Dear Church Family,

I am so looking forward to spending my first Advent and Christmas season among you. It is always a joy to see how beautiful the sanctuary looks with all the decorations, hear the lovely music, watch the wonder on the faces of the children and share the Advent of Christ to the world and expectation of his coming again.

Every hour, my family knows that the Advent/Christmas season is upon us. How can I be sure that everyone in my house knows that Christmas is coming? I love noisy clocks. I have a bird call clock, an animal sound clock, a Halloween screaming clock and of course a Christmas clock. Every year on November 1<sup>st</sup> the Halloween clock comes down and the Christmas clock comes up. Every hour we are treated to a different carol or Christmas song. I could certainly get anxious with this reminder that another hour has passed and I still have so much to do! Sometimes I do! But mostly I love this gentle reminder of the coming of Christ. If I don't get the Christmas cards send or the lights put up, or the cookies made, or the presents wrapped, or... Christmas will arrive on the designated day regardless of what I get done or don't get done. The same is true of Emmanuel – God with us. Jesus came as an infant at the perfect time. It wasn't because any human did just the right thing or just the wrong thing. Jesus came at the time that was designated from before the beginning of time. And in the same way Jesus will return at the designated time. Our job is to live our lives in relationship with Jesus, enjoying God's presence with us every hour of everyday.

Do you have any reminders that turns you to Jesus instead of focusing on all the trimmings of the Advent/Christmas season? I have my clock. My goal is to stop and thank God for the blessing of having Christ in my life every time I hear the Christmas clock. Can you think of something that happens regularly that will help you turn to prayers of rejoicing for the coming of Christ? A clock chime, a weather update, brushing your teeth, a dog bark? Whatever you can come up with, remember the reason for the season and give praise to God for the gift of God's son who came to earth and is coming again.
