs for housing, staff and many other miscellaneous items.

Many members of the church have expressed interest in mission trips. Again costs are always a factor. Please give generously to Mission-to-Go. If you would like to have more information or would like to go on a mission trip please contact the Mission Team. They will help you with the information.

# **Heating Project Update**

It has been a while since we last updated the congregation on the status of heating system replacement. All of the bills have been paid for the heat and air conditioning in the Pastor's Study and church office, the air conditioning in the Fellowship Hall, and, most recently, the new hot water heating system. What a generous Faith Family!!

You may recall that we cashed in a CD last Fall and "borrowed from ourselves" to finish paying for this project. We have repaid \$3,000 of that, so we still owe ourselves \$8,000. This is money we have had in reserve for unplanned expenses. We know that there will be costs as we call a new settled pastor and trust that this money will be there when needed. 


