

Bishop: Has he been selected in accordance with the canons of this Church? And do you believe his manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Presenters: We certify to you that he has satisfied the requirements of the canons, and we believe him to be qualified for this ministry.

All stand.

Bishop: Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Ryan for reception to the sacred priesthood of this Church. Therefore if any of you know any impediment or crime because of which we should not proceed, come forward now, and make it known.

Bishop: Is it your will that Ryan be received a priest in the Episcopal Church? *Congregation:* It is.

Bishop: Will you uphold him in this ministry? *Congregation:* **We will.**

Bishop: In peace let us pray to the Lord.


LESSON Isaiah 6:1-8

The Lesson from the book of the Prophet Isaiah.

But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ; so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the cunning of men, by their craftiness in deceitful wiles. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every joint with which it is supplied, when each part is working properly, makes bodily growth and upbuilds itself in love.

THE SERMON

NICENE CREED

THE REAFFIRMATION OF ORDINATION VOWS AND RECEPTION OF THE PRIEST

All are seated except the candidate, who stands before the Bishop.

Bishop: My brother, the ministry we share is none other than the sacrificial ministry of Christ, who gave himself up to death on the cross for the salvation of the world. By his glorious resurrection he has opened for us the way to everlasting life. By the gift of the Holy Spirit, he shares with us the riches of his grace.

We are called to proclaim his death and resurrection, to administer the Sacrament of the New Covenant which he sealed with his body on the cross, and to care for his people in the power of the Spirit.

Do you in the presence of Christ and his Church, renew your commitment to your priestly ministry, under the pastoral direction of your bishop? *Fr. Ryan*: I do.

Bishop: Do you reaffirm your promise to give yourself to prayer and study?

Fr. Ryan: I do.

- *Bishop:* Do you reaffirm your promise so to minister the Word of God and the Sacrament of the New Covenant that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?
- Fr. Ryan: I do.
- *Bishop:* Do you reaffirm your promise to be a faithful servant of all those committed to your care, patterning your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?
- Fr. Ryan: I do.
- *Bishop:* Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who might have authority over you and your work?
- Fr. Ryan: I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scripture of the Old and New Testament to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary for Salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Episcopal Church.

The candidate then signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present.

Bishop: May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things, give you the grace and the power to perform them.

The Bishop takes the Priest's right hand and says the following:

I welcome you into the priesthood of Christ exercised in this branch of the one, holy catholic, and apostolic Church.

The Bishop then gives him a Bible, saying:

Receive this Bible as a sign of the authority given you to preach the Word of God and to administer his holy sacraments. Do not forget the trust committed to you as a priest of the Church of God. *The Bishop blesses the priest:*

May the blessing of God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit rest upon you now and ever more.

The Bishop greets the newly received priest.

THE PEACE The people may greet one another in the Name of the Lord with a bow or a wave, and then be seated. **THE INTENTIONS OF THE MASS**

All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again:

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, THIS IS MY BODY, which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the Cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for THIS IS MY BLOOD of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins; Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy Divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness, mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee, that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, \stable be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice; yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.
