

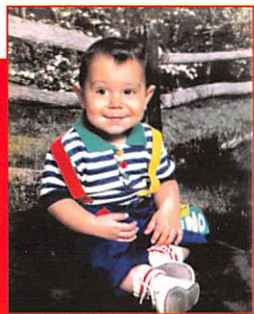
The Children in the Middle Class consists of two parts that may be taken in either order, though we encourage you to attend Part I first.

Frequently Asked Questions

WHEN ARE THE CLASSES AND HOW DO I PAY?

Participants register and pay for classes online. Class schedules are available online at www.childreninthemiddle.com.

WHAT ARE THE FEES?

\$40.00 per person, per part.

WILL MY MONEY BE REFUNDED IF I ARRIVE LATE OR NO SHOW?

No, if you do not arrive, do not cancel at least 24 hours in advance, or if you arrive late your money will not be refunded.

DO I NEED TO PAY IN ADVANCE?

Payment must be paid online at least 24 hours prior to the start of class.

DO I RECEIVE A CERTIFICATE?

Certificates are issued at the completion of each session. Participants must stay the duration of the class to receive a certificate.

ANYTHING ELSE I NEED TO KNOW?

- Do not bring children to the classes.
- We do not have a waiting area for non-participants.
- We do not allow late admission. We encourage you to arrive no later than 15 minutes before class.
- We provide you a workbook and you are welcome to bring paper for notes.
- We do not allow video or audio recording.
- Please turn off cell phones and text message devices during the course.

The Children in the Middle class exceeds the guidelines for co-parenting education in the state of Texas.

Texas Family Code, § 105.009. PARENT EDUCATION AND FAMILY STABILIZATION COURSE

The course must include information on the following issues:

- (1) the emotional effects of divorce on parents;
- (2) the emotional and behavioral reactions to divorce by young children and adolescents;
- (3) parenting issues relating to the concerns and needs of children at different development stages;
- (4) stress indicators in young children and adolescents;
- (5) conflict management;
- (6) family stabilization through development of a co-parenting relationship;
- (7) the financial responsibilities of parenting;
- (8) family violence, spousal abuse, and child abuse and neglect; and
- (9) the availability of community services and resources.
