



Carrying the Cross By Leona Rudolph

It is the second Sunday of Lent. Lent is a time of prayer, reflection and almsgiving. It is a time

when we as Christians acknowledge the great sacrifice that Christ made on our behalf and when we make a sacrifice of our own in our efforts to emulate and revere him. Hence, during Lent we are able to grasp the magnitude of Christ's sacrifice in our efforts to sacrifice our time, finances and or desires.

However, it is not only during Lent that we experience times of sacrifice or a loss. Rather, these occurrences happen in our daily lives. We may experience financial hardship, or the illness of a loved one that may cause us to make sacrifices that may prove to be unwanted or inconvenient. However, 2 Timothy 1:8b-10 encourages us to accept these occurrences as our own cross to carry, as it is written, "Beloved: Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God". 2Timothy 1:8b-10 demonstrates that we will have help along the way as we carry our own crosses. Just as Simon was there to help Jesus carry his cross, God always provides us with the help that we need to make it through our trials and tribulations. Oftentimes, it is when we fall that we gain a greater dependence on God and it is by His grace, that although we may fall and go astray, He is always there to see us through and to bring us to what he has promised for us.

Hence, it is imperative that we gain an understanding that in this life we will encounter hardship, disappointment and our own cross. Like the human part of Christ we hope, wish, and pray that these occurrences will bypass us. However, like Christ our Savior, we must take up our crosses and rely on the strength that comes from our Father as it is made evident in 2Timothy 1:8b-10.

KNOW YOUR FAITH

INDULGENCE Fr. Stephen Sohe



Indulgence originally meant kindness or favor. It is later used to express release from captivity or punishment. In Catholic theology it is used to mean remission of temporal punishment due to sin. When we sin, we separate ourselves from God's friendship with us. The result of this

separation is the eternal damnation in Hell. When we separate ourselves from God's friendship we invariably attach ourselves to worldly things, or other creatures. In other words, we attach ourselves to evil, the work of the Devil. The loss of our friendship with God condemns us to eternal punishment in Hell, while our attachment to this world condemns us to temporal punishment.

When we approach God in the sacrament of reconciliation with a contrite heart and a humble spirit, we return to the friendship of God, which never fails nor ends. However, our attachment to the world may remain.

The temporal punishment resulting from such an attachment necessarily awaits us either in this world or in purgatory. To enter the Kingdom of God, we must purify ourselves of this punishment. This purification can be attained, in part, in this world through our nearness to God in prayers, penance, and works of charity. The purification could also be attained through indulgence, which is the remission of temporal punishment due to sin.

It is important to note that indulgence is not a ticket or a free pass to commit sin. It is not the forgiveness of future sin. It is not an exemption from the law. It is not like buying forgiveness, nor is it a payment for salvation. Indulgence is rather an "extra-sacramental remission of the temporal punishment due, in God's justice, to sin that has been forgiven".
