

When you get to South 1st walk south to W. Annie St. to The "Austin" Mural. From Jo's Coffee to the Austin mural is 7/10s of a mile.





Lighting for Digital Photography Saturday August 19, 2017 at 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM

at the Austin Yarborough Public Library Branch, 2200 Hancock Dr., Austin, TX, 78756

Digital still photographers need quality light to produce quality images. If the existing light is not of a sufficient quality, artificial light and/or light modifiers must be employed. The experienced photographer will control several characteristics of the light on the set, including the Quantity, Quality, Color, Direction and Shape of the light.

ASC President Brian Loflin will bring this presentation as an explanation of many of the tools, accessories and materials of lighting, including a discussion and demonstration of their use. Cameras will not be required as this is not a photo session, per se; however, photos of the equipment may be made, if desired.

Brian is a highly-qualified commercial and advertising photographer with more than five decades of experience under his belt, shooting for some of the world's largest corporations and international publications. Today, though actually retired, he continues to serve the aviation and medical industry and spends his time producing images of Texas natural science for books and other publications as well as teaching photography and sharing his passion with others.





Evaluation and Review was held. President Loflin talked about the purpose of evaluation and review being threefold: to educate, to learn how to make better pictures, and to provide tools to grow as a photographer.

Further, he told us that photos are judged on several criteria: Impact - does the image stimulate the viewer; Composition - how well are the elements organized within the frame; and Technical Merit. Brian explained that in judging an image will fall into one of three categories: Exceptional, Distinctive, and Needs Improvement i.e., the image does not meet standards of a competition photograph. An image must meet the definition for the Assignment image or it will be disgualified. In addition, the assignment image must have been taken after the assignment subject was announced.

The Assignment category for this month is "Circles." All entries, general and assignment, were shown and the review of each was presented by President Loflin. After a brief question and answer session, President Loflin challenged us to go out and work on assignment images...to "get out of your comfort zone, push the envelope."

The next meeting is August 3 and the speaker is Alex Wild.

Tonight's meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m.

May 19-21 • September 28-October 1, 2017
