
Honoring Our History & Our Future


SPECIAL ENTERTAINMENT

Gale Gradus



Gale was born in NYC but grew up a South Jersey Girl! As a teenager, her family had the opportunity to move to Europe; first to The Netherlands and then to Belgium. There, she graduated from the International School of Brussels in 1973. During these formative years, her "soul" was fed rich cultural and ethnic diversity. Included in the mix was a summer working as a volunteer on Kibbutz Rosh Hanikrah.

Gale moved back to the States to attend Boston University, School of Nursing. Obtaining her BSN in 1977, she worked full-time holding both Clinical and Management positions. Her primary passions were Woman's Health, Pain Management and being the Nurse Manager of the OR at Hospital for Special Surgery, NYC.

On Christmas Eve 1987, Gale met Nyles at the Tunnel Disco in NYC, during a Jewish Singles dance billed as the "First Annual Latke and Snow Ball." Love and marriage ensued, followed by two baby carriages. (Brenna and Halley!) Their dreams of parenthood were made possible by the blessings of Assisted Reproductive Technology.

Gale worked the night shift and slept while the kids were at school. When college "emptied the nest," along came the big decision: Where to go Using their GPS (Gradus for retirement? Positioning System), they set their compass to Phoenix. After 25 years, they left Bergen County, NJ, saying good-bye to friends and family and left for the "Wild West." Not knowing anybody in the Valley of the Sun, they discovered Brandeis. Jumping in, they registered for many Study Groups and became Co-Facilitators of Lunchtime Theater. Team Gradus was asked to join the Board as Members at Large followed by Gale joining the Membership Committee. From there, Gale was honored to step up to become Co-VP of Membership.

Gale's other passions include cooking, sewing, quilting and nature photography.





Carol Kadet



Self-described as "Mother, Grandmother, Writer, Marketeer, Entrepreneur, Volunteer, Genealogy Buff, Friend," Carol was born in Springfield, IL and moved to Phoenix while in elementary school. She is a product of Phoenix schools and earned a BS degree in Demographics and English at ASU.

She met her late husband, Rick, at the Phoenix JCC while still in high school. Out of college, she was a writer for an advertising agency and started a family. After moving to Schenectady, Carol was a columnist for a weekly newspaper. Additional career moves took the family to Iowa, New Jersey, Rhode Island, Minnesota, and Northern California.

While in the Philadelphia area, Carol earned an MBA from Drexel University, triggering a 35-year career in technology. She was one of a handful of women in technology sales, and later held positions as Director of Inside Sales, Business Development and Director of Content for software companies in Philadelphia, Providence, and Silicon Valley before retiring in 2015.

Carol founded and managed an engraving company, certified woman-owned, in RI, and served on the board of the Newport County Chamber of Commerce and co-founded a women's networking group.

Always a "joiner," Carol served as president of BBG, AEФ Sorority, multiple congregational Sisterhoods, and AAUW. In the 1970's, she was president of the Des Moines County, IA Planned Parenthood and was named the Burlington, IA "Young Woman of the Year" in 1976. She started a Religious School in Iowa and, when one was established in RI, served as treasurer and by-laws chair.

She served as chair of fundraising and programming committees for several organizations and served on her synagogue board of trustees while in CA.

After Rick was killed in biking accident and she retired, Carol moved back to Arizona. Her family includes a daughter, two sons and several grandsons and granddaughters.

Honoring Our History

The *Honoring Our History* team was saddened to hear that Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg passed away in September, on Erev Rosh Hashanah. Justice Ginsburg visited Brandeis Supreme Court in 1993. In 1996 she accepted an honorary degree and was a keynote speaker at the celebration of the 100th anniversary of namesake Louis D. Brandeis' ascension to the Supreme Court. We encourage you to click on the link to listen to the speech. Hearing her express how Justice Brandeis was so influential to her and others is inspiring. Brandeis president Ron Leibowitz wrote a letter to the Brandeis community in her memory. Supreme Court Justice Breyer said that "The world is a better place for having her in it."

As a tribute to her memory, this month *Honoring Our History* is highlighting a collection from the Brandeis Jewish Feminism Collection. Ruth Bader Ginsburg was a feminist icon. Her fight for women's rights led to the enactment of many landmark Supreme Court decisions.

One of the rich collections related to Jewish feminism is the Aviva Cantor Papers. This collection consists of research materials, records relating to organizations and conferences, publication drafts and correspondence, and recordings, all broadly related to Aviva Cantor's work as a feminist activist, particularly dealing with women's roles and feminist issues within Judaism.

Aviva Cantor is a Jewish feminist activist, scholar, and author. Cantor was born on February 12, 1940 in the Bronx, New York. After receiving degrees from Barnard College and from Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism, she worked as a reporter for the Jewish Chronicle. In the late 1960s, she became active within the Jewish Zionist movement and within the feminist movement, and quickly emerged as one of the leading voices in Jewish feminist circles. Cantor was a cofounder of the Jewish Liberation Project in 1968 and was the founding editor of its publication, the *Jewish Liberation Journal*. In 1976, she helped found the Jewish feminist magazine *Lilith*, serving as an editor and a contributing writing until 1987.

Cantor was involved with several national and international Jewish feminist organizations and projects, and has been especially active in researching and writing about women in Israel. Her best known publications include Jewish Women/Jewish Men: The Legacy of Patriarchy in Jewish Life (1995), The Jewish Woman Bibliography (1986) and The Egalitarian Hagada (1991). Cantor continues to work as an activist, writer, and editor in New York.


