

#### **How Long Has It Been?**

Almost every piece of equipment comes with an owner's manual or operation and maintenance (O & M) manual. Prescribed services are dictated throughout these books, or you can readily obtain copies of the manufacturers recommended service intervals. Just as simple as changing the oil in your vehicle every 3,000 miles or 3 months (which ever comes first), the length of time before something should be serviced is broken down by a common element...length of time. Whether it is the use of an odometer, hour meter, or start counter, these devices are handy tools when determining when service is required. Using a calendar to determine time between services may actually be less than, or possibly too frequent than, the manufacturer recommends. Therefore, the use of actual timing devices greatly comes into play. Timers also play a big part in determining when a piece of equipment needs to be rebuilt.

New Equipment: When purchasing new equipment, always determine if an hour meter is available. Typically, equipment with microprocessor controls already incorporate timers. Some have capabilities such as total time, operating time, and a re-settable timer. If it is not a function, have one installed or included in the pricing...it will save you from installing later. On some instances, a start counter should be included as well. A tachometer/hour meter on gasoline-powered equipment is another handy device. They're about the size of a small box of matches, have an internal battery, and only require one wire connected to a spark plug.

Existing Equipment: Many styles and types of timing devices are available, from surface or flush mount, to electronic, to mechanical. They will all work; it is just your needs or preferences as to which to install. The only real and critical difference is what voltage is required (6, 12, 24, 120, 208VAC/DC, etc.). Once this has been established for the piece of equipment, it is usually as simple as connecting two wires. For a cleaner installation, flush mounted styles are nice, but use caution...measure twice, measure thrice, cut once! Most 2" installations actually require a special 1-7/8" hole saw! Handy tip: If a caliper is not available for an accurate measurement, punch a sample hole in a piece of scrap to check for fit!

Uses: The use of these devices not only gives you more information about a piece of equipment, but it can also surprise you. For instance, a specific manufacturer of air compressors recommends 2,000 hours between oil changes using the recommended lubricants. There are variables here which make calculating this time difficult without an hour meter. One, it is a duplex system. Two, run time is not continuous. Three, air consumption during the day is different than that of night. Fourth, do both compressors take the same amount of time to reach shut-off pressure once started? Finally, is the existing system under- or over-sized. Go ahead,


do the math. In most instances, a compressor with good valves and rings, no leaks in the pneumatic system, and of proper size may take over 2 years of operation to reach 2,000 hours of service. Now, for some lubricants, this may be too long of a time period between intervals, but if you're using the required lubricant, you should be fine. By abiding by the manufacturer's recommendations, you should easily reach or surpass the expected useful life for this equipment. In addition, you have gathered baseline data that will come in handy later on down the road (i. e., "it used to take one year for 1,000 hours, but now it only takes 6 months" would indicate either a weak compressor or a leaking system).

Drawback: There are many, many benefits from timers, counters, etc., but sometimes, these recorders can come back and bite you! On one instance, a really nice power washer was purchased with all the bells and whistles. After about 8 months of use, it was noted that the pressure was diminishing (this was determined by the optional installation of gauges). No big deal, it's under warranty! About the same period of time once again...decrease in pressure. Sure enough...pump weak and no big deal because it was under warranty. The next time this occurred, a phone call was received. The phone call was to notify the owner that the tachometer/hour meter (an installed option) indicated there were several hundreds of hours on the meter. "Yes, there sure is," was the reply. "The oil and filter are changed in the motor every hundred hours, and the oil is changed in the pump just like the O&M says." The response was that the O&M also stated that the pump had exceeded warranty limitations and required a rebuild at 300-hour intervals...about the same time the unit was in the shop under warranty...Uh-oh! Oops, lets go back to the start of the article regarding the O&M manuals. Did I mention to read all of it?

#### **Are You Prepared?**

The City of San Antonio provides the following information in an effort to encourage citizens to plan for unexpected emergencies. Families with school-age children should be familiar with their school's emergency plan. Although local officials do all they can to help, it is really up to you when it comes to the comfort and safety of you, your loved ones, and your co-workers and tenants.

- Prepare to deal with a terrorist incident by adapting many of the same techniques used to prepare for other crises.
- Be alert and aware of the surrounding area. The very nature of terrorism suggests that there may be little or no warning.
- Take precautions when traveling.
- Be aware of conspicuous or unusual behavior.
- Do not accept packages from strangers.
- Do not leave luggage unattended.
- Learn where emergency exits are located. In an unfamiliar building be aware of your immediate surroundings including your closest exits.
- Be aware of heavy or breakable objects that could move, fall or break in an explosion.
- Review emergency evacuation procedures and know where fire exits are located.
- Create an emergency communications plan with an out-of-town family member or friend that will be unlikely to be affected by the same emergency.
