DO YOU RECOGNIZE JESUS IN OTHERS?

The passage from Isaiah we hear today was written during a



time of great hope. The Jewish people had been released from exile and could finally return to Jerusalem. Isaiah invokes "a year of favor," a jubilee year in which all property reverted to its original owner (Isaiah 61:2). In the truest sense, the original owner of all worldly goods is

God, who then distributes them generously and equitably. The Messiah, Jesus Christ, is the fulfillment of this promised year of favor, bringing glad tidings,, liberty, justice and praise. Moreover, because He is with us always, every year is a year of favor. What in Isaiah's day was an emancipation from exile and a hope in a return to the holy city has with Jesus become emancipation from sin and hope in life everlasting.

"Who are you?" John is asked repeatedly, to which at first he only responds with who he is not. He is not the Messiah who has been promised, Elijah whose eventual return many anticipated, nor a prophet like Moses raised up from among their kin. No, he is the messenger, the one to prepare the way of the Lord. Just as Isaiah prepared the road to the holy city, John prepares the road into our hearts.



John tells the religious leaders that there is One among you whom you do not recognize" (John 1:26). Throughout all of Jesus' public ministry, many of these same leaders failed to recognize Him. It is our challenge now to recognize Him. Do we recognize Him in the least of our brothers and sisters? Do we recognize Him in our community, when two or three are gathered in His name?" Do we recognize Him in the Eucharist, His Body and blood poured out for us? Do we recognize Him in times of difficulty and uncertainty?
