

HAUNTED GUYASUTA

Our annual Haunted Guyasuta occurs on the third Saturday in October each year. Activities include hayrides, a haunted trail, a pumpkin patch, a climbing wall, zipline, games, bonfire, movies, food for sale and pictures with a huge pumpkin.

Haunted Guyasuta is open to the public and requires registration, starting in September. Any units interested in setting up a scene along the trail should inquire by August.



ABOUT GUYASUTA

Camp Guyasuta is owned and operated by the Laurel Highlands Council - Boy Scouts of America. The camp dates back to 1918 when it was donated by Mrs. Darlington, the great granddaughter of General O'Hara. Annually 20,000 scouts, school groups and nonprofit organizations from Southwestern Pennsylvania region use the camp. This beautiful property consists of 129 acres located in O'Hara Township, only 6 miles from downtown Pittsburgh.

There are many nearby attractions including Pittsburgh Zoo, Carnegie Science Center, PNC Park, Heinz Field, and Carnegie Museums. Only 1/4 mile from the camp is a bus stop for the Allegheny County Port Authority where you can take a bus to any of these Pittsburgh attractions.

CHALLENGE COURSE

The Camp Guyasuta Challenge Course is a facilitated, multi-step course that fosters personal growth among youth and adult groups. The program begins with team building initiative games, progresses to a low ropes course to expand upon team development, and finishes with a high ropes course and zip line. Minimum group size is 20 persons.

This program is available from April – November.

PADDLE + PEDDLE

Participants meet at Camp Guyasuta and hike five minutes to a marina in Sharpsburg. Once there, you are given instruction on paddling and paired with a partner. Participants kayak from Sharpsburg to Millvale or PNC Park and then bike back to Camp Guyasuta along the river front trail.

This program is available from May – October.

GEOCACHING

The Camp has two levels of geocaching courses on site: beginner/Cub Scout and intermediate/Boy Scout. Each course takes you throughout the Camp. Participants may rent pre-programmed GPS units from the camp trading post in two-hour intervals. Although this activity is self-guided, it may be staffed with advanced notice.

This program is available year-round.

SHOOTING SPORTS

Camp Guyasuta provides opportunities to shoot BBs, pellet guns and archery on Wednesdays and Saturdays, by appointment. Our instructors provide certified instruction, equipment, safety equipment, and supervision for all ranges. Reservations at least three weeks in advance are required.

This program is available year-round.

SWIMMING POOL

The Guyasuta swimming pool is open to the public Monday through Friday. Daily and season passes are available, or groups may also rent the pool for private parties and events in the evenings or on weekends.

This facility runs from June – August

The McGinnis Education Center at Camp has complete conference facilities for your next meeting or retreat, including full meal service, audio / visual technologies, WiFi, large conference room, two small conference rooms, and a customer service-oriented staff ready to help make your stay enjoyable and carefree.
