Here are some of the duties of Club Secretary:


- Record the Minutes of the monthly Executive and Membership meetings and distribute them by email.



#### **Ron Fellows Performance Driving School**

Carl and Susan Gomes flew to Las Vegas on Friday, Sept. 8<sup>th</sup>, picked me up at the airport on Monday, Sept. 11<sup>th</sup>, and we drove through the desert for about one hour west of Vegas to the Ron Fellows School in Pahrump, Nevada.

Carl and I started our 2 day class the next day and we still can't get the smiles off our faces when we think about it.

The facilities are first class, the track we used was great, and the Instructors (all current or former race car drivers) were exceptional!

On mid-morning the first day, we were split into 2 main groups of 10 per group (and then each group divided further into groups of 3 or 4 Corvettes.) Following this, each small group of drivers hit the track following their instructor.

The first two laps familiarized us with the "east" track and then the Instructor told everyone (via in-car radio) to ramp up the pace. Each driver in the group got a chance to chase the Instructor for 3 laps. I didn't realize it but during the chase the instructor was checking our skill level, our abilities, and our comfort level. As each driver had their chance to follow the instructor, he would slowly bring us past our comfort level and pushed us towards our potential. This happened every time we were on the track for both days. The Instructors seem to have an uncanny knack at determining how far they could challenge each one of us. Ronnie you're safe...we didn't hurt any of your cars.

The Instructors changed the small group of drivers throughout the first day in an attempt to keep the drivers with similar skill and ability levels in the same groups so one driver doesn't slow down the rest.

The second day the group was divided into two groups again with one group having the fastest times. (Not surprisingly, in the fast group 8 of the 10 cars were Z06's and the other two were drivers with track experience.). Carl and I were in the second group but in the fastest group of 4. Again, the Instructors continued to find the best in all of us.

Turn 2 gave me trouble for the first few session. You enter the right hand #2 after the 90-100 mph longest straight. It is a 45-50 mph long turn which immediately becomes off camber (the left side of the track is quite a bit lower than the right side) with another right turn apex 40 yards ahead before the track levels out for a straight run uphill. (Highest elevation on the track).

I was having a tough time finding the best line through this corner until Cory, one of the instructors, talked me through the following technique: as you are at the turn 2 apex (point in a corner where you can start applying throttle) nail the throttle quickly (& briefly) and head for the lower left side of the track. (You feel like you are falling downhill.) When you are almost off the track, turn the wheel slightly to the right, feather the throttle, and the application of the throttle will bring you up to the next apex in the turn. The first time I tried it I was a little concerned I would go off the track but it worked perfectly. This turn became my favourite part of the track and I was able to hit 95 mph at the top of this hill. I don't get high on drugs - - I get high driving Corvettes fast.

We got out of the cars on both days, after each track session, with the biggest grins and we still have them when we think of our time there. This wasn't something I had on my bucket list but only because I didn't know how much fun it was. With hindsight, this should have been at the top of my list.

I can't say enough about this course in general and the Instructors in particular. These guys put the FUN in phenomenal!

If you get the chance to do it, go for it. We can highly recommend it. This is the most fun I've ever had in a car in my life! (Sorry, Judy).

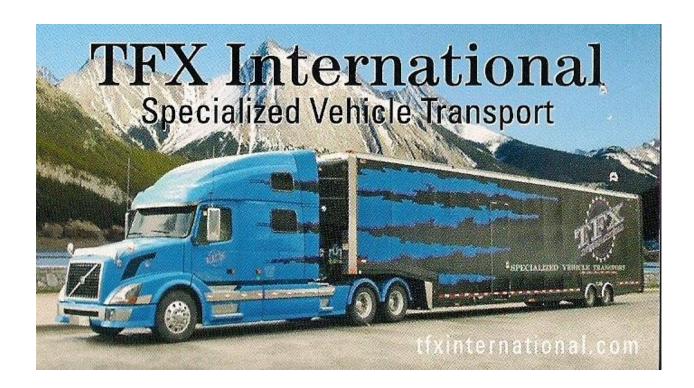

Back on September 24<sup>th</sup> at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca in Monterey, California, No. 3 drivers Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen took a huge step toward the GT Le Mans (GTLM) Driver's title. Although they ended that race in fourth-place in their class, they only need to *start* the 10-hour Petit Le Mans race to officially claim the GTLM championship. In addition, Chevrolet extended its lead by four points at Laguna Seca in the GTLM Manufacturer's Championship.

Magnussen began the race 7<sup>th</sup> in class. The team's qualifying strategy paid off in the race as did a timely full-course caution around the halfway point in the two-hour, 40-minute race. By the time the race resumed after the caution, he was in 2<sup>nd</sup> and with the overall championship in mind, the No. 3 team elected to stay with a strategy that ensured the No. 3 Corvette would finish ahead of its closest title contenders. And it did!

Tommy Milner and Oliver Gavin had another run of bad luck in the No. 4 Corvette, ending in 9<sup>th</sup> place after being hit from behind at the first corner of the opening lap! The contact damaged the Corvette's rear diffuser, which impacted the handling and performance throughout.
