## AMBC HEALTH MINISTRY GUIDELINES FOR PPE DISTRIBUTION

Our Goal: Evaluate how we can provide the congregation spiritually and emotionally, while continuing to protect our vulnerable populations and reduce the spread of COVID-19.

## **PROTOCOL**

- 1. The Health Team will inspect and sanitize all equipment (Hand Sanitizer Stations and Thermometers) before distributing the thermometers to Ushers to ensure it is operating properly.
- 2. After inspection, a Health Team Member will distribute the Temperature Thermometer and alcohol wipes to the Usher at each entry door.
- 3. The Usher must have mask and gloves on before receiving and handling equipment and supplies.
- 4. Once the equipment has been distributed, the Usher who received the equipment and supplies will be responsible for proper handling (wiping thermometer with alcohol wipes provided after scan of each member) and keeping the equipment safe until picked back up by a Health Team Member at the end of service.
- 5. After all Thermometers have been collected. The Heath Team will be responsible for counting, sanitizing, and ensuring all equipment is stored properly.
- 6. Front entrance is the only doors to remain open.
- 7. If a member has a temperature of 99.5\* the usher will ask them to please step to the side for a moment to explain. The temp requires them to be rechecked.
- 8. There will be an usher stationed outside to recheck temps at the members' car. If the second temperature reading is the same, the usher then has to inform the member that unfortunately they cannot attend Morning Service.

We were made by God with a body, mind, soul, spirit. The greatest command is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength" (Mk. 12:30). And so, a church can minister to the whole person, integrating physical, spiritual, emotional, mental, and social health and wellness.
