Seventy-four students and 6 advisors met together for the day at the Scobey Lutheran Church. Students from Plentywood, Glasgow, Nashua, Medicine Lake and Scobey attended a variety of presentations and workshops and some were lucky enough to tour the homes of Eric Tade and Holly Holm and Dr. Jesse and Holly Cole. The workshops varied from Project Planning – presented by State Officer Karys Lamb, Social Media and the Impact on Mental Wellness – Marissa Freitas – Americorp.

Scobey received a \$1750 grant to formulate a program which included a Speed and Accident Presentation by Ross Tuggle, retired MHP Officer. The grant is sponsored by the Montana Department of Transportation-Vision Zero, Ford Driving Skills for Life, Governor's Highway Safety Association, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and FCCLA. Some funds were used to pay for the guest speaker, lunch and the rental of the Lutheran Church.
