La Loma Luz Adventist Hospital Report

The MPI Board has been interested in expanding opportunities for La Loma Luz Adventist Hospital ("LLL") for a number of years. Contacts were made with Adventist Health International Services ("AHIS"). AHIS is administratively affiliated with a number of SDA Medical Facilities around the world, five of which are within LLL's region of the world. These include Trinidad, Guyana, Venezuela, Honduras and Haiti. AHIS is only authorized to affiliate with Medical Facilities owned by the SDA Church.



At the recent MPI board meeting, it was unanimously voted to transfer the ownership of LLL and its associated facilities to the SDA Church. AHIS has already pre-approved the acceptance of the Country of Belize and La Loma Luz Adventist Hospital to become an affiliate of AHIS, subject to the transfer of the Hospital to the SDA Church.

HOW WILL THIS EFFECT LA LOMA LUZ?

AHIS was established to strengthen Adventist health services throughout the world. AHIS can provide LLL with opportunities that are not available or difficult to achieve otherwise. AHIS will provide governance and management support. They will assist in identifying and obtaining a variety of resources, including, but not limited to, personnel, equipment, donations, and grants. Someday LLL would like to have a School of Nursing.

AHIS will establish an Operating Board for the country of Belize. No single entity will have control of the Hospital. All decisions will be made through this newly created Operating Board. MPI will have representation on the Board and will continue its financial support in behalf of LLL

MPI believes that LLL's affiliation with AHIS will greatly enhance their medical services and medical training. The Hospital will be better equipped to care for the physical and spiritual needs of the people of Belize.

We invite you to partner with us as together we continue to pray and financially support La Loma Luz Adventist Hospital's medical outreach in Belize, Central America.

African Lay Workers

MPI continues to sponsor eight lay workers through Riverside Farms in Zambia, Africa. MPI is especially pleased with this arrangement because of the many hours of practical training they receive, the accountability, and the great results from the work of the lay workers. (There were 2571 baptisms from the 30 lay workers supported thru the Riverside program in 2007!)

Recently Riverside has started a new program through their lay worker training course. It is called the "Timothy" program. This program is a workstudy program made available for students that cannot afford the normal school fees.

The "Timothy" program has become an extension to the already existing lay worker program. Our Lay workers are the "Paul's" who select and send capable "Timothy's" to receive further training at Riverside. After the "Timothy's" graduate they will go back and help the "Paul's" in their district. What a blessing it is to train individuals that come from a specific region to go back to that region to work for Christ.

MPI Shifts Direction in Lay Worker Support

During the past 19 years, MPI has supported a network of laymen throughout Mexico, taking the Gospel to unreached areas. These devoted workers have led more than 14,000 people to Jesus, and established at least 284 new congregations. As we see the increasing intensity of end-time events, the MPI board voted to shift direction and support areas of even greater need.

Yes, many areas within Mexico still haven't been reached. However, Mexico is a country where the work is growing the fastest. Many other parts of the world have vast areas and major people groups who haven't even heard about Jesus. Therefore, MPI is phasing out lay worker support in



Mexico and expanding our team of workers in Africa and Belize. We are currently exploring needs in other areas as well. We will keep you updated as we expand to new places.

This change will multiply the effectiveness of donor contributions as well; the amount needed to support one lay worker in Mexico will support three workers in Africa. We are aware that some of our donors have a deep love in their hearts for the work in Mexico, and we have made provision for that. Any funds specifically designated for Mexico will be used to support workers on the edges of Huichol territory in the northwestern part of the country. Our faithful pastor/pilot Dagoberto Cirilo will oversee these laymen and send us their monthly reports. All other lay worker funds will be used in other parts of the world.
