Regular Meeting Minutes, 8 November, 2017

Our last meeting was held on Wednesday, November 8, 2017 from 6-8 pm at the HobbyTown store in the Publix Shipping Center (North Pointe Shopping Center), Two Notch Road, Columbia (NE). We had 17 members in attendance, including junior member Morgan Cicimurri. The modelers brought 6 models for Show & Tell, plus Daniel Karnes sent pictures of his AFV Club M60A2 a few

days later because he couldn't make the meeting. We didn't hold a Raffle this month. Please see our website for photos of the models that were brought in for Show & Tell, and the meeting.

Business items:

- 1) Treasurer's Report: No Change. Bank balance of \$5,287 + ~\$65 cash-on-hand = approx. total treasury \$5,352. Ralph Nardone, Chapter Treasurer, was absent due to business.
- 2) Rebecca and Tony said that they were traveling to the RDU Con show on Saturday, 11 November. They offered to take some basic show flyers along with copies of our vendor solicitation letter to start promoting our June, 2018 contest. Mike Roof will send them a digital copy of the vendor letter to print and distribute. The club will reimburse the cost of the printing.
- 3) Updates on our 2018 show preparations were made:
 - a. The event title has been decided: "South Carolina Scale Model Mega-Show".
 - b. Draft show posters have been made by Jeff Nelson (AMPS) and Jodie Peeler (IPMS).
 - c. Tim Darrah has begun to officially solicit vendors for the show. Vendor tables will be \$30 each for 8' long tables. Please refer any vendor contacts to Tim, or get the vendor's contact info and pass it on to him for action.
 - d. A coordination meeting between the AMPS and IPMS clubs has been tentatively scheduled for Sunday, 19 November. The time was set for 2pm and Brandon gave his OK to hold the meeting at the HobbyTown.
- 4) The club voted to conduct a trip to tour the NACM in January, 2018.
 - a. The date, Saturday, 20 January was selected.
 - b. Mike will contact our POC, David Hobbs, to coordinate.

- 5) The club discussed and voted to repeat our donation to the NACM building fund for this year (2017)?
 - a. The decision was made to do the same thing as last year (\$250 club donation with ten, \$25 individual donations for a total of \$500)?
 - b. The members approved that if we have more than 10 members who would like to make individual donations, we will have to structure the donation so that the club donation is \$300 vice \$250. That means that we will need at least 12 individual donors. We could go as high as 20 individual donors in that case, although there might be a limit as to how much the club can donate / match. \$300 would have to be the minimum, though.
 - c. All members were informed that FIRM commitments have to be made by all of the individual donors. The club will have to pay the full amount up-front with the individual donors reimbursing the club.
 - d. Mike will contact the NACM fund raising POC and arrange the donation if the vote is to do this.
 - e. A reminder was made that our real support of the NACM is recognized and that it sets us apart from most of the other folks who ask for special tours without giving anything back to the museum.
- **6)** The floor was opened for new business:
 - a. The club voted to hold our usual Christmas Party in lieu of a regular meeting next month, Wednesday, 13 December at our usual time and location.
 - b. We will do a "White Elephant" gift exchange with a "pot luck" buffet.

Tentative Agenda, Regular Meeting, 13 December, 2017

Our next regular meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 13, 2017, 6-8 pm, at the HobbyTown store in the Publix Shopping Center (North Pointe Shopping Center), on Two Notch Road, Columbia (NE).

Tentative Agenda Business items:

- 1) Treasurer's Report: Major Expenditure \$700 paid to the NACM Paver Program Fund, of which \$400 will be paid back by the 16 members that pledged \$25 each.
 - a. **Total Treasury** = \$4,472.00.
 - b. **Bank Balance** = \$4,407.00.
 - c. **Cash on Hand** = \$65.00 (with treasurer).
- 2) Note next month, January 2018, starts our new fiscal year. Club dues will be due starting then. Dues are \$12 for adults, no dues for juniors 17 y.o. and under. New member dues are pro-rated at \$1 per month remaining in the calendar (fiscal) year you joined the club (first meeting month is not counted). Juniors who turn 18 will not be required to pay dues until the next calendar (fiscal) year.

- **3)** Note, if you are one of the 16 members who pledged to make a \$25 donation to the NACM Paver Fund, please give your money to the treasurer starting in January. Please pay your pledge as soon as possible.
- **4)** Note that we have been approved to conduct a club visit of the NACM restoration facility at Ft. Benning, GA (Columbus, GA) starting at 9AM on Saturday, 20 January. Many of us are staying at the Holiday Inn Express on Victory Drive on Friday and Saturday nights, 19/20 Jan. If you want to participate, you must be with the group at 9AM when we conduct our entry at the fort. For more information, contact Mike Roof ASAP.
- **5)** Note minutes from the AMPS / IPMS show committee meeting, 2-4PM, 19 Nov. There were 6 combined committee members at the meeting Mike Roof, Ralph Nardone, Jeff Nelson, Tim Darrah, Hub Plott and Pete Maher.
 - a. Mike will check with the venue to determine if we must have RCSD provided security.
 - b. Mike will check the advertising rates for the Go Columbia and Free Times.

 - 1. Adults \$15 with 3 models (\$4 each additional model)
 - 2. Juniors (17 and younger) \$6 with 3 models (\$4 each additional)
 - 3. AMPS National Member Discount \$2
 - iii. General Admission (GA) Adults \$5 ea. Juniors FREE. If we place ads in the local newspapers, we MAY include a discount coupon for GA with the adverts.
 - iv. Duel registration (AMPS and IPMS) base fees (\$15 or \$6) and all GA take will be split 50:50.
 - e. Entrants must provide their own display table for any models / entries that exceed 48" in any dimension.
- **6)** There will be no Regular or New Business.
- 7) Nor will we hold a Round Table Discussion.

8) Regular Show & Tell: Instead we will conduct our Annual Christmas Party and White Elephant gift exchange. Anyone who wishes to participate should bring a wrapped, hobby-related gift. Participation is entirely voluntary. Complete rules are below.

MERRY CHRISTMAS and HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!

White Elephant Gift Exchange Rules:

For the gift exchange, if you want to participate, bring a wrapped, hobby-related gift to the party. Participation is not mandatory (but having fun is!).

All of these gifts will go into a pile, and each person participating will draw a number from a hat.

In numerical order, each participant has the option to, EITHER select a gift from the pile and unwrap it, OR to "steal" another gift already selected and unwrapped by someone else. If a gift is "stolen," then the loser has the option to either "steal" a gift from someone else or take a wrapped gift from the pile and unwrap it.

Gifts can only be stolen ONCE DURING A ROUND, and a round continues until EITHER the last loser choses to select a wrapped gift from the pile OR when every unwrapped gift has exchanged hands ONCE at which time the last loser MUST select a wrapped gift. A gift stolen in an earlier round may be stolen in any later round. Just because you stole it once doesn't mean it's safe from being stolen by someone else in a later round.

The rounds will continue until there are no more wrapped gifts. Once this has happened, there will be one final round when participant #1 will have an opportunity to "exchange" (swap) or stay pat. If participant #1 opts to exchange, then he or she will exchange his or her gift for another one. The person who had to exchange may also stay pat or exchange the gift he or she just received with someone else. This final round will continue until every gift has changed hands one final time OR WHEN ANYONE decides to stand pat and not to exchange.

You may include a card or note with your gift, if you so choose, but if you do, you should attach it to the outside (or put it inside the box, etc.) of your gift before you wrap it so that it will stay with the gift through the various rounds.

Finally, for this year, I have been contacted by someone in the club who has asked for a one-time exception to the "unwrap it" rule. He explained what he wants to do, and I have granted this exception - just for this year - to see how it works out. If it goes as hoped, then maybe we'll see about making it a "standing rule," and if it flops - you can all blame me! I'll explain how this will work at the party, but for now, I just wanted to give everyone advance notice (warning!? LOL!).

No other exceptions this year - we don't want things to get totally out of hand! - so don't ask! :-)



Interesting Articles – Up Armoured M4A3E8

My vision of an Up Armoured M4A3E8 which was a collaboration between the US and German army. In 1946 after Hitler's suicide, the German army surrendered and joined forces and fought against the hordes of Soviet armour which was on a giant push to gain control of Europe. To stem the flow of Russian medium tanks the collaboration drew up rushed plans to combine the reliability of the Sherman with Armour knowledge from German tank designers. A main 75mm high velocity gun, which was planned for the upcoming E-50 tank, was modified and squeezed into the turret. The turret was finished off with add-on armour and a heavily modified gun mantlet. Adding another layer of armour with added angle to deflect armour piercing shells to the frontal glacis plate was a must. A heavily armoured transmission cover was installed too to complete the armour package.

I used Tamiya's E8 kit with Tasca HVSS T84 tracks alongside a recent release from John Osselaer @ Paper Panzer Productions. Aber took care of the photoetch parts and Legends' resin fury aftermarket stowage set finished off the build.



I would like to thank John Osselaer for the product support and the use of this awesome set for the Sherman E8.



AMMO of Mig has come out with a new book in their camouflage profile guide series on the M4 Sherman. I waited until I saw that Mega Hobby had it in stock, for \$27, as last time I ordered directly from Mig in Spain, the postage was the same as the cost of the book!!

So what is this book about and how much does it cover? If you want details on the M4, get the Hunnicutt book or Son of Sherman; if you want color profiles to provide inspiration on your next build, this book is for you. It is 80 pages long with 4 pages devoted to the identifying the M4 series by covering the hull, turret and suspension types.



Then you'll find 3 pages showing the different paints used for camouflages with 23 printed paint chips advertising the AMMO by Mig paint sets now out, for US Army, US Marine Corps, Russian and British vehicles.







Now the fun begins with 68 pages of profiles spread-out in different chapters covering North Africa & Middle East, Italy, the UK, France, Low Countries, Germany 1945, Free French vehicles, Soviet vehicles, Beutepanzer Shermans, Knocked out vehicles and Pacific Theater. In these 68 pages you'll get 187 color profiles and 12 photos showing some very interesting camo schemes.

They do have a short paragraph at the beginning of the book saying that "if the reader has questions, you can request additional information regarding photos used as reference" about the vehicle. So this should help us get the bonus half point for research.

While I was not impressed with AMMO by Mig's "DAK" book, I am very happy with this book.


The USA Historical AFV Register

"For those who are interested in preserved AFVs or photographing them for research, here's a link to the latest issue of the AFV Register Organization's "The USA Historical AFV Register."

The register is broken down by state and city, with the AFVs listed along with their exact locations (to include GPS lat/long coordinates). This is a good list to keep saved on your computer.

If you travel around you can plan accordingly (look up your travel destination or itinerary stops to see what interesting AFVs might be there), and if you need reference material on a particular vehicle, you can often contact one of your "virtual" friends online who lives near an exhibit to take some pictures for you".


