Teacher Appreciation week will be done the first week of May. Keep a look out from your room parent regarding what will be happening during that week. You have to admit our teachers are awesome!


The last tuition payment is due April 10th. If you are returning next year, the first tuition payment will be due by May 10th. We will be sending a letter home to everyone in the next few

This year is flying by! It seems like we just started school, and now we only have a little more than two months left! We have been very busy in the last month beginning with Letter N. We read *The Napping House* and *Notorious Numbers* and played number bingo, painted neckties with net balls, and made a number sticker chart.

Next we celebrated Dr. Seuss and rhyming. We learned that Dr. Seuss was an author and an illustrator and that he drew his own unique characters. We also talked about how Dr. Seuss liked to rhyme, and we rhymed lots of words. We drew our own Dr. Seuss-like character and brought a "wocket" in our pocket for show-n-tell.

During O week, we talked about the octopus and opposites. (Did you know that an octopus can regrow a tentacle?) We sang opposites songs and did opposite exercises.

We celebrated St. Patrick's Day by playing St. Paddy's Day lotto, decorating shamrocks, and playing "who took the gold?" That tricky little leprechaun was up to no good all day, but he was too fast for us, and we never did find him. He did mess up our room while we were on the playground!

During P week, we talked about pets, read about and ate pizza, and painted pink and purple pigs. We read *A Pet for Petunia*, which is a funny story about a girl who wanted a skunk for a pet.

Discuss the signs of spring. Point out the author and illustrator when reading with your child. Play a game with your child where they tell you the opposites of words that you name. Have your child rhyme words with you—whether they are real words or made up words. And as always, read, read, read.



3 year old MWF Class

March 2017

Spring is finally here. This last official month of winter we were busy with our main topics of Dr. Seuss, Dentist, St Patrick's Day, Fairy Tales, Spring, and Weather. For Dr. Seuss we read many books and incorporated classroom activities with each one. With the book <u>One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish Blue</u> Fish we created a class mural of our handprint fish. Similarly, with the book <u>Put Me in a Zoo</u> the frogs made a puppet and stamped all the crazy spots that the bear can manipulate. Finally with Dr. Seuss' <u>ABC</u> an <u>Amazing Alphabet Book</u>, we incorporated a motion to each letter and object. It was great to see the kids being bees or eggs or yawing and zig zagging through their ABCs with this book and motions.

Next, we had a guest speaker, Dentist Bunin, come and teach the kids the various types of food to eat and the importance of brushing the sugar bugs away to keep their teeth healthy. In class, along with reading some dentist books, we counted marshmallows and placed them on our pretend mouth to practice counting objects up to 10. We also had the Frogs "floss" the Lego teeth with yarn. They placed our playdough as food stuck on the teeth and with the yard flossed the teeth clean. Finally, the Frogs had a brushing center with they could draw the germs/sugar bugs with a dry erase marker and with tooth brushes brush them clean.

Continuing on through the month, we had St. Patrick's Day and Rainbow day fall in the same week. You may have heard about the leprechaun that did tricks in our room. The kids were very interested as to why this little leprechaun was causing so much mischief, such as paint footsteps, chairs turned upside down, and the couch cushions flipped over. Since the leprechaun messed up all the classrooms at CEP, during Rainbow day all the kids searched for clues for where the leprechaun could be hiding. They never did find him. The leprechaun launched us into other fairy tales, such as Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs, and Jack and the Bean Stalk. The Frogs loved hearing these tales and during music class they liked acting them

out. The Fairy Tale theme turned out to be the most popular with the Frogs. They loved hearing them read.

Finally, we are moving on to Spring and Weather. So far we have talked about rainy weather and what it looks like and what happens when it rains. We did a rain demonstration showing how a cloud (shaving cream floating on water) gets full of water (blue colored water) and then they drip to the ground. Come check out the mural the kids worked on together showing a rainy scene with gray storm clouds and rain coming down. For big motion Ms. Wendi and Ms. Cristina put various types of weather labels around the room and had them run, hop, and crawl to the different types of weather as we called them out. At the end of this we said, "Run to your favorite weather." We were surprised to see that all of them didn't pick sunny. However, Sunny did get the most votes, Snowy was second, but Rainy and Stormy did get some votes. No one seemed to like partly cloudy or windy days. We are hoping for some great weather this spring so we can continue to explore the signs of spring all around us.


