CLASS DESCRIPTIONS & REQUIREMENTS:

Toddler & Me (Age 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -3 with Adult): This is the perfect introduction to movement and dance for your child. In this class, you and your child will learn to love dance together. Students and adults should wear comfortable clothes and bare feet or ballet shoes. This class has open enrollment throughout the school year. This class does not participate in the recital.

Creative Movement (Ages 3-4) Is a Pre-Ballet and Modern dance program that offers a new experience for the young child in learning body awareness, self-assurance, self-esteem, coordination, flexibility, and more! Pre-Ballet technique, skipping, leaping and movement concepts like: fast/slow, high/low, etc. and fun class themes like: "Beach Day" or "Seasons" that tie the classes together. This class does not participate in the recital. There are 2 informal "performances" for friends and family at the dance school. Usually in December and May. This class has open enrollment throughout the school year. Students can wear bare feet or ballet shoes.

Fantasy Dance Camp (Age 5-8): This is a single day camp. See schedule for dates and themes. Class includes dance choreography, a story and a craft that they will dance with and can take home. Boys and girls welcome—activities for both. Each camp is different. No previous experience necessary. Students can wear bare feet or ballet shoes.

Pre-Ballet & Tap (Ages 4-6): 30 minutes of tap and 30 minutes of ballet

Pre-Ballet, Tap & Jazz (Age 7): 30 minutes of tap, 30 minutes of ballet & 30 minutes of jazz

Ballet (Ages 8 & Up): is a highly technical form of dance with its own vocabulary based on French terminology. It has been globally influential and has defined the foundational techniques used in many other dance genres and cultures.

Tap (Ages 8 & Up): is a type of dance characterized by using the sounds of tap shoes striking the floor as a form of percussion. The sound is made by shoes that have a metal "tap" on the heel and toe.

Jazz (Ages 8 & Up) is a performance dance technique and style that emerged in the early twentieth century. Jazz dance may refer to vernacular jazz or Broadway or theatrical jazz that emerged with jazz music.

Belly Dance (Ages 14 & Up) Learn muscle control and fluidity while toning the core, encouraging good posture, improving flexibility, and gaining body confidence. In this class you will learn the basic movements and isolations as well as the posture and styling of belly dance. Have fun and discover muscles you never knew you had! No previous dance experience necessary. We will begin each class with a comprehensive warm up, review and develop belly dance technique, work on travelling movements and brief sequences of choreography.

Contemporary (Ages 13 & Up) Contemporary dance is a style of expressive dance that combines elements of several dance genres including modern, jazz, lyrical and classical ballet. Contemporary dancers strive to connect the mind and the body through fluid dance movements.

Hip Hop (Ages 6 & Up) refers to street dance styles primarily performed to hip-hop music or that have evolved as part of hip-hop culture. It includes a wide range of hip hop styles.

Lyrical (Ages 11 & Up) Lyrical is a fluid and graceful style of jazz that incorporates ballet and modern techniques.

Modern (Ages 13 & Up) Modern dance is often considered to have emerged as a rejection of, or rebellion against, classical ballet. Modern dance pioneers disregarded ballet's strict movement vocabulary, the particular, limited set of movements that were considered proper to ballet, in the search for greater freedom of movement.

Pointe (Ages 13 & Up) Pointe technique is the part of classical ballet technique that concerns *pointe work*, in which a ballet dancer supports all body weight on the tips of fully extended feet within pointe shoes. Pointe work is performed while wearing pointe shoes, which employ structural reinforcing to distribute the dancer's weight load throughout the foot, thus reducing the load on the toes enough to enable the dancer to support all body weight on fully vertical feet.

Pointe Requirements:

Students ages 13 and up who are interested in taking Pointe classes for the following dance season should:

- Have progressed to the Intermediate level of Ballet.
- Understand that you must take a Ballet class plus the additional Pointe class. Both classes cannot be scheduled on the same day.
- Attend <u>all</u> classes with a serious attitude.

Pointe dancing is not for everybody. Sometimes your physical anatomy will prevent you from going on pointe. It is imperative that pointe students make a serious commitment and have a positive mental attitude, which allows them to take constructive criticism. The student should also be responsible for demonstrating these corrections consistently throughout her training.

Production Program: The FDA Production Program is designed for serious dance students ages 9 and up, with good attendance, great attitudes and a strong desire to learn. These classes challenge the more serious student, and concentrate on the execution, perfection and precision of dance technique advancement. These classes participate in local dance competitions. Students should have completed at least one year of a one-hour ballet class and have tap and jazz experience to begin this program.

Senior Class (Graduating Class of 2020): This class is for our graduating Senior students who have been dancing with us for several years. To take this class you must also take at least one technique class in: ballet, jazz, lyrical or modern. Class will learn: a Senior class dance and a Partnering dance for the recital. These Seniors should submit a Senior Biography and Senior Photo for the Recital Program, and a baby photo and senior photo for the recital slide show by May 1, 2020.

<u>A Family Discount</u> of 10% will be applied to <u>each child's</u> monthly tuition rate if your children take a total of 6 to 9 dance classes per week. If they take a total of 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 12 hours per week, the discount will be 15% per child. If they take 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours or more, the discount will be 20% per child.

Missed Classes: Tuition is not refundable for missed classes.

<u>Dropped Classes</u>: Tuition is not refundable for the payment period during which a student chooses to drop a class.

Registration Fee

A 2019-2020 Dance Season registration fee of \$20 per family covers the cost of mailing, insurance, handbooks, and rehearsals. Registration fees are not refundable.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

- Please do not purchase Payless or other discount store shoes made of vinyl or synthetic materials.
- Students should carry their dancewear, shoes, and other belongings in a dance bag. Please print your child's name on the bag as well as on all of its contents.
- Dancewear is to be kept in good repair and laundered on a regular basis.
- Watches, jewelry, and safety pins should not be worn to class.
- Dance shoes should never be worn outside.
- Female students should wear their hair tightly secured and styled away from the face. A neat bun, braid or pony tail is preferred.
- Students are expected to observe good personal hygiene habits. Deodorant is required for students age 10 and older. When hormones start to kick in, many times it is the younger students whose body odor is the most offensive. To prevent an embarrassing situation, please supply your child with deodorant for dance class.

Dancewear and Shoes

Fairport Dance Academy sells all dance shoes, dancewear, tights, and dance bags at our studio throughout the year.

Dance shoe and dancewear fittings can be done during our registration and shoe fitting dates: August 5th from 5:00-8:00, August 9th from 4:00-6:00, August 12th from 5:00-8:00, August 16th from 4:00-6:00.

If a student buys new shoes at the beginning of the dance season and outgrows their shoes during the dance season, we have a shoe exchange program that allows them to trade their used shoes for another pair of used shoes in a larger size. If you don't want to trade your old shoes, the cost for used shoes is \$5.00 per pair.

The shoes that we sell are quality shoes at an economy price.

Please do not purchase Payless or other discount store shoes made of vinyl or synthetic materials.

RECITAL INFORMATION

- We have 4 different recitals. Each show is approximately 2 hours long.
- Performances have reserved seating and recital tickets will go on sale online in May.
- Students who take Ballet, Tap and Jazz, with no elective classes, are only in 1 recital performance.
- Recital rehearsals and shows follow the schedule below.
- We will let you know which recital performance your child is in during December 2019.
- Spacing and Dress Rehearsals are very important. They help your child get used to dancing in a different space with stage lighting.
- It is very important that all students attend their recital spacing and dress rehearsal.
- Please do not schedule family vacations during recital weeks.

WEEK ONE STUDENTS – Students who have Spacing Rehearsal on Monday will have Dress Rehearsal on Wednesday and their Recital Performance on Friday. Students who have Spacing Rehearsal on Tuesday will have Dress Rehearsal on Thursday and their Recital Performance on Saturday.

WEEK TWO STUDENTS – The same format will be followed: Monday-Wednesday-Friday or Tuesday-Thursday-Saturday.

Recital Fee

Each student will be charged a \$40.00 recital fee. The recital fee has increased \$5 from last year and now includes digital downloads of all four recital performances. The recital fee also covers the purchase of extra recital costumes, props, set materials, recital music, sound technician, lighting, etc. Recital fees are due by February 7th.

Recital Costumes

Costuming our students for the spring recital is very time consuming and a huge expense. To make this more affordable for our dancers, we require each student to buy only one costume (which they keep) if they take 4 hours of class or less.

* Production Students who take more than 4 hours of classes per week, will be responsible for purchasing 2 costumes. *

Additional costumes will be provided by the dance school and a small rental fee will be charged for each borrowed costume. The dance school will also do the fitting, altering, steaming and bagging of all costumes and accessories for each student. **Students MUST return all borrowed costumes after their last recital performance.**

Costume Deposit

A \$50.00 costume deposit (* \$100 if you are in Production and take more than 4 hours of class per week and are purchasing 2 costumes *) is due by November 1, 2020. This deposit is for the recital costume that each student is required to buy. You can expect the total cost of a single costume to be between \$65 to \$95. The deposit enables us to begin the purchasing process.

Costume Balance

The balance due on recital costumes will be sent out during Winter Break and is due by January 10, 2020. Costumes will not be sent home until the balance is paid.

Costume Rental Fee

To help cover the huge expense of costuming our dancers for the spring recital, students will be charged a rental fee of \$15.00 for each borrowed costume owned by Fairport Dance Academy. Costume rental fees will be due by March 13, 2020. Rental fee covers costume alterations, steaming and accessories.

Recital Tights

Recital tights will be included with costumes that students purchase at a discounted price. Students who rent costumes only will be responsible for purchasing their tights from the dance school before the recital.

Hip Hop Costumes

If your student is only taking Hip Hop **and no other classes**, you do not have to pay the \$50.00 costume fee due in November. Hip Hop students rent their costumes from the school. Hip Hop students will need to purchase their shoes for the recital. Shoe requirements will be announced in January 2020.

Recital Program

Our Recital Program is an 8 ½ by 11 book. It will be distributed to approximately 1200 people, then on display at Fairport Dance Academy for the following year. We invite our families to send their dancer a special message or advertise a local business in our program. Recital Program artwork is due by May 1, 2020. We also have an Ad Contest: the top three students who bring in the most program ads receive "dance dollars" which are good for tuition or dancewear and their picture in the recital program. More info will be sent out in January.

GENERAL POLICIES:

- Please put your name in your dance shoes.
- Parents are welcome to wait in our Lobby for their children during their classes or go out and enjoy the local businesses and return before their child's class ends.
- Dancers should put their dance shoes on before entering their classroom. No street shoes on the dance floors please.
- We love babies and young children and appreciate the chance to meet our students' siblings; however, our priority is the safety of every child on the school premises. Children must be supervised at all times and are not free to run around the lobby or classroom areas.
- Please use the "Changing Area" by our restrooms to change and not our bathrooms.
- We have multiple restrooms available two in our studio (no key necessary) and public restrooms (key required) just past the white gazebo in the main building space. Key available at the school Front Desk.
- Only water is allowed in the studios. No food, drinks, or gum.
- No cell phones or computers may be used during class time. This means no e-mailing, internet use, or text
 messaging.
- Never speak negatively about teachers, students, or parents from this or other schools.
- All students must show respect for their teachers at all times. Inappropriate behavior could result in dismissal from the school.
- Hang coats, sweaters, sweatshirts, etc. in the lobby.
- Bring a water bottle with you if you are dancing for more than one hour. Please put your name on it.

Classroom Observation

Parents may occasionally observe the Preschool dance classes. Please check with your child's instructor before coming into the classroom to observe. Often, parents can be a distraction to the students in the class, whether they mean to be or not.

If you observe, please do not bring infants or other children into the classroom, use cell phones, or shout to your student during class time.

Parking

There is a parking lot in the back of the building off S. St. Clair St. There is also parking around the Painesville Park and on Main St.

Lost and Found

Please mark all dancewear, shoes, and personal items with your child's name. We will make every effort to locate and return lost items; however, we cannot be responsible for any items that your child brings to class. The Lost and Found dancewear box is located under the table next to the front door of the studio. Lost and Found dance shoes are held at the front desk.

Class Attendance Policy

All students are expected to attend their regularly scheduled classes. Each class offers a step forward in the educational process. A missed class could leave a child one step behind the other students. During the months of January through May, choreography for the recital will be taught and rehearsed. It is important for children to feel completely confident with the choreography and the year-end performance. Missing class during this period could result in frustration for the students and their teachers and classmates.

The quality of what you learn and how you perform in class and on stage will be a direct result of your yearly attendance. Each class is comprised of individual students who work together as a single unit or team to create this visual experience called dance. When team members are missing from class, this experience is diminished. **Schedule your other activities around your scheduled class times.**

Drop and Add

If a student chooses to drop and/or add a class, they must first fill out a Drop/Add form at the front desk. Adding a new class will be based on class size limitations and the approval of the Nicole DeBiase. After the Drop/Add form is completed and approve, office data forms will be updated, and class rosters adjusted.

Absences

Please call or email the school to let us know that you will be missing class due to illness, a school event or vacation. If you know in advance, you can sign the "Going to be Absent" sheet at the front desk.

Make-Up Classes

Make-up classes will be offered, as a courtesy, from September through December when all classes are working on fundamentals and technique. Students can attend a similar class on a different day or time for make-up. Make-up schedules will be made available at the beginning of the dance season. Please sign up at least one week in advance for your make-up class. No make-up classes will be offered after winter break—this is when each class begins to learn its own recital choreography. Make-up classes can be schedule with Nicole at the front desk.

Arrival and Departure

We encourage students to arrive 15 minutes before class starts.

For their safety, children under age 10 should be picked up immediately after class. Students ages 10 and older must be picked up no more than 15 minutes after their class is completed.

Medical Information

Parents must notify the front desk and/or teachers regarding students who use an inhaler or who may require medications during their time at Fairport Dance Academy. It is also important to inform the front desk and/or teachers about your child's existing medical conditions or learning disabilities at the time of registration and throughout the school year. Our teachers are trained professionals who are anxious to work with all children and personalities, and the more we know about your child, the better the dance experience will be for all involved. All information about your child is confidential.

Illness

Colds, flu, and other contagious diseases occur frequently and spread easily among children. To help protect your own child's health and to minimize the possibility of contagion at school, please keep your child at home if you observe any of the following symptoms:

- Nasal discharge that is green or yellow
- Complaints of ear pain
- Severe sore throat or cough
- Eyes that are pink, burning, itching, or producing discharge
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Fever

Please inform staff if your child has plantar warts or any other foot problems. If you know your child has plantar warts, it is very important that they keep their feet covered with shoes or socks while they are dancing as these warts are highly contagious.

Discipline Policy

In order to maintain a happy, healthy, professional environment, students are taught the importance of being part of a group. We encourage students to have respect for other students, the teachers and staff, and studio property, and we foster the development of good habits and compliance with rules of conduct.

Our staff and faculty are trained to use constructive techniques of discipline to maintain class control and handle individual misbehavior.

- Children who exhibit unacceptable behavior or attitudes are told what is wrong and directed to a positive alternative approach or behavior.
- Children who are disruptive will be respectfully asked to stop the behavior. If the behavior is repeated, they will be reminded of it and told how it affects others. If the disruption continues, the children involved will be asked to sit down for a short period of time (usually three to five minutes) before rejoining the class.
- If a child's misbehavior continues to disrupt the class, the parent or guardian will be called to pick up the child.

Student and Parent Use of Social Media

Use of Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, blogging, and other online social-media vehicles is commonplace. This policy is intended to provide Fairport Dance Academy students and parents with guidelines to eliminate any confusion concerning the use of social media.

- You DO NOT have permission to reveal any information that compromises Fairport Dance Academy. By that we mean you are forbidden to share personal information about the director, other students or their families, or anything that is proprietary and/or confidential to them or Fairport Dance Academy.
- Students and parents should neither claim or imply that they are speaking on behalf of Fairport Dance Academy.
- Never post anything that could compromise the self-esteem of students who attend Fairport Dance Academy.
- If you post videos of class or rehearsals, don't post any choreography in its entirety.
- Respect the law, including those governing all defamation, discrimination, harassment, and copyright and fair
 use. As stated in this handbook, parents and students should never post negative comments about other
 schools or teachers. Also, please do not post negative comments about school activities such as competitions,
 conventions, and performances or about the directors of those events.
- Ensure that your social networking conduct is consistent with all of the policies contained in this handbook.
- Improper use of social media could result in dismissal.

Termination of Enrollment

In certain circumstances, when it is in the best interest of one or more students, it may be necessary for the school director to terminate a student's enrollment. Every effort will be made to correct a problematic situation before terminating enrollment. Reasons for termination of enrollment include the following:

- Disruptive or dangerous behavior by students or their parents
- Abuse of other children, staff, or property
- Inability of Fairport Dance Academy to meet the child's needs
