Philadelphia needs poll workers!

You might have heard that in the June primary, there was a staggering decrease in poll workers, and over 70% of polling locations closed. That's because most veteran poll workers are older folks and can't work. Fewer polling locations hurt the ability of many residents to vote.

The City still needs to recruit thousands of paid poll workers for the November election. (We're not putting out a call for volunteers! This is PAID WORK! Plus, **the pay was just increased to \$250!)** We're hoping you can sign up and help spread the word.

- 1) If you can, please <u>sign up here</u> to be a poll worker and encourage your friends to sign up too. The process to become a poll worker can be a bit complicated, but don't worry: the Power the Polls team will help you along the way. https://www.powerthepolls.org/?source=CFG
 And don't worry if you don't hear back right away! You may hear right after you sign up or not until a few days before election day. There are thousands of workers to coordinate and it takes time.

- 3) Let people know they may not hear back right away: the process is complicated and cities often move slowly. But applications are welcome and needed.
