As often happens, this year mid-February juxtaposes two powerful events: Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. Our culture lavishly (but briefly) gushes about the romantic love that is mostly merchandised on Feb. 14, but the Divine Love exhibited throughout Lent? Not so much – if at all. Perhaps a brief mention of dieting and human self-denial pops up, but what a tragedy that Lent's 40 days are so often overlooked as a profound time to marvel at the love of God for lost, unlovely humanity. I personally think that some of the greatest love songs ever written are included in Lent's hymnody, like this line from LSB #425 (When I Survey the Wondrous Cross) "See, from His head, His hands, His feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down! Did e'er such love and sorrow meet...?" Or the truth expressed in LSB #437 (Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed) "Amazing pity, grace unknown, and love beyond degree!"

Truly those are poetic tributes to Jesus' words in John 15: 13 "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." For more amazing still, Jesus considered us friends when we by nature considered Him our worst enemy: Romans 5:6, 8 "You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly....But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." What an amazing, unfathomable love and compassion God has for us, to pay for our sins and guilt with His own life and forgive us completely, opening Paradise to us as adopted children of God by faith! This love transforms and fills us and enables us to finally love God in return and our fellow humans beings, per 1 John 4:19 "We love because He first loved us." And while our love and sacrificial giving to God and others can never reach the heights and depths of His love for us, we gladly pour our new, redeemed lives out in gratitude (see 1 John 4:7, 11, 21). Thus as LSB # 437 concludes: "Here Lord, I give myself away: 'Tis all that I can do."

It means that something that youth has been taught suddenly goes from just been words they've heard over and over again to something that makes sense and they start to understand.

In youth group, those moments are always amazing. There was one that happened last Wednesday ago that really struck me. We have been working through a Bible study called 'Fierce'. The theme of the study is what does it mean to have a fierce faith in today world. The story that was the focus on the lesson was the fiery furnace. We were looking at what it means to stand up for your faith no matter what the situation or the consequences. In the story, Shadrack, Meshack and Abednego all knew the consequences for disobeying the king and not bowing down to the false gods or the golden idol the king had set up. Yet, when they are called to the king they don't back down instead, they stand up to the king.

As a result of their defiance the king heated the furnace seven times hotter then normal and had them thrown in. Now for those that know the story you know what comes next. Instead of three charred bodies when the king looks in he sees 4 men walking around, one of them shining. God had saved the men that day! After we finished reading the story we were discussing it. I simply stated that these men had such fierce faith that they were willing to defy a king and be killed rather then turn away. One of the youth all of a sudden got this thinking face and then looked at the group and said, "that's scary, they were wiling to die for their faith". It lead to a great discussion about what they agree to in their confirmation. Many of them admitted they had never thought about it like that or had even forgotten what was said during the confirmation rite.

It's always just amazing to see how God uses a simple story we've heard a thousand times to get the wheels turning.

The gift of Jesus

"For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch" (Is. 62:1).

For too long stewardship has been a quiet thing, often thought of as something only between "me and Jesus." Silent stewardship is less than faithful. In a desire to not want to seem "holier than thou" or that we are trying to make ourselves look better than we really are, we miss out on a powerful component of stewardship of the Gospel. Silent stewardship isn't as contagious as visible stewardship.

Silent stewardship flies in the face of our call to make disciples of all nations. If someone had a cure for cancer but kept it to themselves, this selfishness would be viewed as criminal. To know how to end suffering and death and doing nothing to share it would be the height of irresponsibility.

In the same way, the steward can't keep silent! Now, this is not a call to make stewardship about us. Faithful stewardship is always about Jesus. But to hide the stewardship of the light of the Gospel under the bushel basket of false humility is not good either. As faithful stewards today, we visibly live out our stewardship in such a way that points to Jesus.

The message of Jesus and the righteousness He has won for us is a torch that burns brightly in our sin-darkened world. While not talking about amounts and effort in stewardship, it is about pointing to the sufficiency of Jesus and His stewardship of His life, death and resurrection for us. As we live as faithful stewards of creation and joyfully crediting it all to the Lord, others see it. In this, they too will see Jesus and His righteousness for them! We can't keep this quiet!

Prayer Lord of creation, Your voice thundered into chaos and created everything we have. Your Word became flesh and we beheld glory. By Your grace, do not allow us to remain silent in proclaiming the Gospel. Lead us to be faithful and generous stewards. In this, keep us from being silent as You lead us to point others to Jesus so that they know the joy that has been freely given to us. Amen


