Welcome & Introductions (5 minutes) Youth Tri lead-Baltazar Torres	
Meeting Minutes (10 minutes) System Tri lead-Jill Mulhausen	Meeting minutes from October 8, 2020 Motion made by: Balthazar Torres Seconded by: Carolyn Cox Did the vote carry? YES / NO
Lock Box Update	Jill reported getting lock boxes to Crisis Response Lourdes Counseling, Lutheran, TCCH, Catholic Family, and Communities in Schools. They plan to reach out to other counties and include SUD agencies. One lesson learned was to order directly to the organizations rather than a central location and have to deliver. Please let Jill know if you know of any organization who would be interested in lock boxes.
Roundtable	 Jill noted that the State FYSPRT would be taking place and asked for any advocacy issues. She invited anyone to email her with ideas after the meeting. Cindy Adams responded that she would like to see funding continue for WISe, youth services and respite care. Joel asked how telehealth is working and Balthazar answered that it's working for some and not for others, noting getting records is confusing and can take a long time. Elvira said her experience with the Stay Home, Stay Healthy campaign has been that people have appreciated all services including in person and telehealth.

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Closing Announcements and Evaluation (5 minutes)	Joel also noted CHPW is busy with open enrollment and moving into the North Central region. He also reported on progress with developing an SUD Recover Center at the old Kennewick General Hospital building. • Carolyn reported on how well SPARK continues to do; including expansion to Grant and Okanogan Counties, receiving a grant from ACH, four new classes next year, a grand from OSPI, and ongoing work with University of Washington. • DeLeon shared that he is available to support any schools in the community, not just the ESD he works at. • Susan commented on telehealth noting that kids who have intense diagnosis often experience frustration with it. • Mindy agreed with Susan's assessment noting it works well for some and not for others. She noted CLIP work groups are meeting to focus on consistency and streamline with best practices. Gathering resources for aging out. • Edona noted she is in the process of doing a needs assessment with the schools in her role as the Behavioral Health Navigator to identify their needs and gaps. She will also be doing an assessment with the organization and would appreciate any input as to questions to ask those organizations. • Sherry noted that some of the kids are experiencing difficulty and frustration with the Chromebooks and that they are noticing some tech addictions.
