September 10 Corvair Atlanta/Heart of Georgia Roosevelt Run

Instead of a formal meeting in September, both Heart of Georgia Corvairs and Corvair Atlanta will meet for an informal get-together I am officially designation the **"Roosevelt Run."** We will extend this invitation to Vulcan Corvairs too in case some of the "Alabama Boys" want to come. They have a few members closer than some of the other clubs.

We will meet in Pine Mountain, GA in front of the tourist information center at 101 Broad Street at the corner of North Commerce Avenue. Pine Mountain is very small, and you would be arriving on Highway 27, which is 50 feet away from the adjacent North Commerce Avenue. Parking is ample in the area, and I would recommend arriving a while before our *scheduled 12:30 departure* to explore a few of the local shops or have an ice cream.

At 12:30, we will leave and our ultimate destination will be the Bulloch House Restaurant in Warm Springs, GA <u>https://www.bullochhouse.com/</u>. Saturday's typical buffet includes Catfish and Fried Chicken plus more-than-any-of-us-can-eat "good ol" southern sides! We will have an hour to get there for our 1:30 reservation which will give us plenty of time for a spectacular 20+/_ mile ride. (They close at 3.)

I have been this route many times and still love the drive. We will head south from Pine Mountain on US highway 27 adjacent to the beautiful Callaway Gardens Resort <u>https://www.callawaygardens.com/</u> then start the climb up Pine Mountain. When we get to highway 190, we will go west approximately 15 miles climbing to approximately 1000 feet and enter F.D. Roosevelt state park. The highway is a 35 to 45mph winding highway with many overlooks providing a spectacular view of 20 to 30 miles in places (unusual for anywhere in Georgia) <u>https://gastateparks.smugmug.com/FD-Roosevelt-State-Park/</u>. Please open the previous link for a preview. There are several vantage points with great personal and Corvair photo ops, and we will stop at a few, with the most spectacular being Dowdell's Knob near the Warm Springs end of the route. This was FDR's personal picnic spot, and for good reason! You can sit on a bench and take your picture with him there.



We will leave this continuing on 190- west then turn north on GA 85 descending the 10% grade into Warm Springs, making a final right at the traffic light on Main Street arriving at the Bulloch House on the right. Lunch reservations will be at 1:30. *Bring an appetite and \$20 per person cash (not cards etc.).* This includes the buffet and gratuity. The restaurant requested this for a large group as it uncomplicates the payment process with a large group and their limited staff. It is also a discount from their regular rate which you will be charged if you don't bring cash.

Also <u>bring an additional \$5 cash</u> which must be paid through the honor system at the first stop we make in the park. There are boxes where you put the money in an envelope and detach a pass for your car. Fines apply if this isn't paid. It is used to defray the costs of the 3 people who have to maintain this 9000 acre park!



After lunch, we are closer to home for most Heart of Georgia and Corvair Atlanta members than if we had run this in the other direction, But Warm Springs is full of little touristy shops, and the Little White House museum is about a mile away, where FDR spent as much relaxation time as possible. If you have not been to the museum, you will be amazed what you will learn about New Deal programs where the test bed was right here in Georgia in Pine Mountain Valley. Also, why do you think the March of Dimes is not the March of Nickles?? People will be free to do what they wish, though if you haven't been there, I highly suggest the Little White House, FDR's getaway spot. I have been probably ten times and still learn something new every trip. They close at 4:45 PM daily. I did not check the entry fee, but it is reasonable.

We hope to see you there! If you can't drive your Corvair, bring the Pacer or the Yugo or whatever. We want to see YOU! Please send me a quick note to metasavage@gmail.com if you think you may come. It will give me a wild idea a wild idea for the lunch reservations. Thanks,
