



This Quarter started off with the major event of the year for me, which was the Arlington Wreath Laying Ceremony.



Past Potentate Milton O. Olsen passes away

Mahi has lost another one of its past leaders. Illustrious Sir Milton O. Olsen, Past Potentate of Mahi in 2001, passed away on November 13, 2016. Olsen and Lady Leah had retired and were living in the Rainbow Springs community west of Ocala for the past several years.

Olsen was born in St. Paul, Minnesota in 1928. He attended public schools and joined the army after graduation leaving as a Master Sergeant. He later attended Rassessman Business College majoring in Business Administration and Business Law. After college he worked at a major distillery in the Twin Cities area and then decided to go into business for himself. Olsen bought two bowling

alleys with restaurants and lounges. He kept his business interests until retiring and moving to Florida in 1985.

He became a Mason in Minnesota in 1953 and joined the Scottish Rite and Osman Shriners in St. Paul. He was very active in the Legion of Honor and served as Head of the Units and Circus Chairman. Upon joining Mahi in 1994 he continued to be active focusing his efforts as President of the Gold Coast Shrine Club in 1996. He was elected Oriental Guide in 1997 and as Potentate in 2001.

Olsen is survived by his wife Leah, sons Douglas, Jon and Jeff and daughter Deborah, also stepsons Nick and John and stepdaughter Terry Lea as well as many grandchildren and great grandchildren.


