Atlanta Intergroup Voice 2



Tradition One: Our common welfare should come first. Personal recovery depends upon AA unity.

In studying Tradition One, the idea of unity is clearly the key concept. All other of our Traditions highlight more specific ways that members/groups of Alcoholics Anonymous can protect the unity of AA. But foremost, Tradition One reminds us that this is our most precious asset.

The long form is most informative and it reminds us that without unity within AA our entire existence is at risk. Made up of self-centered, judgmental and fear-driven individuals, AA is fertile ground for disharmony and dispute. As a member of AA having practiced the 12 Steps over the years, it is clear how alcohol must be sacrificed if I am to live. In order to stay recovered I must also become willing to let go of the character defects that block me from God and others. I must then submit to the idea that I have to carry this message in order to stay sober and continue to grow in my recovery. This requires more sacrifice with regard to my time, energy and attention. Further, I am then shown that I must sacrifice yet again my personal ambitions and desires for the good of the AA group. These ideas and concepts seem wholly distasteful! Sacrifice. Service. Submission. These were definitely not ideals to which I was ascribing when I stepped into the rooms. Over time, however, more and more I have become willing to go along with the other AAs living this spiritual way of life. I begin to see the value in seeking true humility and playing my small role of the greater whole. It becomes part of my practice of “letting go and letting god”.

In my life Tradition One helps me find the role that god has assigned within and outside of the rooms. Certainly, in my home group, I am given numerous opportunities to try to practice this Tradition. I must go along with group conscience votes even when I disagree. I have to recoil from gossip as this is a corrosive element that serves only to fracture groups and foster an environment which can be repellant. I have to try to help make my meeting space conducive to carrying the message. Refraining from chatting or being on my phone during the meeting and helping to try to keep overall noise down can be important actions to take. These are some simple examples of my behavior can bring harmony rather than dissonance in the rooms of AA.

Outside of the rooms, my marriage, my friendships, family and work are all “groups” to which I belong. In these groups, Traditions can also serve as my guide. If I am thinking of the welfare of the group above my own, my actions will likely be more in alignment with cooperation and goodwill than if I am focused only on what is best for me. It was a real surprise that these traditions that serve to keep AA together can actually be applied in my personal life and to great benefit.



As with most concepts in AA, unity as a primary objective to maintaining vitality is simple. The implementation is not always easy. My ego resists being quiet and not “getting its way”. It resists being wrong, It resists not getting attention or credit for the things I do. It resists being anonymous and one of many. That said, I have found that while the resistance is there god provides everything I need, and so I grow.
