WORK FOR THE NIGHT IS COMING

Intro: To get a picture of what Jesus may be saying in this verse, I picture a hard working farmer in days before modern farm machinery. He rose up early each day in order to be in the field before "first light" to take productive advantage of every minute of daylight in cultivating his crop for harvest to come. He knew that night would come, so he worked hard all day and when the night came he "rested

hard"... well deserved rest for his dilligence in the daylight. He knew that if he was going to have a crop to harvest, he must work dilligently every waking minute... time was short. It is that picture that I want us to see today...Let us consider the following applications I. GOD HAS GIVEN US WORK TO DO (MATT 28:18-20)

- A. Going
- B. Making disciples (evangelize)
 - 1. Baptizing
 - 2. Teaching them to follow Christ
- II. GOD HAS GIVEN US LIMITED TIME "DAYLIGHT" IN WHICH TO DO IT
- A. Just as the farmer knew he was to make the most of every minute of daylight, we are to make the most of the time god has given us.
 - B. Our days are numbered. We are temporary on earth.
- C. While we have opportunity, let us take full advantage, and do the works god sent us to do!!
- D. This may require time management, setting new priorities, or just plain "getting up from the recliner".

E. If we are ever going to do it, it should be now...

III. GOD HAS TOLD US NIGHT IS COMING

- A. Night: a period of darkness
- B. "last days" "perlous times"
- C. Spiritual darkness is creeping up around us "bit by bit" ...we are almost in the "twilight zone"
- D. Christian message is not received or welcomed in many places, and causes conflict and controversy in other places.
 - E. Many believers being persecuted today (martyrs)
- F. There is coming a "night" when we can no longer have the privilige of witnessing, meeting in churches, testifying openly, and having religious freedom we all take so much for granted.
- G. Night comes when no man can work
 IV. BUT THERE IS A NEW DAY DAWNING "WEEPING MAY COME FOR THE NIGHT, BUT JOY
 COMES IN THE MORNING"
- A. The farmer rested well during the night because he had faith that a new day would dawn.
 - B. God promises us a new day, a glorious dawning
 - 1. When men turn swords into ploughshares
 - 2. When true justice and full peace will rule
 - 3. When Jesus will reign supreme
 - 4. When all evil will be fully and finally subdued
- 5. When those who have trusted him, worked for him "while it is Day" will walk hand in hand with him for eternity in "eternal rest"

CONCLUSION:

- 1. There is work to be done
- 2. There is limited time to do it
- 3. Night is coming when we can no longer work
- 4. A new day will come when we can rest from our labors
