ular journey I ventured to the nation of Rwanda as a guest of World Vision International. What was most intriguing to me about World Vision's mission strategy is that special emphasis was placed on transcommunities forming beyond planting churches. Amongst World Vision missionaries I sensed a compassion that was almost tangible and it didn't take long to learn where this "culture of compassion" originated. It was birthed in the heart of Robert (Bob) Pierce who founded World Vision in 1950.

Pierce was known as a man of intense praying and was particularly compassionate toward children that were abandoned and abused. One renowned Christian leader wrote this about Bob Pierce, "he prayed more earnestly and importunately than anyone else I have ever known. It was as though prayer burned within him. ... Bob Pierce functioned from a broken heart."

Undoubtedly this "heart condition" could be attributed to the theme of Pierce's life ... a theme that still resonates today within so many missionaries (serving with World Vision and beyond) committed to spreading the gospel far and wide. This is the principle that governed

his life ... "LET MY HEART BE BROKEN WITH THE THINGS THAT BREAK THE HEART OF GOD". Pierce lived out his life with a Holy Heart Break.

In the midst of this current culture that seems to be devolving into greater godlessness and brazen displays of atheistic arrogance there is a natural tendency for Christ followers to develop a callous and judgmental heart. I must confess that at times I battle feelings of anger, disgust and disdain toward people whose ideologies and lifestyles defy the principles of God's word. It is then when the Lord reminds me of the words of Paul as he said, "By the grace of God I am what I am." It is then when I ask God to give me HIS heart and HIS compassion toward those who are lost and spiritually clueless. While I may not pray the same words as Bob Pierce, I do seek that God will allow me the privilege of seeing sinners through the compassionate eyes of the Savior.

Lost people don't need our condemnation and neither do they need our pity. Lost people need the love of Jesus Christ pouring forth from a broken heart. They need to hear the gospel shared from broken people who are genuinely concerned for their eternal destiny. Pray for Heart Break.
