## Life without a Blankie

**aith can have the look of high dives** and learning to ride a bike without training wheels and life without one's "blankie." All are confrontations with the specter of death asking us to have faith. From youth to old age, our lives seem to be laced with the loss of control, and unless we embrace such moments, not only will we never really grow up, neither will we ever become people of faith who live in the resurrection.

The Easter Gospels are about women and men who arrive at the tomb but hesitate going in; it is the home of death. Yet they become believers after they have entered that home of death and discover it to be abandoned. Over the years, I have become convinced that the only way to become a believer in the resurrection is to walk into the tomb yourself and there discover that where you thought death was present now has been abandoned. That is the pattern of coming to faith.

Usually such moments do not have the look of faith. They tend to seem more akin to death than any promise of new life—like having to move to a new city or a new school, or abandoning an addiction, or confronting a problem through counseling, or aging, or grieving over lost love. They all can have the look of tombs yet they are also where we find the beginnings of new life. Risk it often enough and so discover new life, and we begin to believe in the reality of resurrection—Jesus' and ours.

# Dear Padre,

### Where did the idea of an Easter bunny come from? What about the Easter egg?

The Easter bunny is really a hare which, according to an Egyptian legend, is a symbol of the moon. Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs after the twenty-first day of March. Put this together, and we have an Easter bunny.



Early Christians gave new meaning to the Roman proverb Omne vivum ex ovo, which means, "All life comes from an egg." A hatching chick represented the risen Christ emerging from the shell of a tomb on Easter morning. Consequently, eggs were prohibited during the Lenten fast and were reintroduced at the Easter meal and also shared as decorated gifts. In 1610, a prayer by Pope Paul V blessed the egg "that it may become a wholesome sustenance to Thy faithful servants, eating in thankfulness to Thee, on account of the Resurrection of Our Lord."

In some parts of the world, children carry baskets and torches and sing Easter carols as they go from place to place. They are given brightly colored eggs to put in their baskets. In other places, eggs are carried to church and blessed by the priests. The eggs are taken home and placed in the center of the table as the main dish at the Easter feast. Visitors to the house during Easter week are offered this sacred food of the resurrection. Happy Easter! The Redemptorists / DearPadre.org


#### **ICS Recruitment Committee**

#### **Divine Mercy Sunday**

#### 3:00pm April 7, 2024

Divine Mercy Sunday is a beautiful Feast Day celebrated within the Catholic Church on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is originally based on the Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy that Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska reported as part of her encounter with Jesus. Pope John Paul both canonized Sister Faustina Kowalska and declared in his homily of that day his own desire that the Second Sunday of Easter be designated Divine Mercy Sunday. He wanted to make this Feast Day a special "refuge and shelter" for the "consolation" of souls.

In Diary entry 1517, Jesus said: "the Feast of My Mercy has issued forth from My very depths for the consolation of the whole world". In short, Jesus gave us this Feast as both a comfort and a lifeline for souls.

Jesus said to St. Faustina: (Diary entry 699).

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout eternity.

Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy."

From these words of our Lord, it should be clear who is invited to the Feast of Mercy.

On this day, Jesus promised to open the floodgate of his inexhaustible mercy and shower abundant grace on those who participate in this feast day.

A plenary indulgence is granted to those who obtain the Sacrament of Confession (either 8 days before the feast day or 8 days after), receive Holy Communion on the feast day, and prays for the intentions of the Holy Father. {A plenary indulgence is where ALL temporal punishment is removed from the soul- complete forgiveness of sin AND punishment-Praise God, Halleluiah!}.
