On behalf of the entire AIDSvu project team, I'd like to thank you for serving on our Advisory Committee (AC) from 2010-2012. Your engagement with the project from its inception was instrumental in helping guide AIDSvu's development and expansion over the first couple of years. I am very appreciative of the time you devoted both to AC meetings as well as to meeting with me and other project staff individually to share your ideas and offer guidance. Your perspective as a health department HIV surveillance coordinator was invaluable and we are very glad that we continue to have your expertise on AIDSvu's Technical Advisory Group.

I am pleased to report that AIDSvu continues to grow and this year we will be highlighting the epidemic at the ZIP code level in approximately 20 cities and will be piloting the display of data at the neighborhood level. In addition to the state profiles we currently have on the site, we will be adding city profile pages that will provide data about late diagnoses and transmission categories at the city level. We will also be displaying new HIV diagnosis data on the maps for the first time.

AIDSvu continues to see good traffic to the site with over 150,000 unique visitors in 2012. The addition of downloadable PowerPoint presentations and datasets last year was a large success with over 3,000 downloads to date. As we attend various conferences and meetings we are increasingly seeing AIDSvu images being used to highlight different aspects of the epidemic.

I'd like to reiterate my thanks and appreciation for your significant contributions to AIDSvu. You truly played a large role in helping this project get off the ground and I'm glad you are remaining engaged with the project going forward. I hope your new career endeavors are going well and I look forward to seeing you sometime in the near future.
