

KNOW YOUR FAITH

Should we celebrate Feast Days on Sunday?

For Christians, Sunday is the day of the Lord. It is a day set aside for the worship of the Lord. This designation of the day of the Lord on Sunday follows the tradition of the early Christian community that often gathered on the first day of the week for the breaking of bread (cf. Acts 20:7, 1 Cor. 16:2). The first day of the week, even according to Jewish calculation, is Sunday. It is on the first day of the week that Jesus is said to have risen from the dead. This is the basis for our Christian faith. For Catholics, a great importance is placed on the observance of Sunday. The celebration of Mass on Sunday is the celebration of the Solemnity of the Lord. It is a matter of grave necessity that all Catholics attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation (cf. Canon 1247 and 1248).

There are, however, other feasts of the Lord, Mary and some saints that replace the Sunday celebration of the Solemnity of the Lord. These feasts are the Presentation of the Lord, Birth of St. John the Baptist, Transfiguration of the Lord, Assumption of Mary, Triumph of the Cross, All Saints, and Ss. Peter and Paul, which we celebrate this Sunday. On these feast days, the Church proclaims that Mary and the saints celebrated share Christ's complete victory over sin and death, and their celebration is of great importance to the Universal Church.

Ss. Peter and Paul, who we are celebrating today, are great personalities in the propagation of the gospel of Christ and the formation of the Church. St. Peter is the one confirmed by Jesus according to the gospel of Matthew as the Rock, on which His Church will be built. St. Paul on his part, is the apostle of the Gentiles. In three different missionary journeys, St. Paul preached Jesus Christ crucified and raised from the dead, and through Him salvation has now come to all people of every nation. Ss. Peter and Paul both built the foundation of the Church, witnessing to Christ through their lives, even to martyrdom.



Red, White and Blue

The colors red, white, and blue remind me of our country, but those colors also remind me of Jesus.

Red reminds me of Jesus' blood that was shed when he died on the cross for my sin. That is very important, because the Bible says, "Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness." (Hebrews 9:22)

White reminds me that when I give my heart to Jesus, he washes me and I become as "white as snow." (Isaiah 1:18) The Bible says, "you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Corinthians 6:10)

Blue reminds me of God's faithfulness. The Bible tells us that "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and make us clean." (1 John 1:9) God is faithful to keep His promises.

Red, white, and blue. Yes, I am reminded of our great country, but more importantly, I am reminded of our great Savior, Jesus.
