It's the IAS Annual Christmas Party!



IAS General Meeting Minutes November 10th, 2017

President Ellen Dowling opens the meeting at 7:15 PM. She welcomes new members and guests. Introduces visitors Cindy Jones (SASSNM newsletter editor), and Jean Bridge, also Bethany who is here with Suzi Wolf, our storyteller for the evening.

Board Members present and presented by Ellen: Treasurer Kathy Wimmer; Secretary Peter McKenna; Membership Norita Callahan; Board Paul McDonough; Board Jay Vandersloot; Board Maureen Riley. V.P. Bob Bryers is absent tonight.

Reports:

- ♣ Treasury Kathy reports we took in \$50 and spent about \$571, leaving us with a balance of about \$7,333.

At our October 26th meeting, we discussed *The Secret Place*, by Tana French, a whodunit page turner set in a girls' boarding school in Ireland, where a young lad from a neighboring boys' school has come up dead (from getting his head smashed in with a garden hoe). The police investigators, Stephen Moran and Antoinette Conway, are sure that the murderer is one of the teenaged girls, but which one? And why?

We all liked this book so much that we've decided to try and read ALL of Tana French's books over the Christmas holidays. (Book club will not meet in December.) If you want to join us, grab your own copy of *In the Woods, The Likeness, Faithful Place, Broken Harbour*, and/or *The Trespasser*.






