Post 245 Starts Boy Scout Troop

In October, Post 245 voted to start a Scout Troop and just a few weeks later, 20 scouts, their parents, and leaders arrived for their first meeting. The boys are already veteran scouters but wanted the chance to build their own troop. Our post has been considering chartering a Troop for some time so this was an opportunity for everyone to benefit. The Boy Scouts of America's program for youth in the 5th grade through high school, now called Scouts BSA, focuses on character development, leadership, and service, which directly align with the values of the American Legion. Now, Scouts BSA Troop 245 is officially part of the Post.

Scouts have already been helping in the community. The annual Scouting for Food program collects donations for the local food bank. Troop 245 teamed with local Cub Scout Pack 383 (chartered by Our Lady of Victory School) to collect, sort, and deliver 2,489 pounds of food. They were also busy at our recent Veteran's Day Dinner, where they helped the Women's Auxiliary reset the room between dinner services and welcomed Veterans as they arrived. They have also led a hike up through Musser's Gap while teaching scout skills to Cub Scouts, and organized a Halloween-themed first aid competition as well. They look forward to planning a full year of activities and outdoor adventures.

"We want to deliver the Scouting program with a focus on leadership and character. As the boys advance through their ranks and hopefully achieve Eagle, they will develop important teamwork skills and self confidence that will help them through life." said Aaron Spak, Troop Committee Chair and SAL Member. The Troop will keep the Post updated on their activities and achievements, so please keep an eye out for future articles or updates in the building!
