

# RAYMOND PARTLO 1916-1995

Raymond Partlo, 78 of Alton, died Jan. 6 at his winter home in Phoenix, Ariz., following a lengthy illness.

Mr. Partlo was born Sept. 18, 1916, son of William and Minnie (Huntington) Partlo.

He was graduated from Alton Public School and later purchased his own home on Maplewood, which he and his wife operated and maintained. Upon selling his home, he purchased a home in Alton, just three blocks away.

He was married to Ruth Dolores Tolosa on June 28, 1939, in Alton, and she predeceased him on Oct. 6, 1987. Later he was married to Jean Miller on Sept. 1, 1989, United Methodist Church on Oct. 14, 1989, and she survives him.

Mr. Partlo was an avid bowler and an active member of Alton United Methodist Church where he served as usher. He was known for his volunteer work as an active member of the Alton community. He was a member of Alton Rotary Club where he had served as president for eight consecutive years, and he was a trustee of Tazewell County Farm Bureau. Upon retirement, he and Mrs. Partlo wintered in Phoenix.

Surviving besides his wife June are one son and wife, Richard and Sandra Partlo of Alton, two daughters and husband, Joyce and David Luttrell of Cape City and Marie Lee Partlo of Santa Rosa, C.A., two sisters, Mrs. (Loyd) Haynes of Mt. Morris and Martha (Harold) Bell of Alton, eight grandchildren and 6 great-grandchildren.

Besides his first wife Ruth, he was predeceased by two brothers, George and Carl, and one sister, Anna.

The funeral service was held Monday afternoon, Jan. 9, in Alton Methodist Church with Rev. Cullen Blue of Cape Methodist Church officiating. Burial was in Evergreen Cemetery, Alton. Braggs-Tanner Funeral Home, Alton, was in charge of funeral arrangements.
